

LLSC 420 Sailboat Usage Policy

2017

Primary Purpose of the 420 Sailboats:

The 420 sailboats are owned by the LLSC to serve the training needs of the LLSC Jr. Sailing Program.

General Statement Regarding Use of the 420 Sailboats:

The LLSC Jr. 420 sailboats will be used for the purposes for educating LLSC students in sailing and sailboat racing techniques; for LLSC students practicing their sailing and sailboat racing techniques; by instructors who are practicing their sailing and sailboat racing techniques; and by LLSC when it is hosting youth regattas.

Uses of the 420 Sailboats that are explicitly approved by the LLSC Jr. Director or Waterfront Director:

- During LLSC training classes.
- During Youth regattas hosted by LLSC
- LLSC Fleet Races if no training conflict exists.
- LLSC Team Racing events.
- LLSC students who have been checked out for basic skill test may use the boats with parental supervision.
- LLSC Juniors that at 16 yrs+ that have been checked out for skill test may use the boats without parental supervision, but must have parent approval.
- LLSC Adults that have been checked out for skill test may use the boats without supervision.

Rules:

- Lifejackets are required to be worn by all sailors on the 420. No exceptions.
- Mast Head floats must be used in ALL cases except for race days. No exceptions.
- Practice Sails must be used in ALL cases except for race days or team race days. No exceptions.
- Please respect the equipment and put it back in BETTER shape than you found it.
- Covers should be completely attached with all clips secure and the main halyard holding boom up.
- Any missing or lost parts should be reported to the Jr. Director ASAP, on the white board inside the JR. Dugout and the CHECK OUT CLIP BOARD.
- Sailing Area – 420s may not be taken out past X island. You must stay in view of the club at all times unless involved in a sanctioned race with RC support boats on the water.
- Trapezes are not permitted to be used without taking an advanced training class. No exceptions.
- Failure to follow these rules will be subject to all boat privileges from being taken away.

Basic 420 Skill test requirements:

- Name parts of the boat
- Proper rigging and de-rigging of the boat
- Proper launching of the boats
- Capsize drill
- Proficiency as a crew
- Proficiency as a skipper

Exceptions to the usage guidelines can be granted by the Sailing Program Director on case by case bases. Any boats leaving the LLSC property for a competitive event will require a Charter Agreement signed by the director, member and skipper. Questions: llscwaterfrontdirector@gmail.com
