NOTICE OF RACE

The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the NoR means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2. The prescriptions of Sail Canada will apply and they can be viewed at https://www.sailing.ca/uploads/2019/09/RRS_2017_2020_Sail_Canada_P rescription Final EN.pdf
- 1.3. The regatta will be sailed in boats of J/22 International Class.
- 1.4. The J/22 International Class Association rules will apply http://www.j22.org/wp-content/uploads/2013/02/2013ClassRules.pdf
- 1.5. Appendix T of the RRS will apply.
- 1.6. If there is a conflict between languages, the English text will take precedence.
- 1.7. Boats may be required to display identification numbers for the duration of the event chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies [DP].

2. ADVERTISING

2.1. Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies [DP].

3. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 3.1. The regatta is open to teams of at least three women who satisfy the requirements of rule 75. For Canadian teams', the person--in--charge must satisfy the Canadian prescription rule 46.
- 3.2. Teams enter by completing the entry form and paying the required registration fees at https://www.regattanetwork.com/clubmgmt/applet_registration_form.php?regatta_id=20336

4. FEES

- 4.1. Registration fees for all entries are \$295 CAD per team, for teams of up to three (3) sailors. Each additional sailor above the included three shall be charged \$95 dollars each.
- 4.2. Fees include coaching by J/22 Expert Coach on October 1st, daily debriefings after training and racing by J/22 Expert Coach on October 2nd & 3rd, 3 days of course racing, Friday night cocktail party with Saturday night dinner and event regalia.

5. CHARTER/LOANER J/22 BOATS

- 5.1. Teams that require a charter/loaner boat must request it on the entry form.
- 5.2. Charter/loaner boats will be allocated on a first-come-first-served basis.
- 5.3. Competitors may bring their own sails and any other racing equipment.

 Any sails and equipment brought shall meet class rules and are not covered under the charter/loaner boat insurance.
- 5.4. Charter/ loaner boats may not be modified without the approval of the owner or owner's representative. Equipment must remain in position as per class rules.

6.2. A maximum of four (4) races may be sailed in any one day, at the discretion of the CRO

7. MEASUREMENT

- 7.1. No fundamental measuring will be done on the regatta site during registration days unless this is agreed upon between a competitor and a measurer. In this case, the Organizing Authority is not a part of the agreement and cannot be held responsible for anything regarding this agreement.
- 7.2. Boats may be subject to further inspections at any time during the regatta.

 Additional measurement checks may be conducted during the regatta at the discretion of the technical committee.
- 7.3. Boats shall have appropriate lifting apparatus for launching and haul out.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions (SIs) will be posted at https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/20336 and on the official HYC notice board. Copies will be available after 1800 on Wednesday, September 30 at the registration desk.

9. SAILING VENUE

Racing will be located on Lake of Two Mountains, near the opening of HYC's harbour, in Hudson, Québec.

10. COURSE

Course racing will be windward -- leeward races around inflatable marks.

11. PENALTY SYSTEM

A boat that has taken a penalty or retired under rule 31 or 44.1 shall complete an acknowledgment form at the protest desk within the protest time limit.

12. SCORING

- 12.1. Three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a championship.
- 12.2. When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of races scored.
- 12.3. When six (6) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 12.4. A maximum of ten (10) races will be scored.

13. SUPPORT BOATS

No personal support boats are allowed.

14. BERTHING

Boats will be kept in their assigned places while in the harbour. [DP]

15. HAUL-OUT RESTRICTION

Boats will not be hauled out during the regatta except with the written permission of the race committee. [DP]

16. DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools shall not be used around boats between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the regatta. [DP]

17. RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communications that are not available to all boats. [DP]

18. PRIZES

- 18.1. Prizes will be awarded to the first three boats.
- 18.2. The team with the best overall score will be declared the 2020 Sail Canada Women's Keelboat Champion and be awarded the Sail Canada Trophy.
- 18.3. Additional awards may be presented.

19. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

20. INSURANCE

Each participant shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$1,000,000 CAD per-incident or equivalent. A copy of the insurance certificate will be required by the Organizing Committee prior to the event.
