SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

With Amendment Nos. 1, 2, & 3

1 RULES

Racing will be governed by the rules as defined in the current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).

2 ENTRIES

- 2.1 The regatta is open to all competitors who register with the organizing authority and pay the entry fee prior to 2000 hours on Thursday, 26 May 2016.
- 2.2 All boats shall comply with their Class Rules.

3 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to Competitors posted prior to the start of the race will be posted on the Official Notice Board located at the Commodore's Room in the Miles River Yacht Club (MRYC) building. Notices to Competitors posted after racing has commenced, will be posted on the Official Notice Board located on the waterside of the Eastport Yacht Club (EYC) building. 4 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any changes in the sailing instructions will be posted before 0800 hours on the day it will take effect, except that any change in the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 hours on the day before it will take effect.

5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the MRYC flagpole, located on the waterside of the clubhouse.
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 90 minutes" in race signal AP. This changes RRS Signals.

6 SCHEDULE OF RACES

6.1 The schedule of events is:

7 CLASSES, CLASS FLAGS, & ORDER OF START

7.1 It is the intention of the RC to give the first Warning signal at 0955 hours. The start order and class flags are as follows.

7.2 All competing boats shall fly class flags as specified in CBYRA Green Book General SI 4 or SI 7.1.

8 RACING AREA

The racing area will be the Chesapeake Bay, between the Miles River and the mouth of the Severn River.

9 CHECK IN

Prior to starting, all contestants shall check in by sailing past the stern of the Race Committee (RC) Check In Boat (flying a solid yellow flag), hail their sail number, and be acknowledged by the race committee. The RC Check In Boat will be stationed approximately 100 yards south of the RC Signal Boat (flying a blue "RC" flag). Do not attempt to check in with the RC Signal Boat.

10 COURSE

The diagram in Attachment 1 shows the course, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which the marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

11 MARKS

The marks of the course are described in SIs 12.2 and 14, and Figure 1.

12 THE START

- 12.1 Races will be started using RRS 26.
- 12.2 The starting line will be between a staff displaying a orange flag on the Race Committee boat at the starboard end and Miles River buoy R8 at the port end.

13 RECALLS

The Race Committee intends to hail the recall or sail numbers of OCS boats after the starting signal on VHF channel 71. The failure of any boat to hear the hail, the timeliness of the hail of OCS boats, failure to hail any boats, and the order of the boats in the hail shall not be grounds for granting redress. This changes RRS 41 and 62.1.

14 THE FINISH

Unless the course is shortened, the finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue "On Station" flag on an RC boat and the course side of Annapolis Harbor R2. If necessary, the course will be shortened at a rounding mark in accordance with RRS 32.

15 PENALTY SYSTEM

For one-design classes only, RRS 44.1 is changed so that when a rule of Part 2 is broken outside the zone at a mark, and there is no injury or damage, and no significant advantage is gained, the Two-Turn Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty. This changes RRS 44.1.

16 TIME LIMIT

The time limit is eight (8) hours from the time of each boat's class start. Any boat that is still racing after that time shall be scored DNF (Did Not Finish).

17 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 17.1 Boats intending to protest for an incident in the racing area shall inform the Race Committee when they finish, or via VHF channel 71 if/when they leave the racecourse without finishing, or via email at race.committee@eastportyc.org. This changes RRS 61.
- 17.2 Protests shall be filed at EYC, in the Race Committee office (first floor on the waterside of the building). For each class, the protest time limit is sixty (60) minutes after their Race Committee Signal Boat docks. Notices of protests by the Race Committee or Protest Committee will be posted on the Official Notice Board at EYC to inform boats under RRS 61.1(b).
- 17.3 Notices will be posted within thirty (30) minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held at EYC beginning approximately thirty (30) minutes after the protest time limit.

18 SAFETY

- 18.1 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the RC as soon as possible either by hail or on VHF channel 71.
- 18.2 A boat may not exercise right of way, cross in proximity to, or interfere with reasonable transit of the race area by commercial ships, tugs, or barges. Boats must take evasive action well in advance of a potentially dangerous situation. The US Coast Guard, ship captains, and bay pilots have been encouraged to report any incident they observe.
- 18.3 The race committee or protest committee may protest a boat for SI 18.2 based on information received from any source. The protest time limit does not apply. This changes RRS 60.2, 60.3, and RRS 61.3.
- 18.4 RRS 42.3 (Propulsion Exceptions) is changed by adding: "(j) A boat that is without way in a ship channel may use any means of propulsion to clear the channel at the approach of commercial traffic provided that, when becoming clear of the commercial traffic, the boat has not improved her position as a result of this action. A boat claiming this exception shall report the incident in writing to the protest committee within the protest time limit, with all the facts necessary to substantiate the boat's speed and change of position during the incident."
- 18.5 RRS 62.1 (Redress) is changed by adding: "(e) clearing a ship channel in compliance with SI 18.4."

19 SCORING

The Low Point scoring system will apply.

20 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Boats are encouraged to make contact with commercial traffic on VHF channel 13, as required for safety.

21 DISPOSAL OF TRASH

This is a Clean Race; all competitors are strongly encouraged to use multi-use water bottles instead of disposable water bottles, and to recycle whenever possible. RRS 55 prohibits placing trash in the water.

22 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk; see RRS 4 (Decision to Race). The Organizing Authority or any other party involved in the organization of the regatta will not accept any responsibility or liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustain in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

23 INSURANCE

Each boat shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$300,000.

24 SOCIAL

A post-race cookout and Awards Party at EYC will begin on Sunday, 29 May 2016, at 1400 hours; all skippers and crew are invited. Prizes not picked up during the awards party will be available at EYC beginning on Tuesday, 31 May 2016. Trophies not claimed within 30 days of the race shall be forfeited.
