SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Harbor 20 Challenge

April 20, 2019

1. Rules

The regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* and any rules associated with the Harbor 20 class

2. Entries

Competitors may enter by completing the entry form through Regatta Network. This can be accessed by logging on to ccyc.org Sail Fleet, Racing Information, register. \$35.00 entrance fee for all boats. Need to register before 0900 on the day of the race.

3. Notices to Competitors

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located at the CCYC club house. "On the Sail Fleet bulletin Board". Or at ccyc.org Sail Fleet, Racing Information,

4. Signals Made Ashore

Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagstaff located at the east corner of the patio. If a postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 10 minutes after flag AP is lowered.

5. Schedule and Class Flags.

The warning signal for the first race will be at 1225 on the day of the race. We will use the code flag 2 (for Harbor 20 Fleet 2) as the warning flag.

6. Racing Area

The racing area will be located in front of the Coronado Cays Yacht Club and adjacent area within the Coronado Cays.

7. Courses and Marks:

No later than the warning signal, the race committee will designate the course by displaying the course number. The courses are described on the last pages of these instructions.

8. Starting and Finishing Lines:

The starting / finish line will be between the Orange flag on the committee boat and the Orange flag. The committee boat and flag will be on the edge of the channel between markers "G 13" and "G15" on the Coronado Cay channel. [The Sound Signal Starting System in Appendix S of the racing rules will be used.]

9. Propulsion Rule 42.3i:

If aground. Permit propulsion using an engine or any other method, provided the boat does not gain a significant advantage in the race.

10. Protests

Protests shall be delivered to Race Committee ashore. The protest time limit and a list of protests received will be posted on the notice board. Hearings will be held as soon as practicable after racing.

11. Scoring

Low point system. NO throw outs.

12. Race Courses.

Provided on-line through the Regatta network page.
