## NOTICE OF RACE

# Flying Scot® ATLANTIC COAST CHAMPIONSHIP

and Capitol District Championship

September 23 – 24, 2017

Hosted by the **Fishing Bay Yacht Club**Deltaville, Virginia

- 1. **Rules:** This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined by the current edition of the Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020 and the Flying Scot® Sailing Association Class Rules.
- 2. Eligibility: The Atlantic Coast Championship (ACC) is open to current Active, Life, Junior, Club, and Family Members as defined in the FSSA Constitution. FSSA dues and club boat registration fees must be paid to the FSSA prior to the event. If the number of entries equals 25 boats or more, a Challenger Division will be offered, but will only be sailed if a minimum of three boats participate. Otherwise, all boats will compete in one Championship Division. To be eligible for the Capitol District Championship, the skipper must be a member of a fleet within the Capitol District Fleet and sail in the Championship Division. Challenger Division skippers are not eligible for the Capitol District Championship.
- 3. Registration: Advance registration will be available on <a href="www.regattanetwork.com">www.regattanetwork.com</a> or from the link listed on the FSSA event calendar at www.fssa.com. Registration must be completed by Friday, September 15<sup>th</sup> to avoid a late fee. Check-in and registration at the regatta site will be available from 1600 1900 on Friday, September 22<sup>nd</sup> and from 0800 0930 on Saturday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>. Sailing Instructions and Notice of Race will be available at registration. See list of who's coming on the event's registration page.
- 4. Fees: Registration fee per boat is \$100.00, which includes two Saturday Night Dinners. Members of US Sailing will receive a \$5 discount. A late fee of \$15.00 will be charged if registration is received after September 15<sup>th</sup>. Extra Saturday Night Regatta Dinners:

By September 15<sup>th</sup> - \$15 per sailor with pre-registration

After September 15<sup>th</sup> – add extra \$5 per sailor (subject to availability)

5. Schedule: Racing will be Saturday and Sunday with a maximum of five races with no throwouts. See the schedule below. Three races are scheduled for Saturday and two races are scheduled for Sunday. The number of races each day may be adjusted depending on conditions. No Warning Signal will be made after 1400 on Sunday.

- 6. Measurement: Boats and sails must conform to the FSSA Specifications. Each boat must carry equipment required by FSSA Specification Article S-V.2 (Racing Restrictions) and US Coast Guard requirements.
- 7. Racing Area and Courses to be sailed: The race area will be in the mouth of the Piankatank River. The courses to be sailed will be described in the Sailing Instructions. At a minimum, a windward-leeward course will be included.
- 8. **Launching**: An electric hoist is available for launching on the Jackson Creek side of FBYC. Competitors are advised to provide a bridle. There is a double concrete ramp on the Fishing Bay side. Hoses for wash down are located near the ramp, hoist, and between the rows of trailer parked boats.
- 9. **Scoring**: The low point system of RRS Appendix A will be used. All races will be scored (this is a change to Appendix A2). Five races are scheduled, of which one must be completed to constitute a regatta.
- 10. **Prizes**: Prizes will be awarded to the skipper and crew of the top five boats in the Championship Division. Trophies will be awarded in the Challenger Division, if sailed, as follows: 3-5 boats = 1 trophy, 6-8 boats = 2 trophies, and 9 or more boats = 3 trophies. In addition, the ACC perpetual trophy will be awarded for the top scoring boat in the Championship Division. The Capitol District Championship trophy will be awarded to the top scoring Capitol District competitor in the Championship Division.
- 12. **Towing**: Boats may be towed to and from the race area only if towing is made available to all participants. Otherwise, a boat accepting a tow without consent of the Race Committee shall be disqualified without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1. Exceptions to this rule may be made by the Race Committee in extenuating circumstances, i.e. breakdown, illness, or other factors that may be appropriate. Protests under this rule may be made only by the Protest Committee or Race Committee. This changes RRS 60.1(a).
