



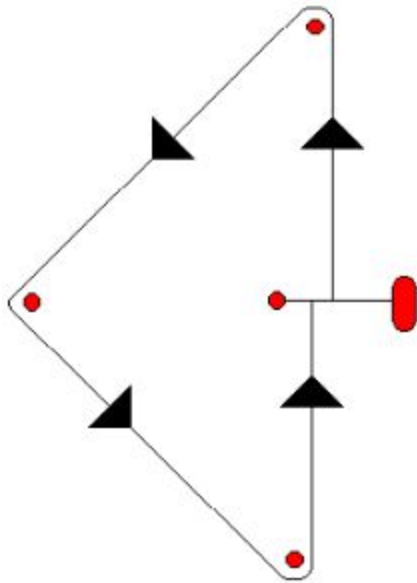
## **2018 GSBYRA Jr. Race Week**

### **Sailing Instructions**

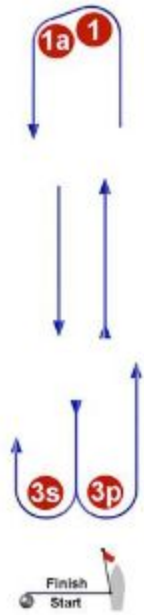
#### **July 25 - 27 Unqua Corinthian YC, Babylon YC, Bay Shore YC**

1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
2. Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in each yacht club.
3. Signals Made Ashore will be displayed from the flagpole. If a postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 20 minutes after flag AP is lowered.
4. A competitors' meeting will be held each day of the event at 10:00 AM. Changes to the Sailing Instructions may be made at the competitor's meeting. The warning signals for the first race will be at 10:30 AM. Subsequent races each day will be held as soon as practicable after the end of the previous race, with 5 races scheduled each day. Fleets will compete (weather permitting) for a separate distance race from Unqua YC to Babylon after racing on Wednesday, and from Babylon YC to Bay Shore YC at the end of racing on Thursday. This distance race will not count in the scores.
5. The racing areas will be the Great South Bay in front of each respective club.
6. The starting and finishing lines will be between the Race Committee Boat and a pin buoy. Three minute dinghy starts will be used. The start/finish line is not an obstruction.
7. The time limit for each race will be one hour for the first boat to finish.
8. Protests shall be delivered to the yacht club(s) head instructor within 20 minutes after the race committee finish boat docks. The protest time limit and a list of protests received will be posted on the notice board. Hearings will be held as soon as practicable after racing each day.
9. Daily Scoring - Five races are scheduled per day. If five races are completed, a boat's worst score will be excluded from her daily score. If fewer than five races are sailed on a given day, then a boat's daily score will be the sum of their scores in each race.
10. Overall Scoring - The final scores will be determined by each boat's daily place. The compilation will use the Low Point Scoring System, Appendix A RRS with the following changes to Appendix A2: the overall finish position for each day will be treated as if it were a single series, with no throw-outs. Tie breaker will be based on lowest overall place on the last day of racing.

11. Courses and Marks - The courses will be WL, W4, and Port Triangle. The course will be announced verbally prior to each race. All marks will be orange or yellow buoys.
