## Viper Guide to the Sarasota Sailing Squadron

Sailing a Viper in Sarasota is a breeze. The Squadron has a hoist and a three-lane ramp launch, lots of area to rig your boat and plenty of floating docks to park the fleet.

Once in the water, you are 15 minutes from the race course. Sarasota Bay is wide, has a sandy bottom and is unobstructed on all sides. It is shallow, averaging 10 ft throughout, but the shoals are well marked and/or very visual as the water is aqua blue clear.

After haul out there is an area dedicated to rinsing down boats.

The Squadron has onsite showers and bathrooms and plenty of parking for cars and trailers.

Those who wish to store boats in Sarasota are kindly requested to reserve/pay for storage during registration through Regatta Network and email Travis Yates for arrival and departure confirmation.

## Sarasota for Visiting Sailors

### Flying In

Sarasota is served by a reasonably sized airport (SRQ), that is about 15 minutes from the Sarasota Sailing Squadron. Depending on your airline of choice you may find cheaper non-stop flights by looking at flying into Tampa (TPA). The drive from Tampa airport is about 1 hour and 15 minutes, there is a shuttle that can get you from TPA to Sarasota for \$40. Another option is to fly into Southwest Florida International Airport in Ft. Myers (RSW). The drive up from RSW is around 1 hour and 25 minutes.

### Accommodations

Sarasota is a great tourist destination and Nov-March is our high season. We have a vibrant downtown and number of barrier islands connected by bridges. Nothing in the local area is hard to get to and traffic is a non-issue. There are a wide variety of accommodations, including hotel and rental homes from Anna Maria Island to the north all the way down to Siesta Key and Venice. Drive times between any of these locations and the Squadron are less than 30 minutes. If you need help or suggestions with accommodations please give someone in the Sarasota fleet a call so they can let you know the relative merits of the place you are looking at, or if it is a rental property, we will be happy to try to drive by it to give it a look.
