SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 RRS 40 but not its prescription is replaced with: "Competitors shall wear personal flotation devices at all times while afloat, except briefly while changing clothing or personal equipment."
- 1.3 Appendix T1 will apply: The first two sentences of rule 44.1 are changed to: 'A boat may take a One-Turn Penalty when she may have broken a rule of Part 2 or rule 31 while racing. However, when she may have broken a rule of Part 2 while in the zone around a mark other than a starting mark, her penalty shall be a Two-Turns Penalty.'

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located outside the CYC office inside the Club. Notices may also be posted on the CYC web site at: (http://www.regattanetwork.com/event/11556).

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 hours on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1900 hours on the day before it will take effect.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the main flagpole located adjacent to the Club.
- 4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in race signal AP.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 The first Warning each day is 1130 hours.
- 5.2 Five races are scheduled with three on Saturday and two on Sunday.
- 5.3 No warning signal will be made after 1500 hours on Sunday.

6. CLASS FĽAG

The Express 27 class flag will be Flag A.

7. COMMUNICATIONS

- 7.1 The Race Committee may use VHF channel 71 to communicate information about course selection, time to start, and the sail numbers of boats that are OCS or have broken RRS 30.
- 7.2 Neither failure of the Race Committee to communicate the sail numbers of recalled boats in a timely manner, nor failure of a recalled boat to receive or hear transmitted information, will be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.

8. RACING AREA

The racing area will be in the vicinity of the Olympic Circle.

9. COURSES & MARKS

- Course 1: Start-1-Finish Course 2: Start-1-2-1-Finish Course 3: Start-1-2-1-2-1-Finish
- 9.1 Courses will be displayed by numerical placards.
- 9.2 All rounding marks shall be left to port.

10. DESCRIPTIONS OF MARKS

Start/Finish: Yellow inflatable buoy Mark 1: windward mark – orange inflatable buoy Mark 2: leeward mark – orange inflatable buoy

11. START & FINISH LINE

- 11.1 Will be in the vicinity of X on the Olympic Circle.
- 11.2 The start/finish line will be between an orange flag or banner on the race committee signal boat and a yellow inflatable mark. The start/finish line will be set to leeward of Mark 2.

12. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 12.1 Protests time limit shall be one hour after the race committee signal boat returns to the dock. The time will be posted on the official notice board.
- 12.2 Notices will be posted immediately following the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties, and the time such hearings will commence. This will serve as notice per RRS 63.2.

13. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded after the racing on Sunday, on the CYC deck.

14. SCORING

- 14.1 One race will constitute a series.
- 14.2 No scores will be excluded from a boat's series score.
