**AIR ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE**: Plan to arrive July 5<sup>th</sup> as indicated below. Due to proximity, Gulfport Airport (GPT) is the preferred airport and transportation will be provided at no cost. For competitors flying into New Orleans (MSY) there will be a transportation cost associated for travel between New Orleans and Bay Saint Louis. Details will be sent separately.

Competitors may leave after the Awards Presentation with a parent or guardian; however, if they plan on doing so, we must be notified in advance. All boats and trailers must be gone by 12:00 PM, Monday, July 11.

US Sailing has negotiated a discount code from United Airlines for travel to the 2016 championships. The website to apply our discount is <a href="http://www.ussailing.org/membership/benefits/">http://www.ussailing.org/membership/benefits/</a>. This must be done through the US Sailing website; it cannot be done either through a travel agent or using the regular United website.

You will receive an email from the championship via Regatta Network with a link to add your travel plans. It is imperative that you enter your arrival and departure details **no later than May 31**. You can use this link to update/change your plans at any time prior to this deadline. After May 31, you must email any changes to the registrar: kbreath@gmail.com.



Any travel arrangements that deviate from the above guidelines must be requested and approved in advance by the National Chair, Ellen Cluett Donnelly, ellendonnelly@att.net by May 31 – no exceptions!

**UNACCOMPANIED MINORS**: If you are considered an unaccompanied minor by your airline, you must enter this in your travel details on Regatta Network. Appropriate arrangements must be made in advance with the airline, specifically contact/pick-up information. The BWYC Transportation Chair will be in contact with you regarding these details once you have entered this status into Regatta Network. Be prepared to pay any fees by credit card when you check in for your flight home.

**AIRPORT INFORMATION:** Ground transportation for arriving competitors will be coordinated at no cost between Gulfport-Biloxi Regional Airport and Bay Waveland Yacht Club. You will need to make your way to the baggage claim area without an escort. In the event that your luggage is delayed, don't forget to include the following on your luggage tag: BWYC 1 Yacht Club Drive, Bay Saint Louis, MS, 39520, Phone 228-467-4592.

Regatta volunteers will meet you in the baggage claim area for your flight with a sign that says: "U.S. JUNIOR WOMEN'S DOUBLEHANDED CHAMPIONSHIP @ BWYC" and take you to the waiting shuttle for transportation to BWYC.

Passenger shuttles will be hired for transportation. FOR YOUR OWN SAFETY, DO NOT ACCEPT RIDES OR TRANSPORTATION to or from Gulfport-Biloxi Regional Airport that have not been arranged through the regatta.

**TRAVEL QUESTIONS**: We will be tracking the arrival of each person carefully. If there is a flight delay or problem with your itinerary on arrival day, please call the Transportation Hotline 228.332.0674, immediately. We suggest you program these numbers into your cell phone.

**DRIVING DIRECTIONS**: Visit www.bwyc.org and click on "About" to obtain address and map of the area. Please do not arrive before registration opens.

**REGISTRATION**: Registration will be at BWYC on July 5 from 1:30-6:30 p.m. The transportation shuttle from the airport will drop you off at BWYC. Once you arrive, the registration team will review to determine that all forms have been correctly submitted, including **the original copy of your health insurance card**. Life jackets will be inspected at this time as well. **You will not be allowed to sail unless you have an approved USCG personal flotation device** as outlined in the Notice of Race (NOR). Refer to the NOR for the requirements. Your sails and boat may be measured at any point.

**FIRST EVENING:** Dinner will be served starting at 6:30 p.m. Host families will meet their sailors at 7:30 p.m. at the clubhouse.

**WAIVERS**: Each competitor must send or scan the required waivers including the Championship Code of Conduct by May 15 to the registration chair, Katie Breath, 529 East Second Street, Pass Christian, MS 39571. Email: Kbreath@gmail.com



The waivers are attached to the end of this letter. If any medical issues change after that date, it is the responsibility of the parent/competitor to notify Katie. It is suggested that the competitor bring a copy of her medical insurance card and a list of medications, if any.

**HOUSING:** All competitors will be assigned a host family for the duration of the event. Competitors will be informed of the name of the host family at registration. While we will make every effort to honor requests to house sailors together who wish to, we cannot make any guarantees. Do not call BWYC as housing assignments are not confirmed until the day before registration. It is a nice gesture to bring a small gift to thank your housing hosts. You are guests in their homes, so please act accordingly by honoring their generosity to share their respective homes with you. The final night of housing will be Sunday, July 10.

No alternative housing will be permitted, and no local competitor may stay in her own home, regardless of the proximity of her house to the host club unless she is attending the event for the first time and/or is willing to house at least one other competitor. When you arrive at the home of your host family, call your parents with the host family's phone number and exchange cell phone numbers with your host family to facilitate daily pick-up times. Transportation to and from BWYC will be by the host family. Competitors are NOT permitted to drive at any time during the event. Competitors are required to attend all events.

**MEALS**: Breakfast will be served at the club every day of the Event. Lunches will be buffet style and available during breakfast – sailors will make their own lunches each day of the regatta. Sailors do not need to bring any cash for dinners, dinner will be provided at BWYC, by host family, or during an organized regatta evening event. The Championship Banquet will be at BWYC following the races Sunday evening. While dress is casual at BWYC, competitors should expect to be in proper attire while eating dinner in the clubhouse: no beach or athletic attire; for example, tank tops, cut-off shorts or spandex.

**PARENTS AND GUESTS:** Parents are welcome to come and watch the sailing on racing days only, but remember that no outside contact is permitted from the moment you step onto the yacht club property until the chief judge dismisses you at the end of the day. Your parents will not be permitted to talk to you or your friends, help rig or de-rig, pull boats out of the water - no contact at all.

These conditions were laid down by C. Thomas Clagett, whose trust covers the coaching at the championship. We must ask you and your parents to respect this. Violators are likely to be subject to protest, so please, parents and sailors both take this seriously. Refer to section 15 of the NOR entitled "Coaching" for more information.

Parents and guests are responsible for their own housing and meals. Go to www.gulfcoast.org for information. Hotel and restaurant information will also be posted on www.bwyc.org. Parents who wish to attend the Championship Banquet may reserve tickets in advance until June 23 by emailing <a href="mailto:bwycmanager@gmail.com">bwycmanager@gmail.com</a> and/or <a href="mailto:eventsbwyc@gmail.com">eventsbwyc@gmail.com</a>. Guest tickets for the Awards Dinner may be purchased at BWYC during registration on Thursday, June 25. Ticket cost to be determined.

**AWARDS PRESENTATION:** The Awards Presentation is on Sunday, July 10. Attendance by the competitors is mandatory. Competitors will not be allowed to leave before the Awards without prior approval of Ellen Donnelly, national chair, and permission will only be granted for extenuating circumstances. The presentation will conclude no later than 6:30 p.m.

**CHARTER BOATS:** Successful applicants will be notified directly by Zim Sailing and will organize payment through Zim Sailing. If you have applied for a charter, you are obliged to accept it unless another competitor can be awarded the boat. Do NOT call Zim Sailing if you have not applied for a charter.

Sailors who are interested in chartering or purchasing SAILS ONLY should contact Zim Sailing after April 30th. If you are interested in purchasing a previously chartered boat, please contact Zim Sailing after April 30th.

**CHARTER BOATS-CANCELLATIONS:** If at any time the competitor's plans change and she will not be able to attend the championship, or she no longer needs the charter boat that we have assigned, the competitor must notify Liz Walker: <a href="mailto:lizwalker@ussailing.org">lizwalker@ussailing.org</a>. Charter fees will only be refunded if the boat can be chartered by another competitor; otherwise you will be responsible for the fee.

Charter boats do not include sails, bridles or trapeze harnesses. You will need to bring your own or make arrangements to have them shipped. Sails should be shipped with return shipping labels. Arrangements are the responsibility of the sailor, not BWYC or US Sailing.

**COMPETITORS' OWN SAILBOATS:** Competitors who are bringing their own sailboats should arrive at BWYC after 12:00pm and before 5:00 p.m. on Monday, July 5. Trailers will be stored at BWYC for the week. Competitors will be expected to attach the provided hull and sail numbers following registration. Launching: You will be instructed at registration how boat launching will be handled.

**CREW CHANGES:** Occasionally, unanticipated situations may make it necessary for teams to change crew. There may not be any substitution for members of the team except as provided below:

Substitution of a team member after acceptance in a championship can be requested for medical reasons or death in the family. Exceptions may be made for unexpected work/ school conflicts. Supporting documentation may be requested. All substitutions must be adequately explained by the qualified helmsman and crew and accepted by the Organizing Authority.

Competitors who wish to change sailing partners must submit a request in writing, stating the reason to Ellen Donnelly, national chair, ellendonnelly@att.net. Both parties must separately agree to the change. In the event that the substitution is not approved, the next team in line will be accepted. We encourage you to plan well in advance in an effort to retain your original team. See section 6 of the NOR for additional information.



**RACING CLINIC:** There will be a **mandatory**, two-day clinic held on Tuesday and Wednesday, July 6-7. The clinic is funded by a generous donation from the Clagett Trust. You are required to attend with your boat rigged and ready to sail, with a notebook, pen, and current rule book. You can order the app from the US Sailing website if you prefer: www.ussailing.org.

**PRIVATE COACHES**: Private coaches are not allowed. This is a Grade 2 event as described in the US Sailing Championship Support Vessel policy. See section 15 of the NOR for additional information.

**SPECTATOR BOATS:** It is our intent to provide a spectator boat on race days for those wishing to go on the water. There will be no spectator boat on clinic days. Pre-registration is required – please e-mail cedwards@gcshipyard.com for information and to reserve a spot by June 15. Again, refer to section 15 of the NOR titled Coaching for the rules regarding contact with competitors. NO PRIVATE SPECTATOR BOATS WILL BE PERMITTED IN THE RACING AREA.

**SAILING VENUE:** The regatta will be sailed in Saint Louis Bay. The bay is about 2 miles wide and 5 miles long and situated between Pass Christian, MS and Bay Saint Louis, MS. Most races are visible from the yacht club porch, sometimes with binoculars. Weather can be influenced by a Bermuda High, a low coming up from the Gulf, or a Northwest to Southeast flow. Our typical summer breeze is a southerly wind of 10-15 knots. Be ready for all weather including extreme heat and occasional showers or squalls.

**SAILING INSTRUCTIONS:** The final form of the Sailing Instructions will be distributed at registration. They will be available in preliminary form on the championship's website prior to the event.

**WEATHER/APPROPRIATE GEAR:** A detailed weather and local conditions seminar will be given to the competitors during the clinic, and daily weather briefings will be presented and posted on each of the racing days. Visit bwyc.org for weather links that will provide local weather forecasts. Be prepared for heat and humidity outside and air conditioning inside.

**ALCOHOL AND DRUGS**: Per US Sailing Regulation 10.03: The use of alcohol or any illegal drug by a competitor will not be allowed or tolerated during the event. Offenders will be dealt with strictly as stated in the Notice of Race and Championship Code of Conduct.

**CURFEW:** There will be a 10 p.m. curfew during the event, meaning that ALL competitors must be at their host home by 10 p.m. each night. These regulations are in effect from Tuesday, July 5 through Sunday July 10. There will be no exceptions. We are not trying to make the event less fun – rather, we are very concerned for the safety of each competitor.

**TREATING THE HOST CLUB PROPERLY**: BWYC has been preparing for and working on this event for more than a year. Be assured that we have planned the best possible championship regatta for you, from the racing, to the food, the social events and housing. Please be as self-sufficient as possible and help others as needed.



**LOST ITEMS:** Mark all your belongings with an indelible marker in advance! All items with a name clearly on them usually get returned. This also applies to your own spars and other personal boat equipment.

- o Personal Flotation Device- US Coast Guard (USCG) approved only, no exceptions
- o Sunscreen, sunglasses, hat, towel
- o Tools and parts for personally owned boats
- o A 26-foot, 3/8 inch diameter, floating towline with a loop in the end of the line that is not to be secured to the boat (required for private and chartered boats)
- o Notebook, pen, current rule book
- o Personal entertainment (e.g. iPod, iPad, books, magazines)
- o One small burgee from your yacht club or sailing association to trade
- Please see the notes on proper attire at BWYC; the Awards Dinner is a dressy affair
- o Appropriate sailing gear and clothing
- Trapeze harness
- o Re-usable water bottle clearly labeled with your name
- o A small gift for your host family
- o Sneakers

# Championship Code of Conduct

#### Introduction

Each competitor in a US Sailing Championship or Qualifier hereby pledges to uphold the spirit of this US Sailing Code of Conduct (Code). This Code is not intended to establish a set of rules that will, by inclusion or exclusion, prescribe the appropriate behavior for competitors in every aspect of their participation in a Championship or Qualifier. Rather, the Code offers general principles to guide the conduct of competitors in situations that have ethical implications.

#### **Elements of the Code**

Each competitor in a US Sailing Championship pledges they:

> Will abide by *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the US Sailing Regulations, all rules related to the Championship selection procedures as specified by US Sailing, the Championship Conditions, the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions for the Championship or Qualifier.

#### **Participation**

> Are eligible to compete under all US Sailing rules.

# **Fair Play and Conduct**

>Will abide by Rules 2 and 69 of the *Racing Rules of Sailing*.

# **Drugs & Alcohol**

- > Will abide by US Sailing Regulation 10.01.C for Prohibited Substances as defined below:
- > For adult US Sailing championship events, no competitor shall use, either on or off the water: marijuana or any other controlled substance as defined by state or federal law.
- > For Junior and Youth events or for junior or youth competitors in any US Sailing championship, no participant or competitor shall use, either on or off the water, marijuana or any other controlled substance, or alcoholic beverages as defined by state or federal law.

#### **Sexual Abuse & Harassment**

Will abide by US Sailing Regulation 13.04 for Sexual Abuse & Harassment.

#### **Physical Abuse & Assault**

Will abide by US Sailing Regulation 13.05 for Physical Abuse & Assault

#### **Bullying & Hazing**

Will abide by US Sailing Regulation 13.06 for Bullying & Hazing.

## **Enforcement of the Code**

> Compliance with this Code depends primarily upon understanding and voluntary compliance, secondarily upon reinforcement by peers, and, when necessary, upon enforcement through disciplinary action.

> If a competitor has been alleged to have violated this Code, the competitor will be given two options:

 A) Voluntarily withdraw from the Championship or Qualifier where the violation occurred. The competitor shall be scored RET in all races sailed and not sailed. A report will be sent to US Sailing. If the offense warrants, further action will be taken pursuant to Rule
 69

#### Or

- B) A hearing will be held and if the Code is determined to have been broken, the hearing panel has the authority to remove the athlete from the venue immediately and mark all races as DSQ. Further action may be taken if needed pursuant to Rule 69
- C) Before making a decision whether to withdraw from the Championship or Qualifier, or to request a hearing, the competitor will be given the opportunity to consult with an individual of their choice before racing commences, in order to better understand their options and potential outcomes
