# The Organizing Authority (OA) is Sail Canada (SC) in conjunction with the Shediac Bay Yacht Club (SBYC) Shediac, New Brunswick, Canada NOTICE OF RACE

**[DP]** denotes a rule for which the penalty is at the discretion of the Protest Committee. This changes RRS 64.1.

**[NP]** denotes that a breach of this rule will not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

#### 1 Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.
- 1.3 Appendix P will apply as changed by NoR 7.1 and 7.2.
- 1.4 Appendix T will apply.

#### 2 Advertising

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the OA.

#### 3 Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the Laser Standard, Laser Radial, Laser 4.7, Optimist, Club 420 (C420), International 420 (I420), and 29er classes. <u>Note:</u> District 1 Laser Masters Championships will be part of the regatta.
- 3.2 The regatta will be open to all competitors meeting the requirements as found in Addendum "A".

#### 4 Fees

### 4.1 Early registration; paid for on or prior to July 19, 2019

- 4.3 The Training camp and Regatta fees include breakfast and a welcome reception.
- 4.4 Bag lunches will be available for \$10.00 per day.

- 4.5 Coaches' package, including boat launch, docking/mooring, and food as per competitors, will be \$100.00.
- 4.6 Sailing Instructions will be available at registration.

#### 5 Venue

Racing will take place on the waters of Shediac Bay.

#### 6 Courses

The courses to be sailed will be Windward – Leeward course with a Hollywood (reach) finish or trapezoid.

#### 7 Penalty System

- 7.1 RRS P2.3 will not apply and RRS P2.2 is changed so that it will apply to any penalty after the first one.
- 7.2 For the 29er class RRS 44.1 and RRS P2.1 are changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

On the race days, there will be debriefs after the racing by the event coach, chief judge and the principal race officer.

#### 9 Scoring

- 9.1 The number of races scheduled is seven (7). One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 9.2 When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When 5 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

#### 10 Safety [DP][NP]

- 10.1 I420s, 29ers, Lasers, Laser Radials and Laser 4.7s must have a tow line, of minimum 10 metres length and 7mm diameter fixed to their mast. Competitors may not use other lines from running rigging for this purpose. C420s and Optimist classes are required to have tow lines in accordance with their class rules.
- 10.2 The Preamble to RRS Part 4 and RRS 40 is changed to require personal flotation devices (PFD's) to be worn at all times when afloat, except when changing clothing.
- 10.3 All coach boats are expected to have functioning VHF radios onboard to assist with safety calls or exchange of other information.
- 10.4 A whistle shall be attached by a lanyard to the PFD of every competitor. The lanyard shall be long enough to permit the sailor to use the whistle while wearing the PFD.

#### 11 Prizes

Prizes will be awarded for top three in each fleet. Additional prizes may be awarded.

#### 12 Disclaimer of Liability

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race. The Shediac Bay Yacht Club, Sail Canada and all other individuals and entities involved in the organization of this regatta shall accept no liability whatsoever for any injury, damage or loss or claim, whether personal or material, incurred or inflicted to participants before, during or after this regatta.

#### 13 Insurance [DP][NP]

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance. The organizing authority does not accept any responsibility for verifying that a boat has valid third-party liability insurance.

## 14 Rights to Use Name and Likeness



# Addendum "A"

# Application of RRS 46 to determine Canadian Sailor Eligibility at Sail Canada Events.

Canadian sailors are required to show proof of Sail Canada membership to ensure eligibility to race. The following forms will be accepted as proof of membership:

- Sail Canada membership card;
- Membership card from Sail Canada member club;
- Official letter or document confirming membership from a Sail Canada member club;
- · Published membership list from a Sail Canada member club
- Proof of membership with another World Sailing member national authority (MNA)\*

A sailor who cannot provide proof of membership as above may obtain a Right-to-Race card which will be available at the registration desk for a fee. A Right-to-Race sailor card is valid only until the completion of the said event.

**Sail Canada member cards** are issued by the Provincial Sailing Associations, who then issue them to Sail Canada member clubs. Directors or managers at the clubs then issue the cards to their members.

**Proof of age** – The following are valid forms of proof of age:

- Valid passport;
- Provincially issued identification e.g. drivers' license, health card;
- Municipally issued photo accreditation that includes full name and birth date;
- School- issued photo accreditation that includes full name and birth date.
