NOTICE OF RACE

2015 FLYING SCOT® MIDWINTER CHAMPIONSHIP

Organizing Authority: Flying Scot Sailing Association ("FSSA") in conjunction with Sarasota Sailing Squadron ("SSS")

- 1. **Rules:** This regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined by the current edition of the *Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*.
- 2. <u>Eligibility</u>: The regatta is open to Active, Life, Junior, Club, and Family Members. The FSSA Constitution defines each category. Entrants shall select either the Championship or Challenger Division, except that any past North American or Midwinter Championship Division winner shall sail in the Championship Division.
- 3. Registration Eligible boats may enter by completing the online entry form at http://www.regattanetwork.com/event/9297 and paying the required fee by 1700, March 7, 2015. Thereafter entries may only be made in person during on-site registration (see NOR 5). Registration, including Division selection, must be completed by Sunday March 15 at 1100. Hoist space is limited and priority will be given in order of registration. Sailing Instructions and Notice of Race will be available to registrants at onsite check in
- 4. <u>Fees:</u> The entry fee is \$220 per boat. This includes: the Monday "Welcome Cocktail Party", dinners for two people for the Monday Dinner and the Wednesday Banquet, all racing and race management costs and trophies. Current US SAILING members (current as of time of registration) may deduct \$20 from the entry fee by providing their US Sailing membership number during online entry. Entries <u>received and paid</u> by February 15, 2015 may deduct \$20 from the entry fee. Thus the early entry fee for a US SAILING member is \$180.00.

Additional dinner tickets may be ordered online and will also be available for purchase at registration/checkin.

5. **Schedule:** Up to three races may be run each day, to a maximum of eight races.

6. Measurement: Boats and sails must conform to the Official Plan. Each boat must carry equipment required by FSSA Specifications, including Article S-V.2 (Racing Restrictions), and US Coast Guard requirements. At the minimum, the centerboards of the top five finishers from the Mid Winter's and NAC's from the past five years, and all club-owned boats, will be measured. Sails and rigging may be selectively measured and all boats may be checked for required safety equipment. Other measurements may be made at the discretion of the Measurement Committee.

Bow bags and transom ports are required for all boats *without exception*.

- 7. VHF Policy: FSSA rules permit carrying a VHF radio aboard at all times. VHF radios may be used to report emergencies to the Race Committee. A vessel reporting/declaring its own emergency shall be scored RET (retired); a vessel reporting an emergency on a competitors vessel shall not be penalized, and may seek redress if its finishing position is affected by providing such report. No other transmissions from competitors are permitted. The Race Committee may use VHF radios to inform competitors of safety information (such as approaching weather) or to hail boats that are on course side of the starting line (OCS) at the start.
- 8. <u>Courses to be Sailed</u>: The courses to be sailed will be Windward Leeward as described in the Sailing Instructions.
- 9. **Venue:** Launching and hauling will be from the SSS dry storage area and Ken Thompson Park. Except when launching/hauling, boats/trailers shall be kept in their assigned places after arrival. Vehicle parking is permitted in the park outside the gate to the squadron. Racing will be on Sarasota Bay; the race course is approximately 1-2 NM North of the clubhouse. Additional information can be found in Paragraph 13 below and on the regatta website.
- 10. **Scoring:** The low-point scoring system of RRS Appendix A2 will be used, except that there will be no throw-outs. Eight (8) races are scheduled, of which 1 must be completed to constitute a championship.
- 11. <u>Trophies</u>: Trophies will be awarded, at the minimum, to the skippers and crew of the first seven boats in the Championship division and the first five boats in the Challenger division. Additional trophies provided by FSSA include:

Championship Division 1st: Mary Meno Perpetual Trophy Challenger Division 1st: Brenda Pollack Perpetual Trophy Sportsmanship (voted on by the sailors): Allan M. Douglas Trophy

Sarasota Sailing Squadron History

The Sarasota Sailing Squadron was founded as a nonprofit organization by interested residents of the City of Sarasota for the purpose of promoting sailing.

The Squadron actually grew out of the youth sailing program of the Sarasota Yacht Club in the late 1930s, and was established by young adults who could not afford the higher dues of the yacht club. It was disbanded during World War II, but was reorganized under the auspices of the YMCA in 1946. It obtained its own charter in 1947.

The Squadron draws its membership from all strata of Sarasota society and from other states and Canada. Since its inception, the Squadron has been dedicated to the promotion of recreational sailing, racing, cruising, sailing instruction, boating safety and youth sailing instruction. Until 1958 its club meetings were held at City Hall, in the commission chamber, and its sailing activities were centered around the old city pier.

With the construction of the Island Park/Marina Jack complex, and by agreement with the City of Sarasota, the Squadron has occupied the northeast section of City Island since June of 1958.

Since 1946, the Squadron has sponsored an annual Labor Day Regatta, which grew in the space of a few years into the largest all-class sailboat regatta in the Southeast. The Squadron has also been host to numerous national and international sailing competitions. One of its first was in 1982, when it hosted the Ynglng World Championship Regatta. More than 30 of the boats in this international yachting class came to Sarasota from Europe, Since those times we have hosted numerous Eastern Laser Midwinter Championships, the Mini-12 World Championships, the Sunfish Worlds 2000, several Sunfish regionals, and other regattas for a variety of boats. In 1994 members resurrected (for one year) the race to Havana, Cuba which had been abandoned since 1957 with the rise of Castro and company. For all who were there it was an historic occurrence not forgotten. Last year the squadron hosted the 2013 F18 Americas Championship Regatta.

DIRECTIONS TO SARASOTA SAILING SQUADRON

To reach the Squadron from I-75:

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- Take the Fruitville Road exit (State Road 780) west until reaching US-41.
- Turn left, then right at the next light onto the John Ringling Causeway.
- As you cross the bridge, sailboats moored off the Squadron can be seen on your right.
- Proceed to St. Armands Circle, and bear right, taking the first outlet from the Circle.
- Proceed north, following the Mote Marine signs.
- Turn right onto Ken Thompson Parkway, just before the New Pass Bridge.
- The Squadron is located at the end of the road.
 - or, set your GPS to "go to" N27°20.14' W82°34.25'!
