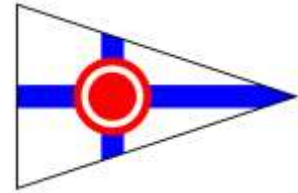




***** Notice of Race *****
Sundowner Series
American Legion Yacht Club
Mondays, May 6 thru August 26, 2019



1. ORGANIZING AUTHORITY

1.1. American Legion Yacht Club (ALYC) is the organizing authority for the Sundowner Series.

2. RULES

- 2.1. The series will be governed by the 2017-2020 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) as adopted by the United States Sailing Association (USSA) and the Class Rules of the Performance Handicap Racing Fleet of Southern California (PHRF), and the Notice of Race, except as altered by the Sailing Instructions.
- 2.2. Neither symmetrical nor asymmetrical spinnakers are to be used.
- 2.3. While racing, Performance Handicap Racing Fleet (PHRF) boats SHALL NOT enter the Mooring Areas or designated anchorages. Moorings and Anchorages are defined as obstructions, except mooring area "HP" in the vicinity of Spar Buoy 6.
- 2.4. Two headsails are allowed for PHRF boats not opting for a non-spin offset.
- 2.5. Boats are subject to inspection by the appropriate fleet coordinator to ensure conformity to the applicable class rules, bylaws and/or measurement certificates.
- 2.6. Boats are to comply with US Sailing Safety Equipment Requirements (SER) for Near Shore, revision 2019, dated January 1, 2019.

3. CLASSES

- 3.1. The fleet will be divided into appropriate classes based on their PHRF area D Random Leg Course (RLC) Ratings.
- 3.2. One-Design and Harbor 20's are also invited to race.

4. ELIGIBILITY

- 4.1. Each entrant must be a member of PHRF of Southern California having a valid rating certificate, Harbor 20 Association, J-22, or accredited one design class and be a member of a SCYA Member Yacht Club or a USSA recognized yacht club if not a resident of Area J.

5. ENTRIES AND FEES

- 5.1. Online entry at US Sailings Regatta Network website.
- 5.2. The entry fee is \$50.00 when received prior to 5:00pm (PDT) on the Thursday (May 2) immediately prior to the first race of the series. An additional late entry fee of \$10.00 is automatically added by Regatta Network after that date and time.

6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 6.1. Sailing Instructions will be available after 5:00pm (PDT) on the Wednesday (May 1) immediately prior to the first race of the series and will be posted to the ALYC website (www.alyc.com) and on Regatta Network.

7. SCHEDULE

- 7.1. The races are scheduled for each Monday, May 6 thru August 26, 2019, except May 27 (Memorial Day).
- 7.2. Any changes to the schedule of races will be posted by 7:00pm (PST) on the day before the race on the ALYC website and on Regatta Network.
- 7.3. The first warning signal for all classes is scheduled for 6:00pm (PST) each Monday.

8. COURSES TO BE SAILED

- 8.1. Courses will be posted on the Committee Boat by two (2) numerical pennants (tens over ones).
- 8.2. Start and Finish Line will be in the Newport Harbor Turning Basin (the "Five-Points" area).

9. PENALTIES

9.1. The 720 degree turn penalty (RSS 44.1) is modified to a 360 degree turn.

10. SCORING

10.1. Scoring will be according to RRS A9 Low Point System for a series longer than a regatta.

10.2. There will be two eight race Series with a Throw-Out in each Series.
