NOTICE OF RACE

1. **RULES**

The regatta will be governed by the 2013-2017 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the prescriptions of US SAILING, the rules of the Laser Radial, Laser 4.7, Club 420, Sunfish, , and Optimist classes and by the Sailing Instructions.

2. **ALCOHOL & DRUGS**

No contestant shall use, either on or off the water, alcoholic beverages (beer, wine, distilled spirits) or use any controlled substance (marijuana, cocaine, etc.), the possession of which is unlawful. This regulation is in effect during the entire event, from date and time of arrival through date and time of departure.

A hearing will be held in accord with the recommendations of Appendix P of the RRS. Penalties for a violation of the regulation may range from a reprimand to dismissal from the regatta. Additionally, the hearing officers may recommend further action under rule 69. The officers for hearing a violation of US SAILING Regulation 5.03 will consist of the Chief Judge, acting as chairman of the hearing, the jury, and the Regatta Chairman.

3. **ALTERATIONS OF CLASS RULES**

The class rules will be used except that RRS 60.1 (a) is changed to prohibit a boat from protesting another boat for an alleged breach of a class rule requiring class membership.

ADVERTISING 4.

Advertising is in accordance with ISAF advertising code and relevant class rules.

5. **CLASSES**

Laser Radial, Laser 4.7, Club 420, Sunfish, and Optimist classes will be used. A minimum of 10 boats is required to be registered by July 16 to constitute a class. If there are not enough sailors registered for the Laser 4.7 fleets by July 16th, sailors will have the opportunity to move to the Laser Radial fleet or withdraw from the regatta.

6. **COURSE AREA**

There will be four courses. Alpha course will be the course area farthest to the east in the mouth of the River. Bravo will be just to the west of Alpha. Courses Charlie and Delta will be in the Toms River with Delta to be located to the west of Charlie. The RC reserves the right to move the courses to a different location at their discretion after proper flag signals are displayed.

Note: All Sunfish to launch from Pine Beach YC. .

7. **ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY**

AGE-Applicants must be at least 8 years old and not 19 by the first day of the regatta

OPTIMIST FLEET - Optimists sailors will have the option to decide whether to sail in the Gold (advanced sailor) or Silver (intermediate) fleets. Note: Any sailor in the top 20 from the 2013 Opti Silver fleet overall standings is encouraged to move up to the Gold.

OPTIMIST DIVISION- Optimists will be automatically separated into the appropriate division- White-10 or under, Blue-12 or under, Red-15 or under (by day of regatta).

Note: There is NO GREEN fleet - No Beginners please.

8 **US SAILING MEMBERSHIP**

Youth (\$25) or Family (\$90) membership in US SAILING is required for each sailor (helmsman and crew for doublehanded classes). You will need the junior sailor's US Sailing membership # (not the parent's) before registering for the Junior Olympics online. Family members may request individual membership cards for each child by calling the US SAILING membership office: 1-800-US-SAIL-1 or going to www.usailing.org web site and following directions. IHYC will NOT be taking any US Sailing registrations.

9 APPLICATION

Application shall be made by registering online at the IHYC.com web site. You will need a credit card to pay the registration fees. Once registration reaches the class limit registration will close for those classes and a wait list established. Opti Gold-100; Opti silver-100; 420- 50, all Lasers-75; Sunfish-open

FEES 10.

The entry fee is \$105 per boat for single-handed classes and \$210 for double-handed classes if registered online by midnight July 18. The entry fee includes give-away items, a clinic on Sunday, breakfast & lunch on Monday & Tuesday, dinner & entertainment Monday night, and trophies.

Note: Registration on July 16 or after will pay a \$25.00 late fee

Note: You CANNOT change fleets, once registered. Make sure you register for the correct fleet! (i.e.-No switching from Gold to Silver fleets!)

14. **MEASUREMENT**

All sailors will be responsible for their boats being in compliance with the class rules.

15 **INSPECTION**

There may be inspection at the end of each race at the discretion of the RC. Each yacht is to have all safety equipment as specified in the class rules. Failure to have such equipment is grounds for disqualification from that race. NOTE: US Coast Guard Approved Lifejackets only!

16. **SCORING**

The Low-Point Scoring System, Appendix A of the racing rules, will apply for all classes. A maximum of 8 races is scheduled. For purposes of awarding prizes one race will constitute a series. There will be one drop allowed if 5 or more races are completed. Scores will be posted on the IHYC web site www.ihyc.com

17. PRIZES

USA Junior Olympic medals will be awarded to competitors placing first through ten in all classes/divisions except for the Sunfish and Laser Radial Female classes who will be awarded medals to the top five places. There will also be keeper awards for the top three places in all classes/divisions, if there are 10 competitors. The Optimist classes will have separate scoring divisions for white, blue and red divisions within Gold & Silver fleets, as well as overall prizes. There will be a woman's division in the Laser Radial fleet as well as being counted in the overall standings.

The Martin Trophy will be awarded to the yacht club, having a minimum of five entries, which has the most sailors placing first, second or third, in overall scoring.

The Egee-Duff Sportsmanship Trophy will be awarded to the sailor that best represents the ideal of competing hard but fairly, with respect for his or her competitors, while having fun.

18. **HOUSING**

There is housing available to sailors coming from out of the Toms River area. The housing form is at www.ihyc.com. Email_the housing form to Suzanne Smith at suzannehsmith@comcast.net. Housing is provided on a first come, first serve basis. Requests for housing must be received by July17. you must confirm with Suzanne one week prior or risk not having housing provided! Please, bring your own towels. Sailors MUST be 12 or older to receive housing.

There is a Holiday Inn and a Comfort Inn in Toms River and some bed & breakfasts in town. Check the Internet for more information.

19. **PARKING**

All parking is on public streets. Please drop off boat(s) in the designated areas and park legally. There are no parking meters. However, observe local parking restrictions as the local police do issue tickets for illegal parking next to yellow curbs. See attached parking - boat storage plan.

20. BOAT LAUNCHING & STORAGE

420's shall have first priority at IHYC due to limited hoist facilities. Several property owners have given permission to store boats overnight starting on Sunday. When leaving, please remember to clean up the area and thank the property owner. If you plan to use the Toms River Yacht club facilities, you must get permission ahead of time from TRYC. The Town of Island Heights boat ramp will be open if you need to launch a motorboat. All Sunfish will launch out of Pine Beach YC. DO NOT use TRYC facilities as they have no room due to hosting another regatta!

21. LUNCHES

Lunches will be provided to all contestants and 2 coaches per club/course. Monday's lunch will be served on the water for all sailors. Tuesday's lunch is on shore after arrival back at the club. Coaches should register online to receive a lunch.

 MONDAY NIGHT ACTIVITIES DINNER- There will be dinner for all sailors. Dinners can be purchased by parents.

ENTERTAINMENT - There will be chaperoned entertainment for all sailors from 6:30-9:30 in the club There will also be a door raffle of sailing items!

23. SPECTATING BOATS

Parents and friends should try to arrange to go out with other spectator craft on their own or bring their own boat. We will try to have a large spectator boat for parents/coaches to go out on. If so, you will need to bring your own lunch and drinks.

25. **COACHING**

Coaches (not parents) must register online prior to the regatta and upstairs at the coaches' registration desk to get lunch. Lunches will be provided at registration for only 2 coaches per course from a club. Bring a cooler. Coach boats are allowed only on the perimeter of the course during racing and must leave the starting area after the warning gun and before the preparatory. After finishing, coach boats may talk to the sailors. Coaches may be asked to help yachts in trouble. It is required that all coaches honor this policy. Failure to do so will result in the coach being removed from the racing area with a letter to his employer and to US Sailing. Coaches are expected to be role models of Sportsmanship. All coaches must wear lifejackets while patrolling on the water.

BBYRA Midget Eliminations

The IHYC Junior Olympic regatta will also serve as the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association's (BBYRA) Midget Eliminations for 2014.

- 1. Classes: Optimist- GOLD FLEET Club 420
- 2. Eligibility: The BBYRA Midget Eliminations is open to amateurs. Members of each crew, sailing Club 420, may be boys or girls who will not reach their sixteenth birthday during the calendar year. Members of the Optimist Class may not reach their fifteenth birthday during the calendar year.
- 3. All skippers and crew must be members of the same yacht club and members of US Sailing; their club must be a member in good standing in US Sailing and BBYRA.
- 4. No crew or helmsman after participating or being entered in the Midget Elimination for one US Sailing Association (including Yacht Club elimination series) cannot be a member for another Association in any one year.
- 5. Prizes: The top two finishers in each fleet (Optimist Gold and Club 420) will receive Representative Flags, to be awarded at Seaside Park Yacht Club on August 30, 2014. These top two finishers in each fleet will also represent the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association (BBYRA) in the Midget Finals to be held at Monmouth Boat Club(NJ), August 23-24, 2014.
