SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. RULES
 - This race is governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing 2009-2012 and these sailing instructions.
- 1.1 This is an **inverted start race**. Start times will be published at 1030, and will be available on Channel 69 as well.
- 1.2 PHRF **Random Leg Course** handicaps are the values used. Scoring will be RLC non-spin, with the offset included.
- 2. ENTRIES
- 2.1 Entry is open to members of all yacht clubs and sailing associations recognized by US Sailing. Entry may be done at http://race.coronadoyc.org only. Entry closes on August 20, 2011 at 1700.
- 2.2 Boats that have a LOA of at least 20 feet and a CYCHF or PHRF RLC rating are eligible to race.
- 2.3 There are four classes, 1, 2, 3 and 4, and while they may elect to use spinnaker, the default position is that they will not.
- 2.4 Classes 1 and 2 use PHRF RLC non-spinnaker ratings, unless spinnaker use is intended.
- 2.5 Class 3 is boats using CYC Handicap ratings. Ratings can be obtained by contacting the CYC Handicap Chairman, Steve Greatrex 619-429-4959. Current CYC Handicaps are posted in the blue book at the front desk, if none, use your boat's arbitrary PHRF RLC non-spinnaker rating. Any Class 3 boat that intends to use spinnaker shall subtract the spinnaker offset already incorporated.
- 3. SPECIAL RULES
- 3.1 There will be exactly two persons embarked in each boat, the competitor and a safety observer (SO).
- This race is sailed under the honor system. The results of the skipper's sailing, place in the race, should be the same whether a Olympian or a total neophyte acts as SO, since the SO acts only in the interest of saving lives, not reputations. Running aground, for instance, would not be on the list of events prevented by the SO. SO's, ideally, should sit in a weightneutral spot, keep their head on a swivel, note everything, but say nothing. This is a test of the skills of the skipper. The time for advice to the single-handed skipper was BEFORE the race.
- 4. Notices to Competitors

Notices will be posted on the official message board located on the porch.

5. Changes in Sailing Instructions

Any change to these sailing instructions will be posted before 1030 on race day.

6. Schedule of Race. This race uses an INVERTED START. Entry closes at 1000. All boats will be given their own start time, available at the front desk and on channel 69 after 1115.

7. The Course

- 7.1 The course length is 7.86 nautical miles.
- 7.2 The order of the race is:

(1) StartCYC	(4) GB1S	(7) SD30P	(10) DiverS
(2) DiverP	(5) SD30S	(8) GB1P	(11) FinishCYC
(3) GB8P	(6) A-markP	(9) GB8S	

7.3 Round marks followed by **P** to port and marks followed by **S** to starboard.

8. The Start, Marks, and Finish

- 8.1 The start and finish lines lie between a buoyed pole displaying an orange flag and a red and white striped pier piling at the end of slip B-14. The piling is the starboard end of the start line and port end of the finish line.
- 8.2 GB (n) and SD (n) are Glorietta Bay and San Diego Bay channel buoys.
- 8.3 **A**-mark is an orange tetrahedron located 1 nm, 240 degrees magnetic from SD 30 (about 32° 40' 00" N, 117° 09' 00" W.
- 8.4 Diver is an orange tetrahedron in the Northwest corner of Glorietta Bay near the Boathouse restaurant.

9. Time Limit

- 9.1 There is no time limit.
- 9.2 Boats failing to finish within 2 hours after the first boat finishes will be scored **DNF**.

10. Protests

Protests will be written on forms available at the club office and lodged there within 30 minutes after the finish of the protesting boat. Arbitration may be used if agreeable to both parties to the protest.

11. Retirement

A boat that retires from a race is requested to notify the race committee prior to leaving the area or, if that is not possible, immediately after arriving ashore.
