LYC Cruising Non-Spinnaker Class:

Whisker Poles

- o Maximum pole length is 102% of J.
- o A telescoping pole may be used, but it must be used at the proper length.
- o Telescoping poles shall be banded at maximum length.
- o Pole lifts and down hauls may be used.
- Only one whisker pole may be used at a time.
- o A permanent club-footed jib or staysail boom, as long as it is less than J, is not considered a whisker pole.

• Headsails And Staysails

- o Spinnakers, Cruising Spinnakers, Flashers, Bloopers, Gennakers, or similar sails shall <u>not</u> be used.
- o Headsails, foresails, or oversized jibs, greater than the largest jib rated on entry, shall not be used.
- O Drifters or Reacher-type sails may be used as long as they are no larger than the largest measured headsail and they are attached to the forestay.
- Two headsails may <u>not</u> be carried at the same time, except that while changing headsails, the replacing sail may be set and trimmed before the replaced sail is lowered.
- O Staysails shall not be used except on boats that are provided with a permanent inner forestay to which the staysail is hanked on.

LYC Cruising with Spinnaker Class:

- Maximum Spinnaker Girth (MSW) shall be no greater than 183% of J and maximum Spinnaker Luff (SL) shall be no greater than 102% of I, except that any boat that has a valid PHRF-GB certificate may use any spinnaker that was utilized in determining the boat's PHRF-GB rating.
- Maximum Spinnaker Pole Length (SPL) shall be no greater than 102% of J, except that any boat that has a valid PHRF-GB certificate may use any spinnaker pole that was utilized in determining the boat's PHRF-GB rating.
