

Sailing Instructions

2016-2017 BAYS Opti Winter Series Regatta #4 at PYSF March 4-5, 2017



1. Eligibility

- 1.1 The Optimist Green, White, Red and Blue fleets are invited to participate.
- 1.2 Results will be scored as part of the BAYS 2015-2016 Opti Winter Series

2. Rules

- 2.1 The Regatta will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing, the prescriptions of US Sailing, as modified by the Sailing Instructions for this Regatta.
- 2.2 Competitors are required to carry a bowline of at least fifteen feet attached to a towing point while racing
- 2.3 Green fleet competitors shall fly an orange ribbon from the top of their sprit pole (will be provided at registration)
- 2.3 In the event of a protest, boats are exempted from displaying a red flag (this modifies Opti Class rules)

3. Notices to Competitors

3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board outside the PYSF classroom.

4. Changes to Sailing Instructions

4.1 Any changes to the sailing instructions will be posted before 1130 on the day it will take effect except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1700 on the day before it will take effect.

5. Signals Made Ashore

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the Official Notice Board.
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 15 minutes after removal.

7. Racing Area & Courses

- 7.1 The race course for Championship Fleet will be located outside Redwood Creek, between the San Mateo and Dumbarton Bridges. The Green Fleet will be racing inside the turning basin adjacent to PYSF. If weather dictates, both fleets could be sailed inside the turning basin.
- 7.2 The diagrams in Attachment A show the courses that will be used.

^{*} No lunch will be provided; All times are approximate*

- 7.3 Courses will be announced from the committee boat prior to each start sequence
- 7.4 Boats that have finished shall clear the start/finish line area.

8. Marks

- 8.1 The Outside Course rounding marks will be Red Buoys. The Inside Course rounding marks will be Orange Buoys.
- 8.2 The start/finish pin on the Outside Course will be a yellow buoy. The Start/Finish pin on the Inside course will be a round white buoy.

9. The Start

- 9.1 Races for Championship Fleet will be started using RRS 26. For the Championship Opti Fleet all color divisions will start and be scored together. Races for Green Fleet will be started using a 3-minute sequence with whistle blasts (RRS Appendix S)
- 9.2 The starting line will be between an orange flag displayed from the committee boat on the starboard end and a white buoy on the port end for the Inside Course. The Outside Course will be a yellow buoy.

10. Time Limit

The time limit for each race will be 45 minutes for the first boat to sail the course and finish. Boats failing to finish within 10 minutes after the first boat finishes will be scored DNF. This modifies rule 35.

11. Coaching

11.1 Coaching is not permitted during racing. Between races, coaching will be permitted, but coach boats shall not enter the racing area.

12. Protests

- 12.1 Protest forms are available by the Official Notice Board. Protests forms shall be delivered there within the protest time limit. The protest time limit is 15 minutes after the race committee arrives back at the dock.
- 12.2 Notices will be posted to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or are named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the PYSF Classroom.
- 12.4 Decisions of the Protest Committee will be final.

13. Scoring

- 13.1 The Low-Point scoring system shall apply.
- 13.2 Ten races in Championship will be attempted and one race shall constitute a series.
- 13.3 If six or more races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her races scores, excluding her worst score.
- 13.2 Results of this regatta will count toward the 2016-2017 BAYS Opti Winter Series

14. Safety

- 14.1 Each competitor must wear adequate buoyancy, properly secured at all times, from dock to dock. Wet suits, dry suits and inflatable PFDs do not constitute adequate personal buoyancy.
- 14.2 A boat that retires from a race or decides to leave the race area before the last race has been completed shall notify the race committee as soon as possible. If it is not reasonably possible to notify the race committee, a retiring boat shall notify the nearest support boat

15. Liability

15.1 Participants compete entirely at their own risk. Each competitor and their parent/guardian must sign a waiver before competing.

16. Prizes

16.1 Prizes will be presented after racing on Sunday to the top 3 overall finishers in the Championship and Green Fleet.
