Dear 2015 U.S. Junior Women's Championship Competitor and Parents,

On behalf of the USJWS Committee and the Rochester Yacht Club (RYC), we are excited to welcome you to Rochester! The Organizing Committee has been planning for this event for some time, and we hope all of this planning will pay off so you have a great sailing experience. Below is some important information regarding the event.

# **REGISTRATION:**

On site check-in/registration is on Tuesday, July 14, from 2:00 PM to 6:00 PM. No early arrivals! Please plan on stopping for lunch if you are driving to Rochester Yacht Club. The yacht club may not be open for food and beverage service until later when a light dinner will be provided for the competitors in the evening, so please plan ahead. The registration team will review that all forms have been correctly submitted. Life jackets (PFD) will be inspected at check-in/registration. You will not be allowed to sail unless you have an approved USCG life jacket as outlined in the Notice of Race (NOR). Refer to the NOR for requirements. Your sails and boat may be measured at any point. All equipment and sails must be class legal. Sails that are not class legal may not be used.

### **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS:**

The final Sailing Instructions will be distributed at check-in/registration. The Sailing Instructions in preliminary form may be available on the championship website prior to the event.

### **CHARTERS**

You may request a charter on the website. Charters are not guaranteed and are arranged privately by the competitors. The charter providers have asked that all charter requests be made by May 1<sup>st</sup> so they can plan appropriately. Do NOT make flight arrangements until you have secured a boat. If you are interested in contacting other sailors in your area to coordinate bringing your own boat to Rochester, please e-mail Natalie Steo at <u>nksteo@frontiernet.net</u>.

# **ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE:**

Arrival for all competitors is Tuesday, July 14, from 2:00 PM to 6:00 PM. Departure for all competitors is Monday, July 20 from 7:00 AM- 9:00 AM. Schedule your flights to depart after 9:00 AM. Competitors may leave after the Awards Dinner (at approximately 9:00 PM) with a parent/guardian; however, if they plan on doing so, Susan Dennis (see Contact List) must be notified in advance. All boats and trailers must be gone before 10 AM Monday, July 20.

US Sailing has negotiated a discount code from United Airlines for travel to the 2015 championships. The website to apply our discount is <u>http://www.ussailing.org/membership/benefits/</u>. This must be done



through the US Sailing website; it cannot be done either through a travel agent or using the regular United website.

You will receive an email via Regatta Network with a link to add your travel plans. It is imperative that you enter your arrival and departure details <u>no later than May 31, 2015</u>. You can use this link to update/change your plans at any time prior to this deadline. After June 15, you must email any changes to Natalie Steo at <u>nksteo@frontiernet.net</u>. Any travel arrangements that deviate from the above guidelines must be requested and approved in advance by the National Chair, Susan Dennis, at jr.womens.champs@gmail.com.net by May 31. No exceptions!

### **UNACCOMPANIED MINORS:**

If you are considered an "unaccompanied minor" by your airline, you must enter this in your travel details on Regatta Network. Appropriate arrangements must be made in advance with the airline, specifically contact/pick up information. The Transportation Chair, Natalie Steo (see contact info below) will be in contact with you regarding these details once you have entered this status into Regatta Network. There may be an additional charge for the return flight as an unaccompanied minor. You must have enough cash to pay this fee at check in for your return flight. Please be prepared.

#### **AIRPORT INFORMATION:**

**Do not book your flight until you have secured your plans for a boat.** Ground transportation for arriving competitors will be coordinated <u>only</u> between the Rochester Airport [ROC] and Rochester Yacht Club (Rochester NY). Many major airlines service Rochester Airport. Don't forget to include Rochester Yacht Club's name and mailing address on your luggage tag in the event your bags are delayed. See Contact List on the last page. Regatta volunteers will meet you in the baggage claim area with a "RYC" sign and will escort you to transportation to Rochester Yacht Club. The cost of ground transportation –if any- between Rochester airport and RYC is not included in the entry fee. Exact cost for this service will be sent out by May 31. Payment for the shuttle must be made to RYC prior to June 15.

### FOR YOUR OWN SAFETY, DO NOT ACCEPT RIDES OR TRANSPORTATION to or from Rochester Airport that has not been arranged through Rochester Yacht Club.

### **TRAVEL QUESTIONS:**

We will be tracking the arrival of each person carefully. If there is a flight delay or problems with your itinerary on arrival day, please call the Transportation Chair, Natalie Steo at (585)746-7198 immediately. Program this number into your cell phone.

### **DRIVING DIRECTIONS and VEHICLE PARKING:**

You can obtain directions to the Rochester Yacht Club on the internet using the address in the Contact List.

### WAIVERS:

Each competitor must send all of the required waivers (5) to the Registrar (see Contact List) by May 31<sup>st</sup>. The waivers are attached to the end of this letter. If any medical issues change after that date, it is the responsibility of the parent/competitor to notify the Registrar. **It is suggested that the competitor bring a copy of her medical insurance card.** 

### **HOUSING:**

All competitors will be assigned to a host family for the duration of the event. It is a nice gesture to bring a small item to thank your housing hosts. You are guests at their house so please no wet towels, clothes all over the floor, or the like. The final night of housing will be Sunday July 19th.



# **Competitors will not be informed of the name of the host family until registration**. Housing assignments are a moving target until the very last minute. No alternate housing will be permitted and no local competitor may stay in her own home, regardless of the proximity of her house to the host club unless she is attending the event for the first time or is willing to house at least one other competitor. See Conditions #5.1 for specific rules.

The host family pick-up time for Tuesday July 14 at the RYC is set for 6:30pm. When you arrive at your host family, phone your parents with the host family's phone number. Please exchange cell phone #s with your host family to facilitate pick-up times. Transportation to and from the Yacht Club will be either by walking or by the host family. **Competitors are NOT permitted to drive at any time during the event.** This is for the safety of all. Competitors are required to attend all events.

# **MEALS:**

Meals for competitors will be provided throughout the regatta. A hot & cold breakfast will be served at the club each morning. Lunches will be made by the sailors themselves in the morning and available from a coach boat on the water at midday. Dinners will be at Rochester Yacht Club on Tuesday, Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday. There will be a special event on Thursday evening and the sailors will eat with their host family on Friday evening.

### WATER:

This event will be certified as a Bronze Level event through <u>Sailors for the Sea</u>. It is recommended that you bring your own favorite water bottle from home. Also, you must bring your own carabineer, duct tape, bungee, or other device to secure your water bottle into your boat.

### **GUEST ACCOMMODATIONS:**

Parents and guests are responsible for their own housing and meals. Local hotel recommendations are given below at the bottom of contact page. Please refer to section 15 of the Notice of Race entitled "Coaching" for information about contact with competitors.

### **BURGEE EXCHANGE**

Exchanging burgees from your club with the JWS host club has become a wonderful tradition at these events. If you would like to participate in the burgee exchange, please bring a burgee from your home club. There will be a brief ceremony with a Rochester Yacht Club Officer to make the exchange.

### **AWARDS DINNER:**

The Awards Dinner on Sunday July 19th will be a well-attended event. *Attendance by competitors is mandatory and is included in the entry fee.* Competitors will not be allowed to leave before the Awards Dinner without prior approval of the National Chair and permission will only be granted for extenuating circumstances. The Awards Dinner usually concludes by 9:00 PM.

Awards Dinner tickets will be \$25 per guest. Guest Meal Tickets may be reserved by calling Natalie Steo at (585)746.7198. Please call to reserve seats by the end of registration, 8 pm Tuesday July 14. <u>The banquet will be held at the Rochester Yacht Club</u>. Payment will be taken at the door.

### **COMPETITORS' OWN SAILBOATS AND SAIL NUMBERS:**

Trailer storage is available. If you have an alternate location to store the trailer, or can bring your boat atop your car, that is preferable. Please email the Registrar (contact info below) if you plan on bringing a trailer and will need a place to store it during the event. All boats and trailers may not arrive before July 14<sup>th</sup>, and



must be gone before 10 AM Monday, July 20th. Sail numbers will be provided at registration for competitors to attach to their sails.

# **RACING CLINIC:**

There will be a **mandatory** two-day clinic that will be held on Wednesday and Thursday, July 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>. The clinic is funded by a generous donation from the Clagett Trust. You are required to be there with your boat rigged and ready to sail, and with a notebook, pen, and current rule book.

# **PRIVATE COACHES:**

Private coaches are not allowed. This is a Grade 2 coaching event. In the event that you have someone coming to watch, be sure to read the rules about support vessels. http://championships.ussailing.org/Youth/USJrWomensSinglehanded/Support\_Vessels.htm.

### **SPECTATOR BOATS:**

Parents are welcome to come and watch the sailing, but remember that no outside contact is permitted from the moment you step onto the yacht club property until the chief judge dismisses you at the end of the day. Your parents will not be permitted to talk to you or your friends, help rig or de-rig, pull boats out of the water - no contact at all.

These conditions were laid down by C. Thomas Clagett, whose trust covers the coaching at the championship. We must ask you and your parents to respect this. Violators are likely to be subject to protest, so please, parents and sailors both take this seriously. Refer to section 15 of the NOR entitled "Coaching" for more information.

There will be no spectator boats on clinic days and there may be limited spectator boats on race days. Spectators will be required to sign up at the sailing venue at least two days before they want to go on the water. Sign up will be posted near the Notice Board at the Rochester Yacht Club. Spectators are encouraged to bring their own lunch and drinks. No alcohol will be allowed on the spectator boats. **Please bring your own personal flotation device**. NO PRIVATE SPECTATOR BOATS WILL BE PERMITTED IN THE RACING AREA.

### **SAILING VENUE:**

The racing area will be in Lake Ontario, approximately 1.0 miles offshore from Rochester Yacht Club. In July, the air temperature averages in the 80s during the daytime, and 70's at night. The water temperature is expected to be in the mid-60s.

### WEATHER/APPROPRIATE GEAR:

Weather information is available via the internet using the zip code for Rochester Yacht Club: 14617. A detailed weather and local conditions seminar will be given to the competitors during the clinic, and daily weather briefings will be presented and posted on each of the racing days. <u>Please come prepared to sail in any weather conditions</u> – Lake Ontario in July can see any range of conditions, and they can change rapidly. Bring layers for both on land and on the water. Bring shorts AND pants, t-shirts AND jackets.

### ALCOHOL AND DRUGS:

Per US Sailing Regulation 10: The use of alcohol or any illegal drug by a competitor will not be allowed or tolerated during the event. Offenders will be dealt with strictly as stated in the Notice of Race.



# **CURFEW:**

There will be a 10:00 pm curfew during the event; meaning that ALL competitors must be "home" where they are being housed by 10:00pm each night. These regulations are in effect from Tuesday July 14th through Sunday July 19th. There will be no exceptions. We are not trying to make the event less fun; we are very concerned for your safety.

# TREATING THE HOST CLUB PROPERLY:

We take our regatta hosting very seriously, and as our guests, please show us that you appreciate the hard work of all of our volunteers. Please be as self-sufficient as possible and help others as needed. We expect that you'll jump in and help without being asked and clean up after yourselves each day!

# **LOST ITEMS:**

Mark all your belongings in advance! Take a few minutes with an indelible marker and put your name on everything you will be bringing. Also, clearly paint or otherwise mark your own spars and other personal boat equipment. If it has your name on it you are more likely to get it back if lost.

# PACKING LIST:

- 1. Life Jacket/PFD- only USCG approved and the appropriate size for the sailor
- 2. Appropriate sailing gear and clothing for a range of weather conditions.
- 3. Carabineer, duct tape, bungee, or other device to secure your water bottle into your boat.
- 4. Sunscreen, sunglasses, hat, and towel
- 5. A water bottle which you can secure to your boat appropriately labeled.
- 6. Tools and parts for personally owned boats
- 7. 30-foot tow line (required for all boats)
- 8. Notebook, pen, current rule book
- 9. Personal entertainment (e.g. books, Frisbee, iPod)
- 10. Appropriate attire for the awards dinner nice shirt, dress or nice slacks
- 11. A small thank you gift for your host family
- 12. A small burgee from your yacht club or sailing association to trade (optional)
- 13. Sneakers

Releasers knowingly assume all risks of participation in the Regatta, including all risk of personal injury and loss of or damage to the Releasers or their property, including further injury sustained as the result of the efforts of third parties who come to the aid of Releaser(s) if injured as a result of participation in the Regatta, and release all other persons and entities mentioned above who might otherwise be liable to Releasers. Releasers agree to abide by all rules of the Sponsors and the Host in connection with participation in the Regatta and understand that the failure to observe and obey such rules may result in instant revocation of Releaser's(s') right to participate in the Regatta.

#### US Sailing Championships Code of Conduct



#### Introduction

Each competitor in a US Sailing Championship or Qualifier hereby pledges to uphold the spirit of this US Sailing Code of Conduct (Code). This Code is not intended to establish a set of rules that will, by inclusion or exclusion, prescribe the appropriate behavior for competitors in every aspect of their participation in a Championship or Qualifier. Rather, the Code offers general principles to guide the conduct of competitors in situations that have ethical implications.

The competitor commits to familiarization with this Code and understands that acceptance of its provisions is a condition of participation in a US Sailing Championship or Qualifier. Competitors who do not conform to this Code will be subject to the consequences of their actions, as specified below. The competitor has a right to a hearing if charged with a violation of this Code.

#### Elements of the Code

Each competitor in a US Sailing Championship pledges they:

#### Participation

> Will abide by The Racing Rules of Sailing, the US Sailing Regulations, all rules related to the Championship selection procedures as specified by US Sailing, the Championship Conditions, the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions for the Championship or Qualifier.

> Are eligible to compete under all US Sailing rules.

#### **Fair Play and Conduct**

Will abide by Rules 2 and 69 of the Racing Rules of Sailing.

#### **Drugs & Alcohol**

> Will abide by US Sailing Regulation 10.01.C for Prohibited Substances as defined below:

> For adult US Sailing championship events, no competitor shall use, either on or off the water: marijuana or any other controlled substance as defined by state or federal law.

> For Junior and Youth events or for junior or youth competitors in any US Sailing championship, no participant or competitor shall use, either on or off the water, marijuana or any other controlled substance, or alcoholic beverages as defined by state or federal law.

#### Sexual Abuse & Harassment

Will abide by US Sailing Regulation 13.04 for Sexual Abuse & Harassment.

#### **Physical Abuse & Assault**

Will abide by US Sailing Regulation 13.05 for Physical Abuse & Assault

#### **Bullying & Hazing**

Will abide by US Sailing Regulation 13.06 for Bullying & Hazing.

#### **Enforcement of the Code**

> Compliance with this Code depends primarily upon understanding and voluntary compliance, secondarily upon reinforcement by peers, and, when necessary, upon enforcement through disciplinary action.

> If a competitor has been alleged to have violated this Code, the competitor will be given two options:

- A) Voluntarily withdraw from the Championship or Qualifier where the violation occurred. The competitor shall be scored RET in all races sailed and not sailed. A report will be sent to US Sailing. If the offense warrants, further action will be taken pursuant to Rule 69
- or
- B) A hearing will be held and if the Code is determined to have been broken, the hearing panel has the authority to remove the athlete from the venue immediately and mark all races as DSQ. Further action may be taken if needed pursuant to Rule 69.

> Before making a decision whether to withdraw from the Championship or Qualifier, or to request a hearing, the competitor will be given the opportunity to consult with an individual of their choice before racing commences, in order to better understand their options and potential outcomes.
