SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

Rule 40 and the preamble to part 4 are changed so that, competitors shall wear personal flotation devices at all times while afloat, except briefly while changing clothing or personal equipment.

2 NOTICES to COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located outside on the CYC office inside the Club. Notices may also be posted on the web at: <http://www.regattanetwork.com/event/10600> . Changes to the SI's will be posted before 1000 on the day they are to take effect.

3 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located atop the clubhouse. If a postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after Pennant AP is lowered. This changes Race Signals.

5 CLASS FLAG, COURSES and MARKS

The Class Flag is a flag with the Santana insignia.

The course to be sailed will be displayed as a black number on a white background.

Course 1: Start – A(p) – Finish

Course 2: Start – A(p) – B(p) - G – A(p) - B(p) – Finish

Course 3: Start – B(s) - A(s) – G – B(s) - A(s) – G – Finish

Above, (p) = port rounding (s) = starboard rounding

Mark S is an inflatable orange ball.

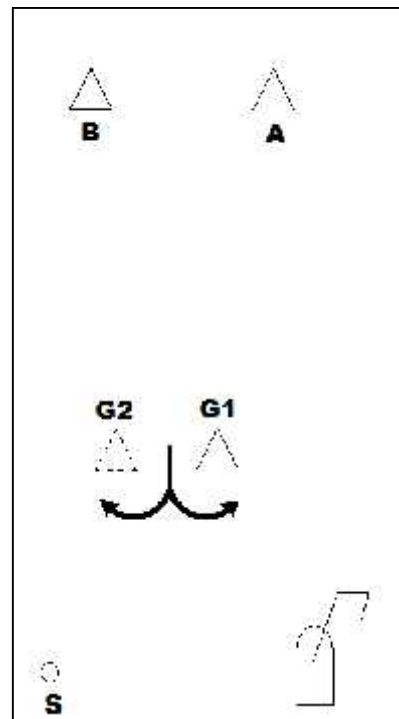
Mark A and B are inflatable rounding marks.

Marks G1 and G2 are a Gate. If one gate mark is missing, round the remaining mark to port.

6 STARTING and FINISHING LINES

The starting line will be between the staff displaying an orange flag and Mark S.

The finishing line will be between the staff displaying an orange flag and Mark S.



7 HAILING AFTER the START

When the Race Committee displays Flag X (Individual Recall), the sail number or other clearly distinguishing feature of a boat that caused that signal may be hailed on VHF channel 71. The absence of a hail, the order of a hail or the failure of a boat to hear the hail shall not be grounds for redress. This changes rule 62.1(a).

8 PENALTIES

RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

9 HAULOUTS

After the preparatory signal for a boat's first race, a boat shall not be hauled out except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

10 PROTESTS

The protest time limit is 1 hour after the race committee finish boat docks. The protest time limit will be posted on the notice board. Hearings will be held as soon as possible after racing each day. A hearing schedule will be posted within 30 minutes of the expiry of the protest time limit. This schedule will serve as notice under rule 63.2.

11 SCORING

Five races are scheduled in the Santana 22 Nationals. Three races are required to constitute a championship. All scores except the practice race score(s) will count toward a boat's final regatta score.
