

# The 83rd Annual SCYA Midwinter Regatta Notice of Race February 18 & 19, 2012\*

#### 1.0 RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing, 2009-2012 ("RRS").

#### 2.0 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 Each entrant must be a member of a yacht club or sailing association belonging to the Southern California Yachting Association (SCYA), US SAILING, the Southern California Cruiser Association (SCCA), or the American Model Yacht Association (ACMYA).
- 2.2 Participating classes are listed in this Notice and include handicap, one-design, model boat and predicted log. Classes not listed may apply to the SCYA Midwinter Chairman for assignment to a host club. Three entries are required to establish a class. All entrants must be current members of the fleet in which they race. Out of the area boats may obtain a guest handicap certificate from PHRF of Southern California by calling 562-438-6712.
- 2.3 Boats competing in this regatta shall use the ratings applicable to the individual host yacht club's venue where they race.
- 2.4 Entries can be mailed to the host yacht club, hand delivered there, or submitted on-line if the host yacht club so provides, before the entry deadline specified by each host yacht club. Host model yacht clubs may use their own entry forms.
- 2.5 One-design classes are requested to have an official representative at each host club before or during registration to resolve any issue relating to that class.

### Tips to have more fun when racing out of Coronado Yacht Club

We want all of our regatta competitors to have a good time at our club. However, we also need to minimize the impact of our regattas on our non-racing members. Please read these tips to make the most of your yacht racing experience.

**REGISTRATION:** Registration for all racing at Coronado Yacht Club is done exclusively online at http://race.coronadoyc.org.

**DIRECTIONS**: The Coronado Yacht Club (CYC) is located at 1631 Strand Way in Coronado, California. Just get on the FIVE and take the California Highway 75-Coronado Bridge Exit and cross the famous Coronado Bridge. Stay in the left lane and turn left at the first light at Orange Avenue. Turn left on Tenth Street and go all the way down the hill to the stop sign. You will see the entrance to the club to your right. Turn right. From the water, cruise South through San Diego Bay taking Pier 18 of the Coronado Bridge to Starboard, turn to South West into Glorietta Bay. Mind the orange range markers as you enter Glorietta Bay. Take buoy 8 to Starboard and you will see CYC at the end of Glorietta Bay. The guest dock is directly in front of the clubhouse. The dinghy dock is located to Starboard as you approach the clubhouse.

**PARKING**: Car parking is never available on site for non-club members as we have limited parking. On regatta days you may drop off your trailers in the assigned areas and then park your vehicles either on the street or in the public lot immediately South West of the clubhouse. **Violators will be towed**. There is plenty of public parking near CYC.

**ACCESS TO GROUNDS**: The CYC grounds are gated. The drive-through gate is open but monitored on a fixed schedule on race days. Gates are closed at night. The pedestrian gate can be accessed by competitors during office/bar hours by using the buzzer at the pedestrian gate. Reciprocal yacht club members can get a key for access to the grounds and showers with a \$25 deposit.

**CLUBHOUSE ACCESS**: Competitors are welcome to use our clubhouse, shower facilities and snack bar. Yachting attire with shoes is allowed, however, wet clothing and bathing suits are not. If you are wet, please walk around to the South West door by the Junior Office to access the showers and DO NOT walk through the clubhouse. Appropriately aged competitors are welcome to enjoy our incredibly inexpensive and friendly bar. Those under age 21 are not allowed in the bar area.

**BERTHING - ASHORE AND AFLOAT**: The grass area between the CYC clubhouse and hoist is reserved for MOTH nesting. SNIPE trailers will be stored in the Western gravel area. Flying Tigers are to raft up at the guest dock in front of the clubhouse. Regatta participants are welcome from Thursday through Monday. However, visiting Skippers from our reciprocal yacht clubs can contact our office for access to our slips and/or dry boat storage on a first-come/first-served basis. Be ready to show your yacht club card, registration and insurance information.

**HOIST**: Due to liability concerns, only a properly trained CYC member can unlock the hoists. On Regatta days, hoists will be open on a fixed schedule. If you are early arriving and/or late leaving a Regatta, you will need to coordinate with the Dock Master for hoist access. While we try to be accommodating, poor planning on your part does not constitute an emergency on our part!

**RACING VENUE**: We are very proud of our South San Diego Bay racing venue. You can expect mostly flat water and no kelp. It is a three to four mile trip to the race courses. The Race Committee (RC) does not provide a tow boat. While the minimum depth on the course during the regatta should not be a factor for boats with less than a nine foot draft, there are a number of shallow areas between CYC and the race courses. A San Diego Bay nautical chart is located on the wall in the CYC bar.

**ICE**: Ice can be purchased from the office or from the bar when the office is closed.

**FUEL**: Fuel is not available near CYC. The nearest marine fuel dock is at the West end of Harbor Island on San Diego Bay.

**DINING**: Racers are welcome at our snack bar and in our dining room. California casual is appropriate attire for the dining room.
