

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS AMENDMENT

I. RULES (Original)

1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The 2017–2020 Racing Rules of Sailing, (RRS) of the International Sailing Federation; the Prescriptions of US Sailing; the Class Rules of the International J/22 Class Association (03/01/13); the Notice of Race (except as altered by these Sailing Instructions); and these Sailing Instructions (SIs).

I. RULES (Changed)

1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The 2017–2020 Racing Rules of Sailing, (RRS) of the World Sailing, the Prescriptions of US Sailing; the current Class Rules of the International J/22 Class Association; the Notice of Race (except as altered by these Sailing Instructions); and these Sailing Instructions (SIs).

IX. MARKS (Original)

18.A new mark, when used in accordance with Sailing Instruction 13, CHANGES OF COURSE AFTER THE START, will be a yellow inflatable tetrahedron.

IX. MARKS (Changed)

18.A new mark, when used in accordance with Sailing Instruction 13, CHANGES OF COURSE AFTER THE START, will be a yellow inflatable tetrahedron and is defined in SI XII.

XVIII. PROTESTS (Original)

38. Protests shall be written on a US Sailing Protest Form available at the Club's front lobby office, and lodged there within the one hour Protest Time; see SIs 6.4. Protest Time will be posted on the official regatta notice board.

XVIII. PROTESTS (Changed)

38. Protests shall be written on a US Sailing Protest Form available at the Club's front lobby office, and lodged there within the one hour Protest Time; see SIs V-9. Protest Time will be posted on the official regatta notice board.

XX. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY / INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS (Original)

46. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk (see RRS 4, Decision to Race). J/22 Fleet 61 and The Lake George Club and their officers, members, staff, and volunteers, and any other affiliated organization or official, including the Town of Bolton, and the State of New York and their departments and agencies ("*Race Organizers*"), will not be responsible for, and participants hereby

release them from, any claim, cause of action or liability for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained in conjunction with, or prior to, during, or after this regatta on the water or ashore. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the Race Organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.

XX. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY / INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS (Changed)

46. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk (see RRS 4, Decision to Race). J/22 Fleet 61 and The Lake George Club and their officers, members, staff, and volunteers, and any other affiliated organization or official, including the Town of Bolton, and the State of New York and their departments and agencies ("*Organizing Authority*"), will not be responsible for, and participants hereby release them from, any claim, cause of action or liability for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained in conjunction with, or prior to, during, or after this regatta on the water or ashore. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the Race Organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.

XXI. WASTE DISPOSAL (Original)

48. Because we wish to preserve the drinking water quality of Lake George, the disposal or discharge of waste, human or otherwise, is illegal and will be considered misconduct under RRS 69, in addition to fines and/or penalties as prescribed by the Lake George Park Commission, Warren County Sheriff's Department, and the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary. Competitors are accordingly required to hold any waste and discard of it in proper containers at the Club. Before launching a boat in Lake George, competitors are required to drain all water and wash the hull and all underwater surfaces to remove any foreign organisms, particularly Zebra Mussels, Asian Clams, and Eurasian Water milfoil. Also, be sure that sails are clean and dry. Inspections and purging may be required by Race Organizers prior to launching any boat, or participating in any race.

XXI. WASTE DISPOSAL (Changed)

48. Because we wish to preserve the drinking water quality of Lake George, the disposal or discharge of waste, human or otherwise, is illegal and will be considered misconduct under RRS 69, in addition to fines and/or penalties as prescribed by the Lake George Park Commission and the Warren County Sheriff's Department. Competitors are accordingly required to hold any waste and discard of it in proper containers at the Club. Before launching a boat in Lake George, competitors are required to drain all water and wash the hull and all underwater surfaces to remove any foreign organisms, particularly Zebra Mussels, Asian Clams, and Eurasian Water milfoil. Also, be sure that sails are clean and dry. Inspections and purging may be required by Race Organizers prior to launching any boat, or participating in any race.
