# **Notice of Race**

#### 1 Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 Sail Canada prescriptions to the RRS are available at <a href="http://www.sailing.ca/images/uploads/SC%20Prescrip\_Arbit%202013-16.pdf">http://www.sailing.ca/images/uploads/SC%20Prescrip\_Arbit%202013-16.pdf</a>
- 1.3 Racing Rules will be changed as follows:
  - Rule 40 is changed to apply at all times while afloat. This changes the preamble to Part  $\Delta$
  - For Optimists, Rule 61.1(a)(2) is deleted so that boats will be required to display a red flag
  - The Sailing Instructions will amend Rules 41 and 90.2(c) for the Green Fleet.
  - Appendix P will apply and may be amended by the Sailing Instructions
- 1.4 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

## 2 Eligibility and Entry

- 2.1 The regatta is open to eligible participants in the following classes:
  - o 29er
    - if five paid entries are received by July 15, 2016. If five paid entries are not received, entries will be refunded in full or entrants may transfer to another class for which they are eligible.
  - o Club 420
  - o Club 420 Green
    - if five paid entries are received by July 15, 2016. If five paid entries are not received, entries will be refunded in full or entrants may transfer to another class for which they are eligible.







- Laser and Radial
- o Laser 4.7
  - if five paid entries are received by July 15, 2015. If five paid entries are not received, entries will be refunded in full or entrants may transfer to another class for which they are eligible.
- Optimist White
  - born 2006 or later
- Optimist Blue
  - born 2004 2005
- Optimist Red
  - born 2001 2003
- Optimist Green
  - born later than 2001

- 2.3 Required Documents at Registration/Check-in
  - o All participants in age-restricted classes must present a proof of age.
  - All Canadian boats must present proof of membership in a club affiliated with Sail Canada or, if not a Canadian boat, proof that they satisfy Rule 75. In lieu of a club membership card, a letter or email received from a club officer or manager confirming club membership will be accepted. Letters can be sent in advance to <a href="mailto:saileast2016pei@gmail.com">saileast2016pei@gmail.com</a>
  - All participants must submit a parent/guardian declaration, including a waiver of liability and a medical authorization form signed by a parent or coach if the participants are under 19 years of age. These documents can be completed electronically as part of registration.
- 2.4 In addition to scheduled regatta check-in, coaches are required to check in, both individually and on behalf of their teams, upon first arriving on site.

#### 3 Fees

3.1 Competitors' fees include buffet breakfast on race days and an evening meal on Saturday 23 July, 2016. Regatta T-shirts will be provided.

3.2 Coaches' package, including boat launch and docking (rafting or overnight mooring will be required), food as per competitors, and supply of water for coach boats will be \$50. A refundable deposit may also be required for coach boat identification flags. NB: Coaches using the site before July 21st must request permission from the regatta organizers. Daily dry-sailing fees apply (\$10/day per sailor or \$50/day per team) before or after the event.

## 5 Measurement

Duplicate sail numbers will not be allowed within any fleet, between all Optimist fleets, and between the Laser and Radial fleets.

#### 6 The Courses

Windward leeward or trapezoid courses will be sailed. The Green fleet may sail other course configurations.

## 7 Scoring

# 7.1 29er:

One race is required to constitute a series. When less than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. There will be a maximum of 12 races.

#### Club 420:

One race is required to constitute a series. When less than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. There will be a maximum of 8 races.

#### Laser, Radial and 4.7:

One race is required to constitute a series. When less than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. There will be a maximum of 8 races.

# **Optimist Class:**

One race is required to constitute a series. When less than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. There will be a maximum of 10 races.

#### Green Fleets:

The Green Fleets are a recreational class for developing sailors and casual competition.

Neither races nor the series will be scored. There is no maximum number of races.

#### 8 Sailing Instructions

Sailing Instructions will be available at the onsite check-in.

# 9 Safety

- 9.1 All boats will be required to be kept at CYC.
- 9.2 29ers, Lasers, Radials and 4.7s must have a tow line, of minimum 10 metres length and 7mm diameter fixed to their mast. Competitors may not use other lines from running rigging for this purpose. Club 420s and Optimist classes are required to have towlines in accordance with their class rules.
- 9.3 A whistle shall be attached by a lanyard to the PFD. The lanyard shall be long enough to permit the sailor to use the whistle while wearing the PFD.

# 10 Coach and Support Boats

All coach and support boats shall register and shall prominently display an identifier supplied by the Race Committee at all times while in the water.

## 11 Disclaimer of Liability

- 11.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race.
- 11.2 Charlottetown Yacht Club, Sail Canada and all other individuals and entities involved in the organization of this regatta shall accept no liability whatsoever for any injury, damage or loss or claim, whether personal or material, incurred or inflicted to participants before, during or after this regatta.

#### 12 Insurance

The competitor is responsible for ensuring that a minimum of \$1,000,000.00 third party coverage is in place for the event. The organizing authority does not accept any responsibility for verifying that a competitor is insured.

#### 13 Prizes

Prizes will be awarded for top three in each fleet. Additional prizes may be awarded.

#### 14 Rights to Use Name and Likeness

In participating in an event, a competitor automatically grants to the Organizing Authority and the sponsors of the event, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show, from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the competition in these events event in which the competitor participates and in all material related to the events without compensation.

#### 15 Charlottetown Yacht Club Grounds and Facilities

- 15.1 CYC Grounds and Facilities:
  - Parking is only permitted in the Sail East designated parking area with limited drop off areas at Charlottetown Yacht Club during the week leading up to, and including, the 2016 Sail East. Offsite parking has been arranged at the Culinary Institute of Canada. A visitor parking pass will be given to participants as required on a first come first serve basis.
- 15.2 Washroom/Shower Facilities:
  - Oue to limitations of the CYC, indoor washrooms and shower facilities will NOT be available during the week leading up to, and including, the Sail East. Portable toilets will be made available during this time.
- 15.3 Trailers/ Dollies:
  - Competitors, coaches and support personnel shall obey the directions of club and regatta personnel with respect to the locations of trailers, which may be required to be taken off-site if conditions warrant.
