SAILING INSTRUCTIONS - Pop Tops 2017

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the current Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 Double headsails shall be allowed on Non-spinnaker class yachts and Non-spinnaker yachts sailing in spinnaker classes.
- 1.3 One design yachts shall race in their established class unless otherwise approved by the Race Committee.
- 1.4 The head of the spinnaker or second headsail shall be on or below deck level before the yacht's bow crosses between the **entrance lights** to the Alamitos Bay Jetty.
- 1.5 A straight line connecting adjacent center of channel marker buoys within the Alamitos Bay Jetty and the center of channel buoy in front of Malarkey's Restaurant shall be considered a continuous obstruction in accordance with Racing Rule 19.2. **NO YACHT MAY CROSS SAID LINE.**
- 1.6 If a yacht's rating is changed during a series, the skipper shall submit a revised entry card prior to the next race sailed or be considered not entered. Should the yacht's new rating also cause a change in class, the yacht shall remain in the class previously entered and be handicapped with the new rating for the remaining races in that series. The yacht shall be changed to the new appropriate class in the next series.
- 2. NOTICE TO COMPETITORS The notice to competitors shall be posted on the Official Regatta Notice Board at Seal Beach Yacht Club.
- 3. CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS Any change to the sailing instructions shall be posted before 0900 on the day it takes effect.
- 4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE Signals made ashore will be displayed at the Seal Beach Yacht Club flagpole.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 The Schedule of Races shall be as prescribed in the Notice of Race or an addendum thereto.
- 5.2 The number of races shall be as prescribed in the Notice of Race.
- 5.3 The scheduled time for the warning signal shall be as prescribed in the Notice of Race.
- 5.4 Approximately one minute prior to the warning signal for the first class in each race, the Race Committee may make two sound signals.
- 6. CLASS FLAGS For class identification, each yacht shall display an International Numeral pennant from its permanent backstay as follows: PHRF AA Zero, PHRF A1 One, PHRF A2 Two, if only one "A" class Two, Sport Boat Three, PHRF B Five, PHRF C Seven, PHRF D Nine, PHRF A N/S Four, PHRF B N/S Eight, if only one N/S class Four. No identification pennant is required for one design classes.
- 7. RACING AREA The racing area shall be as shown on the current Seal Beach Yacht Club Course Chart prescribed in the Notice of Race.
- 8. THE COURSES Courses shall be selected from those shown on the current Seal Beach Yacht Club Course Chart as prescribed in the Notice of Race.

9. MARKS

- 9.1 The Marks shall be as described in the description of marks on the course chart prescribed in the Notice of Race.
- 9.2 Each mark on the course shall be rounded to port unless the mark in the course being sailed is followed by a small (s) on the Course Chart designated in the Notice of Race, which mark shall be rounded to starboard.
- 9.3 The starting marks shall be buoys with orange flags at both ends or an orange flag aboard the Race Committee boat at the starboard end and a buoy at the port end.
- 9.4 Race Signals shall be modified to read "no sound signal shall be used when code flag "M" is displayed at a mark".
- 9.5 Replacement Marks A replacement mark may be a yellow inflatable tetrahedron instead of a code flag "M".

10. THE START

- 10.1 Races shall be started using Rule 26.
- 10.2 The starting line shall consist of marks as described in section 9.3 above and shall be located in the vicinity of Mark 38.
- 10.3 As a courtesy, the Race Committee will attempt to notify recalled boats by hailing their sail number over VHF channel **71**. Failure of a boat to see or hear her recall notification shall not relieve her of her obligation to start correctly and shall
 - not be grounds for redress. A boat's position in the sequence of hailed numbers or broadcast numbers shall not be grounds for redress.
- 10.4 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area.
- **11. THE FINISH** The finishing line shall be between a point at the Navy Yacht Club and an orange flag in the channel out from the Navy YC point.
- 12. ALTERNATE PENALTY Racing Rule 44 is changed so that the 720 degree turn is replaced by a single 360 degree turn.
- 13. TIME LIMIT The time limit, if any, shall be as prescribed in the Notice of Race.

14. PROTESTS

- 14.1 Promptly after finishing, a boat intending to protest shall notify the Race Committee of the name and/or sail number of the boat being protested.
- 14.2 Protests shall be written on forms available at the Seal Beach Yacht Club. WRITTEN PROTESTS SHALL BE FILED WITH THE RACE CHAIRMAN OR PROTEST CHAIR WITHIN ONE HOUR AFTER THE LAST BOAT FINISHES.
- 14.3 Protests may be subject to mediation or arbitration.
- **15. SCORING** The Low Point System of Appendix A shall apply. UFD, BFD, DNE & DPI results are not excludable for series results. A yacht shall be scored DNE (Disqualification not excludable) when they are disqualified as the results of a protest committee hearing and finding. A yacht scored DSQ (Disqualified) as a result of a mediation or arbitration may exclude that result. This changed rule 90.3(b).

16. SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 16.1 Boats shall endeavor to check in with the Race Committee prior to the warning signal for the first class.
- 16.2 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the Race Committee before leaving the Race Area. The race committee shall monitor VHF channel **71**.
- **17. TROPHIES** Trophies shall be presented in the place and time prescribed in the Notice of Race. TROPHIES NOT CLAIMED WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE TROPHY PRESENTATIOIN SHALL BE FORFITED AND REVERT TO CLUB OWNERSHIP.
