

Sailing Instructions 2018 Circuit Regatta #6

October 6th & 7th, 2018
Organizing Authority Lake CanyonYacht Club
J/22 Fleet 17 and District 5

1RULES

- 1.1The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the current *Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2All US SAILING Prescriptions and the U S Prescription in Appendix V will apply.
- 1.3Rule 87 will be changed to read as follows: *These sailing instructions may change a class rule.*
- 1.4Class Rule 8.9 (weight limit) of the IJ22CA Class Rules will not apply for eligibility to participate in this Regatta.
- 1.5Appendix A Changes: A1 is changed so that two (2) races must be completed to constitute an event. A2.1 is changed so that no races shall be discarded.

2ADVERTISING

2.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

1NOTICES TO COMPETITOR

1.1Notices to competitors and changes to the sailing instructions will be posted on the event web site (www.regattanetwork/event/16XXX) and on the Official Regatta Notice Board located outside and to the left of the main lobby in the breezeway of the LCYC clubhouse.

2CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

3SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 3.1Signals made ashore will be displayed on flagpole on the superdock in the marina.
- 3.2When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in the RRS 'Race Signals'.

1SCHEDULE

- 1.20n the last day of the regatta no warning signal will be made after 1200.

2CLASS FLAG

- 2.1The class flag will be **numeral pennat number one.**
- 2.2Boats are not required to fly class flags.

3RACING AREAS

3.1All races will be sailed within the confines of Canyon Lake.

4CHECKING IN

4.1Before the warning signal of her first race of each day, each boat shall sail on starboard tack past the stern of the race committee signal boat and hail her bow number until acknowledged by the race committee by repeating the boat's bow number. A boat failing to do so will receive a scoring penalty, without a hearing, equal to 20% of the number of boats starting in that race, calculated as specified in RRS 44.3(c). This modifies Rule 63.1 and A5.

5THE COURSES

- 5.1The courses will be as shown in Attachment A (not to scale).
- 5.2No later than the warning signal, the race committee signal boat will display the approximate distance between the leeward and windward marks, and the approximate magnetic bearing of the weather mark.
- 5.3The windward mark and offset mark 1a shall be rounded to port.
- 5.4An offset mark (1a) will be set at a right angle to the course from Mark 1 to Mark 2s and 2p. Boats shall pass between marks 2s and 2p and round one of them before going to the next mark of the course.

1MARKS

- 1.1Rounding marks 1, 2p, and 2s will be yellow inflatable; mark 1a shall be a floating shape. Changed rounding marks used in accordance with SI 14 will be orange inflatable except for the weather offset mark which shall remain a floating shape.
- 1.2A race committee starting or finishing boat may set a stand-off buoy. When present, this stand-off buoy, the line attaching it to the race committee boat, and the race committee boat are all part of the starting or finishing mark.

2THE START

- 2.1The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee signal boat and Mark S.
- 2.2A boat starting later than 10 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A4 and A5.

3RECALLS

3.1The race committee will attempt to announce boats identified as OCS by transmitting bow numbers over VHF Channel 68. Failure to hear or receive such broadcasts, timeliness of broadcast or the order of numbers announced, will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

4CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

4.1To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.

5THE FINISH

5.1The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a race committee boat and Mark 1.

6PENALTY SYSTEM

6.1The penalty system described in 2017-2020 RRS and added as a U S Sailing Prescription Appendix V1 and V2 shall apply.

7TIME LIMITS

- 7.1The race will be abandoned if no boat has rounded the first mark within 45 minutes after the start.
- 7.2The time limit is 2 hours. Boats failing to finish within 20 minutes after the first boat sails the course in accordance with Rule 28.1 and finishes, and not subsequently retiring, penalized or given redress, will be scored DNF without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.

8PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 8.1Protest forms are available in the clubhouse.. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.
- 8.2The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the race committee signal boat docks. The race committee will post the protest time limit on the official notice board referred to in SI 3.1 above.
- 8.3The race committee will post a list of race committee scoring actions no later than the protest time limit.
- 8.4Notices of protests by the race committee or protest committee will be posted to inform boats under RRS 61.1(b).
- 8.5As soon as practicable after the protest time limit, the protest committee will post a notice to inform competitors of the schedule and location of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the LCYC lighthouse.
- 8.6On the last scheduled day of racing, a request for redress based on a jury decision shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. This changes rule 62.2.
- 8.7Any sailor who wishes to become a party to a scheduled redress hearing shall: 1) Check the daily schedule of protest and redress hearings that the protest committee will post on the Official Notice Board describing the nature of the redress request and time of the hearing, and 2) submit a written request to participate in the hearing to the protest committee before the hearing begins. The posting by the protest committee on the Official Notice Board of the notice and time for a redress hearing requested by any boat shall constitute the reasonable attempt of the protest committee to notify all boats in compliance with U S Sailing Prescription (b) to Rule 63.2.

9SCORING

- 9.1RRS Appendix A4, Low Point System, will apply.
- 9.2There are no throw outs for this event.

10SAFETY REGULATIONS

10.1A boat that retires from a race, or leaves the racing area between races, shall notify the race committee at the first reasonable opportunity by hail or on VHF.

11REPLACEMENT OF CREW AND EQUIPMENT

- 11.1Substitution of skipper or crew will not be allowed without prior written approval of the protest committee. In case of emergency, this approval may be granted retroactively.
- 11.2Competitors must use the same boat, measured equipment, and only one suit of sails for the entire regatta unless the item is so severely damaged as to make it unusable. All requests to replace equipment must be submitted to the race committee or the protest committee in writing and all such equipment must pass measurement.

12HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

12.1All boats once launched may not be hauled out, nor rudders removed, during the Regatta except with and according to the terms of prior written permission from the race committee or protest committee.

13RADIO COMMUNICATION

13.1Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communication not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones. Boats may use mobile phones to record races while racing; however, must not upload data while racing.

14DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

14.1Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around boats between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the regatta.

15PRIZES

15.1Prizes will be awarded to the top 3 competitors.

16DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY


16.1Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

Course Diagram

Course will be windward/leeward with offset and leeward gate: Start -1, 1a - 2s/2p - 1, 1a - 2s/2p - Finish

On leg 5, Mark #1 becomes Mark F for the Finish.



The starting pin becomes mark 2p after the starting gun.
