NOTICE OF RACE JUNIOR LEUKEMIA CUP

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 USCG approved PFDs shall be worn at all times by competitors while on the water, other than brief periods while adding or removing clothing. The 'Y' flag will not be flown. This modifies RRS 40 and the preamble to Part 4.
- 1.3 Sabot A/B/C1 fleet boats may be subject to on-water equipment inspection upon the finish of each race. Refer to INSA class rules for a list of required equipment.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to all junior age CFJ, Laser, Laser Radial, Sabot A, B, C1, C2, C3 and RS Tera sailors.
- 2.2 Skipper must be a member in good standing of INSA, Laser, or the CFJ Class Association.
- 2.3 Eligible boats may enter by submitting the entry form and paying the entry fee online at www.regattanetwork.com before 5pm on Saturday June 3, 2017 or in person on Sunday June 4, 2017.

4. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available no later than Sunday June 4, 2017 upon check-in at BCYC.

5. RACE VENUE AND COURSES

Bahia Corinthian Yacht Club

- 5.1 Race Venue 1: CFJ, Laser, Laser Radial, and Sabot A, Sabot B, and Sabot C1 classes will sail in the vicinity of “Five Points” (turning basin).
- 5.2 Race Venue 2: Sabot C2, Sabot C3 and RS Tera classes will sail in the vicinity of the south Lido channel.
- 5.3 Courses may be a windward/leeward or any variation of a triangle course. Course diagrams will be provided in the sailing instructions.

6. SCORING

- 6.1 Three (3) races must be completed to constitute a series.
- 6.2 When five (5) or fewer races have been completed, a boat’s series score will be the total of his/her race scores. This changes RRS A2.

7. PROTESTS

- 7.1 Protests will be settled on the water using “3 Minute Justice” immediately following the race for which the protest was filed. Each party is entitled to a 1 minute presentation and judges will have 1 minute for deliberation. Unaffiliated coaches will serve as judges.

8. DISCLAIMER

Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage or injury. Competitors in this race participate entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The race organizers (OA, Race Committee, Protest Committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this race. By participating in this race, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor’s participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
