Notice of Race

July 26 - 29, 2018



You are invited to attend the 2018 Santana 20 Class Championship Regatta, hosted by the Rogue Yacht Club (RYC), to be sailed on Howard Prairie Lake, Oregon. This year the weekend portion of our regatta will be held in conjunction with the Southern Cascade Regatta (July 28-29, 2018).

1) ORGANIZING AUTHORITY

a) The Organizing Authority (OA) for this event is jointly held by Rogue Yacht Club (RYC) and Santana 20 Class Association.

2) RULES

a) The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020 (RRS) unless otherwise amended in the Sailing Instructions distributed at the event.

3) ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- a) The regatta is open to all boats whose skipper is a Regular or Associate member in good standing with the Santana 20 Class Association before the first race of the event.
- b) An official Entry Form will be available through Regatta Network with a link on the Class Association website (<u>www.s20.org</u>) no later than May 1, 2018.
- c) Prospective competitors may enter by completing the Entry Form and and paying the appropriate fees –
 Registration by July 1, 2018 \$195; After July 1st \$225; After July 15th \$255 Includes for skipper & crew: Burger night after Practice Race on July 26; dinner on Saturday, July 28th; Breakfast/Class Meeting on Sunday, July 29
- d) Late entries at the event will be accepted only at the discretion of the Santana 20 Class Championship Event Chairman.
- e) All competitors shall present themselves, or an authorized representative, to the Competitor Check-In desk at Howard Prairie marina during the periods listed in the schedule to verify the details of their entry, receive event documents, etc.

4) SCHEDULE

- a) All times 2400 format Pacific Daylight Time (PDT)
- b) One (1) or more practice races are scheduled for July 26, 2018.
- c) Championship races are scheduled for July 27 thru July 29, 2018.

5) MEASUREMENTS

- a) All boats to be sailed in this event shall have and shall carry a valid measurement certificate. This certificate shall be presented to the Competitor Check-In staff no later than the close of the Sail and Boat Measurement period on July 27.
- b) On-site measurement of boats will be provided during the Sail and Boat Measurement periods listed in the schedule on a first-come, first-serve basis. There is no guarantee that boats presented for measurement during these periods will be measured within the allowable time and thus competitors are encouraged to have their boats measured well in advance of the event by their local Santana 20 Fleet Measurer or by appointment with the Santana 20 Class Measurer.
- c) Sails that have been measured and stamped at previous Class Championships are not required to be fully measured for this event, but do need a 2018 stamp. Sails that have not been measured and **stamped prior** to the 2018 Class Championship will be required to be measured and stamped on-site during one of the Sail and Boat Measurement periods.
- d) No sails will be measured after the close of the Sail and Boat Measurement periods without the prior approval of the Santana 20 Class Championship event Chairman.
- e) Each competitor's four (4) required Class sails must be registered and stamped by the 2018 Championship Measurer to be eligible for use in the event. These four (4) stamped sails are the only sails that a competitor may use once Championship racing commences. Additional sails may be approved by the Santana 20 Class Championship

event Chairman only if a registered sail has been severely damaged while racing during the event and permission to use substitute sails has been provided by the Santana 20 Class Championship event Chairman.

- f) A "Competitor Compliance Acknowledgement" will be a part of the regatta measurement form and will cover items required for the event. A competitor is subject to random measurement and spot checks for compliance at any time during the event by any member of the championship committee.
- g) All boats are subject to additional measurement at any time at the reasonable discretion of the Class, the organizing Fleet or the Race Committee. Boats placing in first through fifth (1st -5th) places in each race may be rechecked daily.

6) SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

a) Sailing Instructions will be provided at Competitor Check-In.

7) VENUE

- a) All regatta on-shore events, unless otherwise noted, will be held at the Apserkaha Campground about a 5 min. drive south of the marina.
- b) A block of camping sites have been set-aside for the regatta. You will be able to reserve a spot when you register via Regatta Network.

Rates are for Wednesday night, July 25th, thru Sunday night:

Tent site - \$50 for up to 4 people

Medium Cabin - \$140, sleeps min. of 3 up to 8 people in bunk beds w/sleeping pad Large Cabin - \$160, sleeps min of 3 up to 10 people in bunk beds w/sleeping pad - First come, first served

- Encouraged to join with other participants to save money & conserve cabin space RV Space - \$80, electric hook up with water

c) For those not wanting to camp, there is motel lodging in Ashland about 18 mi. away.

8) COURSES

- a) Racing will be conducted on Howard Prairie Lake.
- b) Courses will be windward-leeward, rounded to port unless otherwise noted in Racing Instructions.
- c) A course sheet for the event will be available at Competitor Check-In.

9) SCORING

- a) The Low Point Scoring system will apply; NO throughouts, all races counted. (As allowed by RRS A2.1).
- b) The number of races is at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- c) Three (3) completed races shall constitute a regatta.

10) PRIZES

- a) The Santana 20 Class Championship Trophy will be awarded to the winning boat.
- b) Additional awards will be presented to the skipper and crew members of the boats finishing in first through fifth (1st-5th) places. Depending on number of boats participating, additional skipper and crew awards may be presented.

11) HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

a) Participating boats shall remain in the water from the start of racing on Friday, July 27, through the conclusion of the regatta.

12) LAUNCH FACILITIES, BERTHING

- a) Competitors shall provide their own tow vehicle when using the launching ramp.
- b) Moorage slips may be available to rent; boats to provide their own dock lines.
- c) There maybe some mooring buoys available (county offers a "shuttle barge"). Depending on lake levels, it maybe necessary to raftup boats. In either case, please have necessary lines and hardware.

13) RADIO COMMUNICATION

a) The race committee will attempt to hail all OCS boats and make other race course safety announcements by VHF radio. You will be given he radio channel at the first practice race on Thursday, July 26, 2018. The sending of any radio communications by a competitor while racing, other than notice of withdrawal or request for emergency assistance, is prohibited. Failure of boats to have a working VHF radio, the misinterpretation of the courtesy broadcasts, or failure of the Race Committee to provide the broadcast shall NOT be grounds for redress.

14) LIABILITY AND INSURANCE

- a) Competitors participate in the Regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race.
- b) The Organizing Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, or prior to, during, or after the Regatta.
- c) Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$100,000 per event or the equivalent.

15) USE OF ALCOHOL

a) Adults attending the regatta are responsible for the conduct and alcohol consumption of their under age family members and/or crew attending the event.
