

Halloween Spectacular Geneva Lake Sailing School 28-29October 2017 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS



1. RULES

The regatta will be governed by the 2017 - 2020 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the US Sailing prescriptions, ISSA Procedural Rules, the MISSA Procedural Rules & By-Laws (for MISSA Fleet), and the IODA Class Rules except any altered by these Sailing Instructions (SIs). If the Notice of Race (NOR) and SIs differ then the SIs will take precedent.

2. **NOTICES TO COMPETITORS**

All notices to Competitors will be posted on the notice board located on the west windows of GLSS.

3. CHANGES IN THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Any change in the Sailing Instructions will be posted on the day it will take effect, or orally at competitors meeting.
- 3.2 Changes to the starting time on Sunday October 29th will be posted following racing on Saturday October 28th.

4. SIGNALS

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from a mast on the race committee boat.
- 4.2 Code Flag "AP", Answering Pennant, when made ashore means "The race is postponed: do not leave the basin." When AP is displayed ashore, the time of the warning signal will be announced before the lowering of "AP".

5. NUMBER AND SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 The warning signal for the first race will be at 1000hrs on Saturday October 28th. Boats shall be ready to leave the basin for the starting area at least 30 minutes before the announced warning time.
- 5.2 The warning signal for the first race will be at 1000hrs on Sunday October 29th. No race will be started after 1500hrs on Sunday October 29th.
- 5.3 One full rotation is scheduled for the MISSA fleet. JV division will sail with B division rotation. One race will constitute a regatta.
- 5.4 Schedule

Saturday October 28, 2017

0800 Check in.

0900 Mandatory Competitors Meeting at Boat Launch Pavilion.

1000 First warning. Racing throughout the day. There is no set end time for Saturday. Lunch on the water.

Sunday October 29, 2017

0900 Costume Contest with Prizes! All 420s must be ready to launch.

1000 First warning. Racing throughout the day. Lunch on the water.

1500 No race will be started after 1500.

Immediately following racing will be the trophy presentation.

6. RACING AREA

The racing will take place on Lake Geneva, north of the Buddy Melges Sailing Center

7. THE COURSE

- 7.1 Appendix A shows the course diagrams. HS and JV fleets will sail two laps.
- 7.2 Optimist RWB will sail Modified Olympic course with start and finish in the middle
- 7.3 Optimist green fleet will sail Modified Triangle Course with start and finish in the middle
- 7.4 There will be two race circles, one for HS and JV competition and one for Optimist R-W-B and Green fleet.
- 8. **MARKS** Marks will be Orange inflatable buoys.

9. START

- 9.1 Races for High School will be started in accordance to US Sailing Prescription Appendix S. (3 Minute "Musical" starts)
- 9.2 Races for optimist class will be started according to RRS 26.

10. **RECALLS**

- 10.1 Individual recalls for High School event will be made in accordance to RRS Appendix S.
- General recalls for High School event will be signaled by displaying the "first Substitute" pennant as well as a series of sounds. For the MISSA division, in accordance with ISSA PR 7.8(b): after a general recall, the "round-the-ends rule" provisions of RRS 30.1; Code Flag I need not be displayed.
- 10.3 Recalls for Optimist class will be made in accordance with rule 29. On the Green Fleet start the Race Committee may hail the numbers of boat identified as OCS. Failure to hear the hail will not be grounds for redress.

11. CHANGE OF COURSE AFTER THE START

- 11.1 When changing the course after the start, the race committee will lay a new mark and will lift the original mark as soon as practicable. Any mark to be rounded after rounding the new mark may be relocated to maintain the original course configuration.
- 11.2 All course changes will be in accordance to ISSA PR 7.7(c).

12 THE FINISH

For all courses, the finishing line will be between an orange flag on the race committee boat and an orange ball.

13. RACE TIME

- 13.1 The target race time for MISSA fleet is 20 minutes. On all other courses, the target time is 30 minutes.
- 13.2 Boats failing to finish within 10 minutes after the first boat finishes will be scored "Did Not Finish".
- 13.3 Boats which may delay the next start may be finished in place by the Race Committee.

14. **RETIREMENT**

A boat that retires from a race shall notify a race committee boat before leaving the race area. If that is impossible, then immediately after arriving ashore, the competitor shall notify a regatta representative.

15. **PROTESTS**

- 15.1 Protests will be heard in accordance to the RRS and ISSA PR.
- Protests shall be written on forms available at the GLSS Race Committee Room and lodged with the jury's representative there. Protest time will end 30 minutes after the race committee signal boat docks.
- 15.3 Protest notices will be posted within 30 minutes of the protest time limit to inform competitors where and when there is a hearing in which they are parties to a protest or named as witnesses.
- 15.4 The jury will hear protests in the order it deems appropriate.

16. **SCORING**

- 16.1 There will be no dropped races for any fleet. MISSA racing will be scored in accordance to ISSA PR 9.
- 16.2 MISSA scores will be available on TechScore, other fleets will be posted on the notice board.

17. DISPOSAL OF WASTE OR TRASH

boats observed discharging trash over the side shall be either disqualified from all races sailed on the day the infraction is observed or be subject to other suitable disciplinary action, or both.

18. **SAFETY**

18.1 All competitors shall wear a US Coast Guard type III life jacket while afloat. Competitors may remove their lifejackets for the brief time required to add or remove layers of clothing.

19. COACHING


19.1 All coaches shall provide their own power boat and will facilitate rotations and act as safety boats. ALL Coaches shall monitor VHF radios on their fleet's racing circle.


20. Sportsmanship


Number of Laps Displayed on RC
