Friday June 30 - Saturday July 1, 2017

1. RULES.

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in current *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 Advertising will be restricted to Category A.

2. SAFETY

All competitors must wear properly fastened USCG approved Type III non-inflatable lifejacket at all times while on the water, except to quickly change clothing.

3. ELIGIBILITY.

- 3.1 All competitors must have reached their 13th birthday but not their 19th birthday during the calendar year.
- 3.2 All competitors must be members in good standing of the same club or sailing organization that is a member of Southern Mass Sailing Association (SMSA)
- 3.3 All competitors should be members of US Sailing.
- 3.4 One entry per SMSA Club

4. ENTRY.

- 4.1 Regatta fee is \$200.
- 4.2 All Registration must be done and fees paid on-line at Regatta Networks
- 4.3 Registration opens June 1st. Registration closes at 1600 on Tuesday June 27th.
- 4.4 There is a minimum of 4 boats and a maximum of 14 boats on a first come, first serve basis.
- 4.5 SMSA medical forms (or yacht club forms) must be presented at check-in the day of the regatta.
- **5. BOATS.** Boats are Flying Scots provided by PBCB. Boats will be rotated
- 6. DIRECTIONS to Pleasant Bay CB (2287 Route 28 in Harwich, MA)

NB: Not at Chatham YC.

7. FORMAT:

- 7.1 If 8 or fewer clubs register, then all the clubs will sail a round robin.
- 7.2 If more than 8 clubs register, then each club will be randomly assigned to a flight. Flight A will start racing on the morning of the first day; Flight B will follow. The top clubs from each flight will qualify for the finals.

8. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

Friday, June 30:

0900 Registration.

First Warning. Racing will continue throughout the day at the discretion of

the Race Committee. A lunch break will be taken on the water around noon.

Saturday, July 1:

0900 Harbor Start

First Warning. Racing will continue throughout the day.

A lunch break will be taken on the water around noon. Trophy Presentation as soon as possible after racing

NB: Depending on the number of entrants and the conditions, the event may be finished in one day. Changes to schedule will be posted on the Notice Board.

- **9. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS.** Sailing instructions will be posted on Regatta Network and the official notice boards at the regatta site
- **10. RACING AREA.** All races will be in Pleasant Bay

11. COACHING, SPECTATING, SAFETY BOATS.

- 11.1 Coaching will be allowed between races.
- 11.2 Coaches, parents, and spectators may not interfere with the racers. Doing so may be grounds for removal of sailors connected to you from the regatta.
- 11.3 There will not be spectator boats available, though the racing can be viewed form shore. All Spectator and/or coach boats must register with the regatta chair before going on the water.
- 11.4 All spectator and/or coach boats are expected to act as safety boats at the direction of the PRO if necessary.

12. AREA A SEARS TROPHY QUALIFIER:

The clubs that finish first and second qualify to represent SMSA in the Area A Sears qualifiers and SMSA will reimburse the entry fee for that event.
