

2019-2020 Chili Midwinter Series Sailing Instructions

Race Dates: November 3rd, December 1st, January 5th, February 2nd, March 1st.

First Warning Signal each race day at 1200 hours

- 1. RULES: The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 2. SAFETY: Boats shall not impede the passage of a vessel which can safely navigate only within a narrow channel or fairway, (see US Dept. of Commerce chart 18649 for designated narrow channels and fairways of SF Bay) or fishing or other vessel with restricted ability to maneuver. Boats identified by sail number who endanger their own safety or that of the commercial or government vessel will be subject to protest by the race committee or a contestant and face possible disqualification. A protest for allegations of the above will be heard by a protest committee whether or not the requirements of RRS61.1 (a) & (b) have been fulfilled or exclusions referenced in RRS 60.2(a) have been met. A DSQ for a safety violation shall be considered as disqualification not excludable (DNE)
 - a) Propulsion: To comply with this section and to avoid impeding such a vessel, a competitor may utilize auxiliary power without being obligated to retire (in accordance with RRS 42.3(h)) for only as long as required to clear a channel expeditiously. In so doing, she shall notify the race committee as soon as possible. She shall then be subjected to a scoring penalty of 2 places worse than she would have received, however she shall not be scored worse than Did Not Finish.
 - b) Personal safety is the responsibility of each individual while racing. While wearing a personal flotation device (PFD) is not a requirement of this regatta, it is encouraged. For any particular race in the Series, the race committee may fly the Y Flag which indicates a PFD is required to be worn by all racers.
- 3. ENTRIES: Entry is open to all yachts with a valid PHRF certificate and one design fleets with five (this may be amended by the race committee) or more entries. PHRF entries may enter in a Spinnaker or Non-Spinnaker fleet. The division in which a yacht first starts shall not be changed during the series. Should a yacht not submit a PHRF certificate, a handicap number will be assigned by the race committee.
- 4. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS: Notices to competitors or changes to the sailing instructions will be posted on the official notice board at the SYC clubhouse. Notices shall not be posted later than 2000 hours on the day before it will take effect. Notices to competitors may also be posted on the website, but the official notice board shall prevail.
- 5. SCHEDULE OF RACES: One race will be run per day. Races abandoned due to conditions on the race course may be rescheduled with a notice to competitors advising of a two-race day.

- 6. COURSES: Courses are described in Appendix A of these instructions.
- 7. ON THE WATER COMMUNICATIONS: RRS 25 is amended to allow for on-the-water radio communications between the race committee and racing boats on VHF channel 72. The race committee may communicate OCS and the signaled course for the race. The inability of a competitor to hear a hail for over early or any other information shall not relieve her of her responsibility, nor shall it be grounds for redress. RRS 90.2(c) is amended to allow oral changes to the Sailing Instructions on the water. In the event the race committee needs to communicate oral changes, they shall raise the "L" flag and attempt to hail competitors on VHF channel 72.
- 8. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE: Signals made ashore will be displayed from the main flagpole at the SYC clubhouse deck. If a postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 1 hour after the AP flag is lowered.
- RACING AREA COURSES AND MARKS: The intended racing venue is the Knox/Yellow Bluff area. Temporary (dropped) mark courses and courses using fixed government marks will be used. Courses will be optimized for prevailing conditions. See Course Descriptions – Appendix A to these Sailing Instructions. Courses will be indicated using a numeric code flag on the race committee signal boat.
- 10. START AND FINISH LINE: The start and finish line will be between a staff displaying an Orange Flag on the race committee signal boat and the course side of an inflatable mark.
- 11. RESTRICTED START FINISH LINE: The Start & Finish line is restricted. After the first leg, a boat shall not pass through the Start line. A boat shall not cross the Finish line until she is completing the last leg of the course. A boat violating this restriction shall retire immediately and be scored DNF.

12. RESTRICTED AREAS

For the purpose of RRS 18, 19, 28, the following objects shall be left to shoreward: Anita Rock and any buoy marking same, vertical 'H' beam off Water Quality Control Plant west of StFYC, bell buoy 7 off the west end of Alcatraz, and Point Blunt buoy off Angel Island. Above obstructions are not marks of the course. The South Tower of the Golden Gate Bridge must be left to the South at all times. Any rocks visible at Mean Lower Low water immediately adjacent to Contra Costa County, Marin County or San Francisco shorelines shall be left to shoreward, except for Mile Rock, The Brothers and Red Rock.


- 13. TIME LIMIT: The time limit for all races will be 1600 hours for all boats. Boats finishing after this time limit shall be scored DNF. This modifies Rule 35.
- 14. PROTESTS: Written protests shall be submitted to the PRO on an official USSA form. Protests must be received within one hour of the time the Signal Boat ties up at the SYC dock. Protests shall be heard the 1st Thursday, 7 p.m., after the filing deadline. Pending protests will be posted on the SYC official notice board.
- 15. SCORING: The series will be scored as a series longer than a Regatta. A minimum of one race shall be completed to constitute a Series. If five races are completed, a boat's worst score shall be excluded each for the Series. If less than five races are completed, the scores for all races will constitute the series score. This modifies RRS Appendix A2. "Time on Time" scoring will be used for PHRF divisions.
- 16. CHECK-IN & RETIRE: All boats shall show their sail number to the race committee by sailing past the committee boat, on starboard tack, prior to the first warning signal. A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.
- 17. PRIZES: Prizes will be awarded at the SYC Clubhouse at the conclusion of racing each day. 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place prizes will be awarded for each division. Series Trophies for the Midwinter Series will be awarded after the completion of the series. Series Trophies and the Winter Series Perpetual Trophy will be presented after the final race of the season.
- 18. SCORING DISCREPANCIES: Any Scoring discrepancies must be reported on the Scoring Discrepancy form, available from the club office.

6	YRA Mark 6, "Ft. Mason" 200 Yards N of Ft. Mason (may be replaced by inflatable)
8	R "4" FI Red 4 sec Horn 1.0 nm E of Pt. Blunt, Angel Island
12	G "1" FI G 4 sec - "Little Harding"
15	Inflatable mark located approximately .5 nm NE of Yellow Bluff
16	YRA Mark 16, known as "Blackaller" .5 nm east of Ft. Point
17	RG "HR" FL (2+1) R 6 sec "Harding Rock"
18	GR "BR" FI (2+1) G 6s Bell "Blossom Rock" .9 nm ESE of Alcatraz Island
