1. RULES

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRIES

CRCA Cruiser CRCA Non-Spin CRCA Performance Cruiser CRCA Pocket Cruiser CRCA Assigned Rating Spin CRCA Assigned Rating Non-Spin

- 2.2 Classes with 3 or more entries will be given their own start; classes may be combined if fewer entries.
- 2.3 The entry fee is \$30 by Monday, July 24th; there will be a \$10 Late Fee after July 24th (\$40). All entries must be received by 1800 hours on Thursday, July 27, 2017.

- 2.5 Eligibility: Open to all yachts meeting ISAF Category 5P equipment requirements as modified by Chesapeake Bay PHRF. Automated means of self-steering are allowed in CHESSS divisions. --Please contact Rich Acuti (salvage210@gmail.com) for information and questions about CHESSS classes. --The CRCA Cruiser, Performance Cruiser, Pocket Cruiser, and Non-Spin classes are for CRCA boats that have ORRez certificates. The CRCA "Assigned Ratings" classes were designed for "dual purpose" boats that have never raced, stopped racing, or overall are more low-key. The assigned ratings will be based on formulae that have been used with success throughout the country to try to equitably rate the wide range of cruising-type or dual purpose boats. The racing area will be the mouth of the West River and environs.

6. COURSE[S] and MARKS

Courses and marks will be posted in the Sailing Instructions.

7. STARTING SYSTEM

The Starting System of RRS 26 will be used.

8. TIME LIMIT

The time limit for the race will be 6 hours from start to finish.

9. PROTESTS

Protests shall be delivered to WRSC Clubhouse within 2 hour of the protesting yachts finish. Hearings will be held as soon as possible after racing in the WRSC clubhouse.

10. SCORING and TROPHIES

The CBYRA High Point System will apply for PHRF and CHESSS classes. Scoring for CRCA classes TBD and will be posted in the Sailing Instructions. Trophies will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, 3rd place in each class.

- **11. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY** Competitors participate in the WRSC Poplar Island Race entirely at their own risk; see RRS 4. The organizing authority will accept no liability for material damage, personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the event.
- **12. INSURANCE** Each boat shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$300,000.
- **13. SOCIAL** There will be a Skipper's Meeting and pre-race party on Friday evening, July 28 and postrace party after the race on Saturday, July 29 at the WRSC clubhouse in Galesville, MD. Food and beverages will be available for purchase. All are welcome and skippers/crews newer to racing are especially encouraged to attend the Skipper's meeting.
- 14. DOCKAGE Limited dockage will be available at the West River Sailing Club dock on Tenthouse Creek on Friday evening and for the post-race party. Additional details will be available in the Sailing Instructions. There are also several marinas with transient space on the West River that are within walking distance the WRSC clubhouse.
- **15. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION** This is a Clean Race. All competitors are strongly encouraged to use multi-use water bottles instead of disposable water bottles, and to recycle whenever possible. RRS 55 prohibits placing trash in the water.
