

Un-seamanlike, unsafe, or reckless boat handling that damages or risks damage to boats or endangers competitors or

spectators will be grounds for disqualification and removal from the event.

Boats shall not put trash in the water. Sailors ashore shall place trash in the appropriate receptacles (Changes RRS 55). Breach of this rule will be grounds for disqualification.
