NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

- 1.1 The Regatta will be governed by the current Racing Rules of Sailing, together with the rules of the participating classes and any additional sailing instructions to be issued at the competitors' meeting.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to boats of the International 505, A-Class catamaran, Nacra 20/F18 catamaran, and F16 catamaran classes. The Nacra 20/F18 and F16 catamaran classes will race together as an Open Class using the SCHRS handicap system.

3 ENTRY

- 3.1 Regular online registration ends at midnight on Thursday, May 2 on the Regatta's Regatta Network site.

- 4.1 Required fees are as follows:

Cancellation prior to the close of onsite registration will be refunded, minus a 10% fee.
