

Finn Class North American Championship

Mission Bay Yacht Club San Diego, California August 23-25, 2019

NOTICE OF RACE



1. RULES

- 1.1. This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and IFA Class rules, except as any of these are changed by the Sailing Instructions or any appendices to the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2. Appendix P5 will apply. Finn Class Rule C.1.1 (Flag O @ 10 kts+ to permit downwind pumping/rocking/ooching; flag R to restrict) will be in effect and explained fully at the Competitors meeting.
- 1.3. The organizing authority is the USA Finn Association; the Host Club is Mission Bay Yacht Club.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1. The regatta is open to all members of the Finn class. Competitors shall be members of the USA Finn Class Association or other relevant international Finn class association.
- 2.2. Competitors must arrange for the registered boat to be present at the event. Boats to charter may be available (see additional Information below).
- 2.3. Eligible competitors may enter on line by logging on to Regatta Networks and by providing the required information. The link to Regatta Networks is: http://www.regattanetwork.com/event/19277
- 2.4. Registration is not complete until Regatta Network entry and required fee are received by Mission Bay Yacht Club.

3. FEES

- 3.1. The entry fee is \$150.00. Entries received after August 16, and before August 23, will be subject to an additional fee of \$35.
- 3.2. The fee provides event shirt, hosted post-race snacks and beverages, Saturday evening dinner at MBYC, and Sunday awards.
- 3.3. Additional Saturday dinner tickets available at registration for \$40 ea.

4. SCHEDULE

- 4.1. A maximum of eight (8) races may be sailed.
- 4.2. The schedule of events is as follows:

Thursday, August 22, 2019:

1000-1700 Registration and Measurement

Friday, August 23, 2019:

0800-0930 Check-in

1000 Competitor brief; coach's meeting immediately following

1200 1st Warning Signal

After Racing – hosted beer social/snacks

Saturday, August 24, 2019:

1200 1st Warning Signal

1800 Hosted Dinner at MBYC

Sunday, August 25, 2019:

1200 1st Warning Signal

1530 No further Warning Signal shall be made

Awards ceremony as soon as practicable after racing.

4.3. The Race Committee may adjust the number of races each day to accommodate weather conditions.

5. MEASUREMENTS

- 5.1. All equipment must be class legal and may be checked at any time during the regatta. Each boat should be able to produce a valid measurement certificate for boat equipment and sails.
- 5.2. Skippers may be asked to show compliance with all safety gear as required by US Coast Guard (or competitors home countries' requirements) and Class rules. Emphasis is drawn to Finn Class Rule C 5.2.1 (a) towing rope minimum 8 m long of not less than 8 mm in diameter, capable of floating. The towing rope must be readily available without contravening Rule C.6.1 (b).

6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 6.1. Preliminary sailing instructions will be available on the event web site on or about August 9, 2019.
- 6.2. A final version will be available at on-site registration.

7. COURSES & RACING AREA

- 7.1. Courses will be as determined by the Race Committee.
- 7.2. The racing area will be on the Pacific Ocean approximately one mile north of Mission Bay Jetty.

8. SCORING

- 8.1. The Low Point Scoring system will apply except that no scores will be excluded if fewer than five (5) races are completed. This changes RRS A2.
- 8.2. Three (3) races shall be completed to constitute a series.

9. AWARDS

9.1. Trophies will be awarded for the top three (3) finishers overall.

10. PHOTOGRAPHY CONSENT

10.1. Competitors entering the regatta accept that they may be photographed and/or videotaped participating in the race and/or using MBYC's facilities and they consent to the taking of such images and to the use, reuse, publication and republication of such images in any media, in conjunction with the competitors name or not without compensation and without the competitors approval of such images or any use thereof.

11. COACHES AND NON RACE COMMITTEE BOATS

11.1. All support boats and coaches must be capable of communicating with the Race Committee on VHF channels 16, 68, 69, 71 and 73.

12. PARKING AND STORAGE

12.1. Parking on the MBYC grounds is restricted. Complimentary parking passes will be available at the MBYC office. Participants may bring their boats into the MBYC yard beginning on Thursday August 22, 2019. Extended storage on a space available basis may be requested in advance by contacting the MBYC office (858) 488-0501.

13. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY/RISK

13.1. It is the competitor's decision to enter the regatta and to start or continue any race and each competitor is ultimately responsible for the risks of sailing and racing. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The competitor will accept full responsibility for all his/her actions during any activity related to the event. This includes all race preparation activities and post-race activities. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.

14. INSURANCE

14.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with minimum coverage of US \$300,000.00 per event or the equivalent.

15. TUNE UP EVENT

15.1. August 17 & 18 – MBYC One-Design Regatta – Sign up at mbyc.org. Extended storage

on a space available basis may be requested in advance by contacting the MBYC office (858) 488-0501.

16. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- 16.1. ACCOMMODATION. Overnight camping at MBYC is not permitted; Mission Bay Park does not permit camping Recommend Campland on the Bay (858-581-4260). Closest hotels: Bahia (619-488-0551); Catamaran (619-488-1081); Dana Inn (619-222-6440); Hyatt Regency (619-224-1234). Reserve early. San Diego is a destination resort city and lodging fills up early.
- 16.2. CHARTERS. Contact Mike Dorgan (Mike@DorganYachts.com) to discuss possibility of charters.
- 16.3. TOWS. Courtesy tows to the racing area may be available in the vicinity of the launch area; however, it is the responsibility of each competitor to be at the start on time.
- 16.4. HOSPITALITY. Competitors and their guests are invited to use club facilities on race days. Refreshments will be available following racing. There will be a Dinner on Saturday night. Guests of competitors may purchase additional dinner tickets.
