











NERYC JUNIOR REGATTA 2019

1. RULES

- 1.1 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The 2017 2020 Racing Rules of Sailing, including the prescriptions of US Sailing except as any of these are altered by these Sailing Instructions, or any amendments to that.
- 1.2 The Organizing Authority is the Sail Race Committee (SRC) of North East River Yacht Club (NERYC).

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located by the boardwalk and/or the NERYC website. A courtesy announcement may be made at the pre-race skipper's meeting.

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 9:00am. A Skippers Meeting will be held outside the clubhouse at 9:45am.

4. SCHEDULE OF RACES

4.1 The regatta will consist of one or more races. The first race will start at 10:30am, and no races will begin after 4:00pm.

5. COURSES

- 5.1 The diagrams with identifying letters shown below indicate types of courses to be sailed. The number of laps to be sailed will be indicated by a sign on the committee boat which will be posted prior to the starting sequence.
- 5.2 M Triangle with start/finish in middle of windward leg Opti Green Fleet.
- 5.3 W Windward, Leeward with start/finish in middle of windward leg Opti RWB Fleet.
- 5.4 The Start/Finish line is CLOSED and may only be crossed when starting or finishing.

6. MARKS

- 6.1 The RWB Fleet will use Hippity Hops and/or Orange Cylinders.
- 6.2 The Green Fleet will use Hippity Hops.

7. THE START

7.1 Races will be started by using a 3 minute dinghy sequence. The starting line will be between the orange flag on the committe boat and the nearby Hippity Hop starting mark.

8. RECALLS

- 8.1 Individual Recalls will be signaled by code flag "X" (White with blue cross) and one horn blast. The committee will hail the sail number(s) of the premature starter(s). Whether or not the hail is heard, responsibility for starting properly rests with each yacht.
- 8.2 General Recall will be signaled by display of code flag "First Substitute" (yellow and blue pennant) and two guns or horn blasts.

9. THE FINISH

9.1 The finish line will be between the orange flag on the committee boat and the nearby mark.

The finish line mark may be moved in closer to the committee boat to facilitate finishing.

10. TIME LIMITS

10.1 One (1) hour for each class.

11. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

11.1 A boat desiring to protest must notify the other contestants involved. The protesting boat shall notify the RC boat at the finish line and receive acknowledgment. A written protest must be filed with the Race Committee within 30 minutes after the committee boat returns to the dock. Time and location of protest meetings will be announced.

12. SCORING

12.1 The Low Point Scoring System will apply. Three or more races are scheduled, of which 1 race shall be completed to constitute a series. If 5 or more races are completed a boat's worst score will be excluded from her series score.


13. PRIZES

13.1 Awards will presented at the pizza party after the day's racing has concluded.

14. SAFETY AND DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 14.1 Competitors participate in the race series entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the series.
- 14.2 Competitors shall wear USCG approved Type III Personal Flotation Devices (PFDs) at all times while afloat, except for brief periods while changing. Floatation aids (Zhik, Baltic) are not permitted to be worn by competitors.
- 14.3 Coaches shall wear USCG approved Personal Flotation Devices (PFDs) at all times while afloat, except for brief periods while changing.
- 14.4 Failure to comply with 14.2 shall be grounds for disqualification from all races sailed in violation of those instructions.
- 14.5 Failure of a coach to comply with 14.3 shall be grounds for a penalty imposed by the protest committee up to and including disqualification of all sailors associated with his / her club from all races sailed.
- 14.6 Boats are required to sail by the Race Committee boat and check-in prior to first race. A boat that retires from a race shall notify the RC or Markboat ASAP.
