



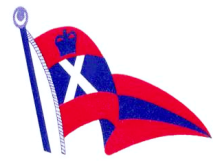
# 2017 Sail East

## Notice of Race

Amended May 16<sup>th</sup> 2017, July 5<sup>th</sup> 2017



### 1 Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 Sail Canada prescriptions to the RRS are available at [http://www.sailing.ca/files/RRS\\_2017\\_2020\\_Sail\\_Canada\\_Prescription\\_Final\\_EN.pdf](http://www.sailing.ca/files/RRS_2017_2020_Sail_Canada_Prescription_Final_EN.pdf)
- 1.3 Racing Rules will be changed as follows:
  - For Optimists, RRS 61.1(a)(2) is deleted so that boats will be required to display a red flag
  - The Sailing Instructions will amend RRS 41 and 90.2(c) for the Green Fleet.
  - Appendix P will apply and will be amended by the Sailing Instructions
- 1.4 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.
- 1.5 If there is a conflict between the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions the Sailing Instructions will take precedence. This changes RRS 63.7

### 2 ADVERTISING

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority.

### 3 Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1 The regatta is open to eligible participants in the following classes, so long as there are five paid entries by July 5, 2017:
  - 29er
  - Club 420
  - Laser
  - Laser Radial
  - Laser 4.7
  - Optimist
    - Optimist White (for sailors that have not reached the age of 11 years old before the first day of scheduled racing at the event)
    - Optimist Blue (for sailors that have reached the age of 11 by the first day of scheduled racing at the event and are younger than 13 years of age as of the first day of the event)
    - Optimist Red (for sailors that have reached the age of 13 by the first day of scheduled racing at the event and who are not older than 15 years old as of December 31<sup>st</sup> of the year of the event)
    - Optimist Green (beginner sailors born later than 2002)

### 3.3 Required Documents at Registration/Check-in

- All participants in age-restricted classes must present a proof of age.
- All Canadian boats must present proof of membership in a club affiliated with Sail Canada or, if not a Canadian boat, proof that they satisfy Rule 75. In lieu of a club membership card, a letter or email received from a club officer or manager confirming club membership will be accepted. Letters can be sent in advance to [sailleast2017@gmail.com](mailto:sailleast2017@gmail.com)
- All participants must submit a parent/guardian declaration, including a waiver of liability and a medical authorization form signed by a parent or coach if the participants are under 19 years of age. These documents can be completed electronically as part of registration.

3.4 In addition to scheduled regatta check-in, coaches are required to check in, both individually and on behalf of their teams, upon first arriving on site.

## 4 Fees

4.1 Competitors' fees include: four day access to RKYC facilities – washrooms, clubhouse, launch ramp, and parking for boats/trailers; training days July 13 & 14; Continental breakfast on race days July 15 & 16; box lunch on race days and supper on Saturday 15 July. Regatta T-shirts will be provided.

4.2 Coaches' package, including boat launch and docking (rafting or overnight mooring will be required), food as per competitors, and supply of water for coach boats will be \$60. A refundable deposit may also be required for coach boat identification flags. NB: Coaches using the site before July 13th must request permission from the regatta organizers. Daily dry-sailing fees apply (\$10/day per sailor or \$50/day per team) before or after the event.

## 6 Measurement

Duplicate sail numbers will not be allowed within any fleet, between all Optimist fleets, and between the Laser and Radial fleets.

## 7 Sailing Instructions

Sailing Instructions will be available at the onsite check-in.

## 8 The Courses

Windward leeward or trapezoid courses will be sailed. The Green fleet may sail other course configurations.

## 9 Scoring

9.1 29er:

- One race is required to constitute a series. When less than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When at least 5 races have been completed a boats series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. There will be a maximum of 12 races.

Club 420:

- One race is required to constitute a series. When less than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When at least 5 races have been completed a boats series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. There will be a maximum of 8 races.

Laser, Radial and 4.7:

- One race is required to constitute a series. When less than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When at least 5 races have been completed a boats series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. There will be a maximum of 8 races.

Optimist Class:

- One race is required to constitute a series. When less than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When at least 5 races have been

completed a boats series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. There will be a maximum of 10 races.

Green Fleet:

- The Green Fleet is a recreational class for developing sailors and casual competition. Neither races nor the series will be scored. There is no maximum number of races.

## **10 Coach and Support Boats**

All coach and support boats shall register and shall prominently display an identifier supplied by the Race Committee at all times while in the water.

## **11 Berthing**

Boats shall be kept in their assigned places while they are in the boat park.

## **12 Safety**

12.1 All boats will be required to be kept at RKYC.

12.2 29ers, Lasers, Radials and 4.7s must have a towline, of minimum 10 metres length and 7mm diameter fixed to their mast. Competitors may not use other lines from running rigging for this purpose. Club 420s and Optimist classes are required to have towlines in accordance with their class rules.

12.3 A whistle shall be attached by a lanyard to the PFD. The lanyard shall be long enough to permit the sailor to use the whistle while wearing the PFD.

## **13 Prizes**

Prizes will be awarded for top three in each fleet. Additional prizes may be awarded.

## **14 Disclaimer of Liability**

14.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race.

14.2 Royal Kennebecasis Yacht Club, Sail Canada and all other individuals and entities involved in the organization of this regatta shall accept no liability whatsoever for any injury, damage or loss or claim, whether personal or material, incurred or inflicted to participants before, during or after this regatta.

## **15 Insurance**

The competitor is responsible for ensuring that a minimum of \$1,000,000.00 third party coverage is in place for the event. The organizing authority does not accept any responsibility for verifying that a competitor is insured.

## **16 Rights to Use Name and Likeness**

In participating in an event, a competitor automatically grants to the Organizing Authority and the sponsors of the event, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show, from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the competition in these events event in which the competitor participates and in all material related to the events without compensation.

## 17 Royal Kennebecasis Yacht Club Grounds and Facilities

### 17.1 RKYC Grounds and Facilities:

- Parking is only permitted in the Sail East designated parking area with limited drop off areas at RKYC during the week leading up to, and including, the 2017 Sail East. Parking along Millidge Ave., below Kennebecasis Dr. to the RKYC gates is on a first come, first served basis. No parking between the RKYC entrance and the water.

### 17.2 Washroom/Shower Facilities:

- There are two unisex washrooms (one with a shower) on the outside of the clubhouse. There is a men's and a women's washroom inside the main floor of the club, both with showers. There are two unisex washrooms on the second floor of the clubhouse.

### 17.3 Trailers/ Dollies:

- Competitors, coaches and support personnel shall obey the directions of club and regatta personnel with respect to the locations of trailers, which may be required to be taken off-site if conditions warrant.

## 18 Accommodation

### Hotels

Delta Hotel, King St, Saint John: Special room rate of \$129/night, includes free parking (not suitable for trailers); use Sail East 2017 when booking; must be booked by June 13.

Holiday Inn, Place 400, Saint John: special room rate of \$134/night, including free hot breakfast and parking (trailers included); reserve under Sail East 2017, by June 13<sup>th</sup> 506-642-2622.

### University

UNBSJ: 2 bedroom suites with double beds, en suite bathroom and kitchenette, free landline calls within NB, \$80/night (20 available); or 1 single bedroom with shared washroom facilities, \$40/night (10 available). Both options have free WiFi, laundry access, lounges and parking; block will be held until April 18; after that it is on a first come, first served basis, and with another tournament in town, will go fast.
