SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1) RULES

This regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2017-2020 as adopted by the U.S. Sailing Association, the class rules International Optimist Dinghy Association and these sailing instructions.

2) ENTRIES

Competitors may enter by delivering a completed entry form and paying the entry fee before 0830 on July 16, 2018.

3) CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTION AND NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Any changes to the Sailing Instructions or Notices to Competitors will be posted on the official notice board located inside of the SHYC clubhouse by 0845 on July 16, 2018.

4) SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located on the club lawn. When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in the race signal AP.

5) SCHEDULE

6) SAFETY REGULATIONS

Competitors shall notify the race committee (RC) or a designated support boat of their decision to retire for the day before leaving the racing area.

7) CHECK-IN REQUIRED

Competitors must check in with the RC for the first race of the day by sailing past the stern of the RC boat on starboard tack and hailing their sail number. A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee or a support boat as soon as possible.

8) RACING AREA:

The racing area for the Championship fleets (Red, Blue, & White) will be located to the southwest of Wychmere's outer harbor. The racing area for the Green fleet will be located east of the Saquatucket Harbor channel.

9) COURSES and MARKS:

- 9.1 The course will be indicated by a course designation letter and approximate heading and distance on the stern of the RC boat before the warning signal. Refer to course descriptions.
- 9.2 For the <u>Championship fleet</u> the "I" Course will use an offset mark that will be used as an additional mark at the windward mark on "I" course. This mark must be rounded to the same side as the windward mark. A "GATE" will be used at the leeward mark. Competitors must pass between the marks of the gate from the direction of the previous mark. Refer to course descriptions for more detail.
- 9.3 For the **Green fleet** refer to the course diagrams

10) STARTING AND FINISHING LINES & STARTING SYSTEM:

- 10.1 Races for the Championship fleets will be started in accordance with RRS rule 26.
- 10.2 Races for the <u>Green fleet</u> will use the starting sequence according to RRS Appendix U (Audible signal racing system). *This replaces RRS26*.

- 10.3 The starting line will be between an orange flag on the RC boat and either a nearby mark or pole displaying an orange flag on a nearby boat unless otherwise specified by the RC.
- 10.4 The RC will attempt to hail the recall numbers of OCS boats after the starting signal. *This modifies rule 29.1*. The failure of any boat to hear the hail, promptness of the hail, failure to hail any boats, or the order of boats hailed shall not be grounds for redress. *This changes rule 62.1*.
- 10.5 The finish line will be between an orange flag on the RC boat and either a nearby mark or an orange flag on a nearby boat unless the course is shortened in accordance with Rule 32.2.

11) TIME LIMIT

- 11.1 The time limit for each race will be 1 hour for the first boat to finish.
- 11.2 Boats not finishing more than 35 minutes after the first boat that sails the course and finishes will be scored TLE (Time Limit Expired). *This changes RRS 35*.

12) PROTESTS

- 12.1 Competitors shall notify the race committee of their intent to protest immediately after finishing.
- 12.2 Protest forms are available from the registration desk at SHYC. Completed protest forms shall be delivered to the registration desk within 30 minutes after the race committee boat docks. The race committee docking time and a list of properly filed protests will be posted on the notice board. Hearings will be held as soon as possible.
- 12.3 Notices will be posted no later than 10 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the protest room, the main clubhouse of SHYC.

13) SCORING

- 13.1 The Low Point System of Appendix A of the racing rules will apply except as modified in these Sailing Instructions.
- 13.2 There are 5 races scheduled.
- 13.3 One race constitutes a series.
- 13.4 If 5 races are scored then each competitor will have their worst race score excluded. If less than 5 races are scored then there will be no excluded race scores from a competitor's total score. *This modifies RRS Appendix A Section A2.1*
- 13.5 Competitors scored TLE will be scored total number of finishers in that race plus 1 place. *This modifies Appendix A Section* 44.

14) SUPPORT BOATS

- 14.1 Team leaders, parents, coaches and other support persons shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal until all boats have finished or retired or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.
- 14.2 In the Green Fleet, coaching is allowed for those boats in the last half of the fleet of each race.
- 14.3 All support boats shall comply with the instructions coming from the Race Committee or designated support boat. Non-compliance may result in disqualification being awarded to entrants associated with the offending support boat.

15) DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY



16) PRIZES

All Green Fleet participants will receive participation medals. In addition, trophies will be awarded for first through third place in Green Fleet. Championship fleet trophies will be awarded first through third overall. There will also be trophies for first through fifth in each Championship fleet (white/blue/red). The Race Committee reserves the right to award special prizes in its discretion.
