SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*(RRS).
- 1.2 In the event of a conflict between the *Notice of Race* and the *Sailing Instructions*, the *Sailing Instructions* take precedence. This changes RRS 63.7.
- 1.3 All boats shall be in compliance with their respective class rules.

2 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCITONS

2.1 Any changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted on the official bulletin board no later than 0945 on race day.

3 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official bulletin board located in the first floor of the Tred Avon Yacht Club (TAYC).

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the signal mast on TAYC's upper deck.
- 4.2 When flag "AP" is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 45 minutes" in Race Signal AP.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 0945 Competitors' Meeting on the first floor of the TAYC clubhouse.
- 5.2 1045 Warning signal for the first class.
- 5.3 As many races as possible will be sailed, but no race will start after 1430.

6 CLASS FLAGS

- 6.1 The Race Committee signal boat will display the class flag of the next class to start no later than its warning signal.
- 6.2 The class flags will be the class insignia on a white background.

7 RACING AREAS

7.1 The racing area will be the Tred Avon River generally in the area S/SW of the TAYC clubhouse and N of Foxhole Creek to the west and Bachelor Pt. to the east.

8 THE COURSES

- 8.1 The attached diagrams (page 4) show several courses with corresponding course letters.
- 8.2 No later than the warning signal, the Race Committee will display the course letter and the approximate distance in nautical miles. In addition, for courses "P" and "T", the number of laps will be displayed.
- 8.3 For courses "P" and "T", boats may NOT sail through the start/finish line when not starting or finishing.

- 8.4 Courses may be shortened by the Race Committee at any mark.
- 8.5 Boats that have finished a race must keep clear of boats in another class that are still racing.

9 MARKS

- 9.1 The starting/finishing mark will be an orange ball.
- 9.2 The windward, wing and leeward marks will be orange balls.
- 9.3 A Race Committee starting or finishing boat may set a stand-off buoy, which buoy, the line attaching it to the race committee boat and the race committee boat are all part of the starting and finishing mark.

10 THE START

- 10.1 Races will be started using horn signals and the three (3) minute Audible-Signal Racing System described in RRS Appendix U. This replaces RRS 26.
- 10.2 A series of short attention sounds will be used for each class to alert competitors of the Race Committee's intention to sound the warning signal.
- 10.3 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee signal boat and the course side of the starting mark to port.
- 10.4 A boat crossing the starting line later than 3 minutes after her starting signal will be scored "DNS" without a hearing. This changes RRS A4 and A5.
- 10.5 For individual recalls, the Race Committee will attempt to hail OCS boats, but the failure to hail, the hail of some but not all OCS boats, the order in which hailed or untimely hailing of boats shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

11 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

11.1 A change of the next leg of the course will be accomplished in accordance with RRS 33.

12 THE FINISH

12.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the Race Committee signal boat and the course side of an orange ball to port of the signal boat (i.e. the starting pin). This changes the finishing line as it appears in the attached course diagrams.

13 TIME LIMITS

- 13.1 The time limit for the first boat in each class to finish will be one (1) hour.
- 13.2 All other boats must finish within 15 minutes of the first boat in her class or be scored "DNF".

14 PROTEST AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 14.1 The protesting boat must satisfy the requirements of RRS 61.1a.
- 14.2 A written protest or request for redress must be filed with the PRO or a member of the Protest Committee within one hour after the Race Committee finishing boat returns to the dock. Docking time will be posted on the official bulletin board. Protest forms are available in the clubhouse.
- 14.3 The time and location of protest hearings will be posted on the official bulletin board.

15 SCORING

- 15.1 One race must be completed to constitute the regatta.
- 15.2 If five (5) or more races are completed, a boat's worst score will be excluded from her total score, subject to RRS 90.3(b).

16 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 16.1 A boat that retires or leaves the racing area between races shall notify the Race Committee at the first reasonable opportunity.
- 16.2 Competitors are strongly encouraged to wear a USCG approved PFD while racing.

17 SPECIAL COVID-19 REGATTA RULES



18.1 Trophies will be awarded as stated in the NOR.
