1 RULES

- 1.1 The race will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing and the International RS AERO Class Rules in force at time of Race.
- 1.2 The US Sailing prescriptions to rules 60, 63.2, and 63.4 are deleted.
- 1.3 Measurment will not be performed. Competitors may be asked to show compliance with all safety gear as required by USCG and Class Rules.
- 1.4 Racing Rule 40 is changed as follows: Competitors shall wear personal flotation devices except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Wet Suits and dry suits are not personal flotation devices (code flag Y nned not be displayed).
- 1.5 There will be a single start for all sailboats

5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in the race signal AP.

RACING AREA/COMMUNICATION

6.1 The racing area will be due south of peanut island and Race committee mark boats will be communicating on VHF channel 72.

COURSES

7.1 The diagrams in the attachment show the courses as either Windward/Leeward (Noted course A) or triangle (course B), including the approximate angle between legs.

THE START/FINISH

8.1 The starting/finish line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the starting mark at the starboard end and the course side of the port-end starting mark.
