

2020 Rochester Yacht Club One Design Regatta Notice of Race

RYC One Design Lambert Lai Memorial Regatta



1.1 The racing will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017 – 2020, (RRS) including the prescriptions of U.S. Sailing.

1.2 The same crews and four class sails must be used the entire regatta. There can be substitutions only by prior approval and with written permission from the jury.

1.3 RRS 49.2 will be changed such that no member of the crew shall station any part of his/her torso outside the upper lifeline other than temporarily.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

2.1 This NOR applies to the J/24, C&C 29, and Ideal 18 Classes.

2.2 Competitors must meet all ownership and class membership requirements. Eligible boats may enter and submit registration fees online at Regatta Network.

2.3 All boats are required to have a minimum of \$300,000(USD) marine liability insurance covering the person in charge.

3 FEES

3.1 The registered skipper/owner/charterer shall have paid, the applicable boat registration fee and event Entry Fee for corresponding classes.

3.2 The Entry Fee will vary depending on class and includes launching and haul out, trailer storage. Includes Saturday night dinner. The entry fee will be refunded in full if you cannot attend.

C&C29: \$125 J24: \$125 Ideal 18: \$60

3.3 Entry fees may be paid online by completing details on Entry Form. Entries will not be valid until payment is received and confirmed by the OA.

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5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

5.1 The 2020 RYC One Design Regatta Sailing Instructions will be published on the RYC web site (Offshore/Regattas/2020 Regattas/RYC One Design Regatta)

6 RACING AREA

6.1The approximate location of the race area will be: 1nm ENE of the Summerville Pier for C&C29, Ideal 18 and J24 Fleets. Junior classes will be determined at the discretion of the Junior Sail Director.

7 RACE COURSES

7.1 Attachment #1 of the Sailing Instructions shows the course configurations, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

7.2 All fleet courses to be sailed will be windward-leeward configuration with fleet racing. Spreader/offset marks and leeward gates may be used.

8 MEASUREMENTS

8.1 All official J24 participants are subject to inspection and measurement at any time during the regatta

8.2 J24 boats shall be prepared to present a fully completed and compliant Part D Class Measurement and Inventory of Required & Optional Equipment forms

8.3 All sails shall be measured prior to the event, inspection of class and measurement stamps may be performed at any time for J24 Fleets.

8.4 Boat measurement will NOT be offered without making a prior appointment with a class measurer.

8.5 There will be NO crew weigh in.

9 PENALTY SYSTEM

9.1 The penalty system will be defined in the SIs.

10 SCORING

10.1 The scoring system is described in Attachment #3 of the Sailing Instructions.

10.2 The low point scoring system RRS Appendix A will be used modified such that all completed races will be scored; no throw outs. This modifies A2.

10.3 The OA intends to run as many races as possible.

10.4 A minimum of two races will constitute a regatta.

11 SUPPORT BOATS

11.1 Support boats shall be marked with a yellow flag for C&C29, J24, and Ideal 18 Fleets.

11.2 Support boats shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the warning signal for the first start until all boats have finished or the Race Committee signals a postponement or abandonment, unless instructed otherwise by the Race Committee.

12 BERTHING/LAUNCHING/HAULING

12.1 Launching and hauling will be from the RYC East Basin.

12.2 Two hoists will be available for use as well as a gin pole.

12.3 Haul out order will be on the registration order of visiting boats then followed by RYC members.

12.4 All boats are to remain in their assigned berthing area in the RYC east basin.



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12.5 All boats must be in the water by 0800 Saturday, August 29th, 2020.

13 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

13.1 C&C29 and J24 boats shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee. All other fleets shall be hauled out.

14 DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

14.1 Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around boats between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the regatta.

15 RADIO COMMUNICATION

15.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones. The RC will announce the VHF channel it intends to use for the regatta at the skippers meeting.

15.2 Failure to make announcements or failure of a competitor to receive them shall not be grounds for redress.

16 PRIZES

16.1 Prizes will be given to the top 3 boats of registered competitors for the Great Lakes Regatta. Daily prizes may also be given.

17 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

17.1 Competitors participate in these races entirely at their own risk. See RRS rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after a race, series or regatta.

17.2 Entry form responsibility disclaimer and liability acceptance clause, duly filled out and signed competitors may be required to sign a boat registration and liability release form before the close of registration.

18 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$300,000 USD per event or the equivalent. All participants must provide proof of insurance at registration.

19 COVID-19 REGATTA SAFETY PLAN

This plan includes but is not limited to the following considerations:

1. All participants and regatta personnel will maintain social distancing where applicable and use face coverings when less than six feet apart, except while eating when seated.

2. The following screening questionnaire will be completed by all regatta participants at registration.

3. Appropriate hygiene and cleaning will be applied to all vessels and equipment.

4. Competitor vessels must space out from other competitor vessels when docking, launching and hauling out.

5. All persons serving or picking up food and beverages at any time will wear face coverings.



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Screening Questionnaire: Prior to participating in the J/24 regatta, all individuals must be able to answer NO to all of the following questions:

1) In the last 14 days have you tested positive for COVID-19?

2) In the last 14 days, have you had any of the following symptoms that you cannot attribute to another health condition?

- Fever (100.4°F or higher), or feeling feverish
- Chills
- A new cough
- Shortness of breath
- A new sore throat
- New muscle aches
- New headache
- New loss of smell or taste

3) In the last 14 days, have you been in close or proximate contact with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or who has or had symptoms of COVID-19?
