1.0 RULES

- 1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020
- 2 USCG approved life jackets are required to be worn from dock-to-dock at all times. Flag "Y" will not be displayed. This changes Rule 40.
HOWEVER: For MC Scows ONLY: Life jacket use is advised but its use shall be optional at the discretion of the sailors.
- 3 MC Scows may use VHF Radio for communication.

2.0 ELIGIBILITY

- 1 The regatta is open to boats of the following classes:
 - o Optimist – Green, White, Blue and Red Fleets
 - o Open Bic - Junior
 - o Melges 14
 - o Sunfish – Midget, Junior and Adult Fleets
 - o Laser – 4.7, Radial and Full Fleets – Junior & Adult
 - o Collegiate 420 (Non-Spin 420)
 - o MC Scows
 - o V-15
- 2 Optimist Class Age Restrictions
 - o Green Fleet Sailor must be novice up to age 15 as of regatta date
 - o White Fleet Sailor age 10 and under as of regatta date
 - o Blue Fleet Sailor age 11 or 12 as of regatta date
 - o Red Fleet Sailor age 13, 14 or 15 as of regatta date
- 3 Open Bic Fleet Under 21 until 12/31/18
- 4 Sunfish Class Age Restrictions for Juniors
 - o Midget Fleet Under 15 as of regatta date
 - o Junior Fleet Under 19 as of regatta date
- 5 Laser Class Age Restrictions for Juniors
 - o 4.7 rig Under 18 until 12/31/18
 - o Radial Rig Under 19 until 12/31/18
 - o Full Rig Under 21 until 12/31/18

- o Collegiate 420 (non-spin 420) (12) LNYC-owned boats are available on a first come, first served basis. Nonmembers may charter a boat for a fee.
- .1 Competitors attempting to register after the LNYC fleet is full will be added to a waitlist.
- .2 If the team is providing its own boat, please contact LNYC Regatta Chairman, Tom Payne thomas3452(at)att.net, to be included in the fleet. Otherwise, waitlisted teams will be notified in the event that a boat becomes available.

5.0 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing instructions will be available at Check-in located at LNYC's Clubhouse.

6.0 COURSES AND VENUE

Courses will be described in the Sailing Instructions. The racing venue is Lake Norman.

7.0 SCORING

The scoring system is as follows:

- 7.1. The Low Point scoring system will be used, as defined by RRS Appendix A with modifications as prescribed in paragraphs below.
- 7.2. One race will constitute a regatta or series for all divisions.
- 7.3. When fewer than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. This changes Appdx A-2.
- 7.4. When from five to ten races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 7.5. When more than ten races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores. This changes Appdx-A-2.
- 7.6. The scoring outlined in the sailing instructions with regard to excluded races will take precedence over a "Regatta" NOR in the event of any contradictions.
- 7.7: Race scores not excludable under the RRS shall be scored.

8.0 AWARDS

Trophies will be awarded based on the number of boats as follows:

9.0 LAUNCHING & FACILITIES

Boats may launch from the beach by the Pavilion, the point or any ramp area. Camping is welcome with plenty of lakefront sites available. There are plenty of motels on Interstate 77 at Exits 33 and 36.



Grills, Shower and restroom facilities are available at the Clubhouse and at the Pavilion.
Open fires and pets are prohibited at LNYC.
