NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

- **1.1** The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020*.
- **1.2** The US Sailing prescriptions will apply.
- **1.3** The HYRA prescriptions will apply.
- **1.4** If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

2 ADVERTISING

- **2.1** Competitor advertising will be restricted as follows: No Restrictions.
- **2.2** Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

3* ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- **3.1** The regatta is open to all boats of the PHRF Monohull class. All registered boats need a US Sailing Approved PHRF rating from 2017 onwards provided no modifications to the rated configuration have been made. Boats without a valid rating will be estimated for scoring purpose but will not be eligible for event or season awards/points.
- **3.1(a)** A class PHRF > 50

C class PHRF > 140 with no use of spinnakers.

- **3.2** Eligible boats may enter by completing the registration form, together with the required fee, available at regattanetwork.com:
- **3.3** Late entries will be accepted under the following conditions: Online registration prior to the first warning signal of the day of racing.

4 CLASSIFICATION

The following classification requirements will apply (see rule 79): NONE.

- **7.3** The scheduled time of the 5-minute warning signal for first race **1155.** The RC will sound a horn approximately 1 minute prior to the 5-minute sequence.
- 7.4 Number of races: Three races per day are scheduled
- 7.5 After racing party at the LYC 1700-1900

8 MEASUREMENTS

Each boat shall produce a valid **PHRF** rating certificate. All registered boats need a US Sailing Approved PHRF rating from 2017 onwards provided no modifications to the rated configuration have been made. Boats without a valid rating will be estimated for scoring purpose but will not be eligible for event or season awards/points.

9 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available online at <u>www.regattanetwork.com</u> prior to Race Day.

10 VENUE

10.1 Racing shall be offshore Lahaina in the approximate area of Puamana or Launiopoko.

11 THE COURSES

The diagrams in Attachment A show the courses, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left. The approximate TOTAL course length will be no less than 1.0 NM for C Class and 1.5 NM for A Class.

12 PENALTY SYSTEM

- **12.1** For the PHRF class rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
- **12.3** Decisions of the protest committee will be final as provided in rule 70.5.

13 SCORING

- **13.1** The scoring system is as follows: Low Point System of Appendix A.
- **13.2** 3 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- **13.3** (a) When 3 or fewer races have been completed; a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - (b) When from 4 to 7 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
 - (c) When 8 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

14 SUPPORT BOATS

Support boats shall notify the Race Committee and monitor the Race Channel 71

15 RADIO COMMUNICATION

The Race Committee will monitor VHF Channel 71

19 PRIZES

Prizes will be given as follows: Fleets of 3 or fewer boats will have prizes for 1st place. Fleets of 3 or more will have awards for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places. Prizes will be awarded at the end of the Spring Series.

19.1 Post Racing Parties – The Lahaina Yacht Club will provide pupu and drinks after racing concludes on each race day. Skippers need to provide crew head counts at the skippers meeting to receive drink chips (1 per crew)

20 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

21 INSURANCE


Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.
