Sailing Instructions

- RULES:** The races will be governed by the "Racing Rules of Sailing "2017 - 2020" the prescriptions of the United States Sailing Association, except as any of these are changed by the sailing instructions. **All single-handed sailors shall wear a life jacket at all times.** Handicapping will be done using the PHRF system based upon handicaps determined by the BBYC Handicap Committee.
- NOTICES TO COMPETITORS** will be posted on the official notice board located inside the yacht club.
- CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS:** will be posted on the official notice board located inside the yacht club. Any change will be posted 30 minutes before the start of the race in which it will take effect, and shall be posted only by the race committee chairperson or officer of the club.
- SIGNALS MADE ASHORE** will be flown from the crow's nest of the club.
- SCHEDULE OF RACES:** June 14, June 28, July 12, July 26, Aug 9, Aug 23, Sept 13 1st Warning Signal 1300 hours
- RACING AREA** will be within Bellport Bay.
- SHORTEN COURSE** will be signaled by 2 sound signals and the raising of code flag "S" (BLUE SQUARE ON WHITE FIELD) at the START/FINISH Line. This Changes RRS 32.2 (b).
- MARKS:**
BBYC MARKS A, B, and H are ORANGE AND WHITE BARRELS.
Government Marks:
R #6 = Mark C
R #4 = Mark D
R #12 = Mark E
FLG #1 = Mark F
- START:** Races will be started by using RRS 26.
- START AND FINISH LINE:**
 - The start and finish lines for all yachts will be between buoy "A" and the "orange cylinder" on the dock in front of the yacht club. In this case the signals will be on the club porch and or crow's nest.
 - Or the start line will be between the "RC flag" on the RC boat and then the pin end will be a "red ball" and the signals will be on the RC boat. The RC boat may be the club's whaler.
 - In both cases, letters corresponding to those on the Course Chart will signal the course. Marks must be turned in the order signaled and rounded on the side indicated by the color of the letter posted.

11. RECALLS:

11.1 GENERAL RECALLS will be signaled by 2 sound signals and the raising of code flag "First Substitute" (**BLUE AND YELLOW PENNANT**). Code flag "First Substitute" will be lowered 1 minute before the next start sequence.

11.2 INDIVIDUAL RECALLS will be signaled by 1 sound signal and the raising of code flag "X" (**BLUE CROSS ON WHITE FIELD**) for one or more yachts recalled. Code "X" will be lowered when the recalled yachts are clear.

12. TIME LIMIT: 1 3/4 hours for the first boat to finish. Any boat not finished after **2 1/4 hours** will be scored as TLE – Time Limit Expired.

13. PROTESTS AND REDRESS: Competitors shall notify the Race Committee of their intent to protest at the end of the race.

13.1 Protests and requests for redress shall be written on forms located in the RC box, which is in the kitchen and lodged within 30 minutes after the end of the race.

13.2 Notice of Protest Hearings will be posted on the Official Bulletin Board and Hearings will be scheduled as soon as possible.

14. WITHDRAWAL: In order to account for all starters, a yacht withdrawing shall make every effort to report to the Race Committee as soon as possible.

15. SCORING: The Low Point Scoring System, Appendix A2 and A9 of the racing rules will apply. No series score will be calculated for any yacht not registered, or any yacht not displaying proper sail numbers.

16. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY: Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race. The Bellport Bay Yacht Club, Officers, and Members will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
