# **NOTICE OF RACE**

#### 1. Rules

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the Rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2. The organizing authority may issue colored bands to be applied to the mast.
- 1.3. Competitors shall enter in either Standard or Radial class. (Rig Swapping rule "Off".) Fleets may be split
- Laser class rule 7(a) is restricted as follows: "Only one person, the registered sailor, shall be on board while racing."
- 1.5. Racing Rules 40 and 44.1 will be changed as follows: Personal floatation devices required at all times. One turn penalty except in the zone. Equipment protests will only be accepted from the Race Committee. The changes will appear in full in the Supplementary Sailing Instructions. The Supplementary Sailing Instructions may change other Rules.
- 1.6. The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official notice board located on the pavilion of the Palm Beach Sailing Club.

### 2. Eligibility and Entry

- 2.1. Members of the ILCA who have reached the age of 35 by the first day of the regatta may enter.
- There will be classes for Standard and Radial Lasers. 4.7 sails may be used in the Radial Class.
- 2.3. Proof of ILCA membership will be required at Registration, and ILCA forms will be available.

- 2.5. Entries must be made by Monday, 18 February 2019 to guarantee an event T-shirt. <u>Free entry</u> submit the winning T-shirt slogan to <u>office@pbsail.org</u> by Monday, 21 January 2019.
- 2.6. No entries will be accepted after 10:00am Thursday, 7 March 2019.

#### 3. Fees

- Registration must be made and entry fees paid no later than, Thursday, 28 February 2019. The entry fee is \$150/boat.
- 3.2. All registrations received from 1 March to 7 March 2019 will be charged an additional \$25 late fee.
- Entry fee includes full use of the facilities of PBSC starting Thursday, 7 March 2019, continental breakfast Friday, Saturday mornings, Saturday evening dinner (cash bar), and awards Sunday after sailing and an event T-shirt. Buffet meals will be available for purchase Friday and Sunday. PBSC bar/kitchen will be open Friday and Sunday.
- 3.4. Early arrival prior to Thursday 7 March (use of PBSC facilities) please register as "visiting yachtsman". Contact PBSC office for details.

Awards to follow after last race

- 9 races are scheduled. There will be a maximum of 4 races per day.
- 4.3. On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 1500.

#### 5. Social Schedule

Friday – continental breakfast at 0800. PBSC bar / kitchen open 1700-2130.

Saturday – continental breakfast at 0800. Regatta dinner no later than 1800.

Sunday – continental breakfast at 0800. Buffet available at awards.

#### 6. Inspection and Measurement

- Boats, gear, and sails may be inspected by the Technical Committee at any time for conformance to Class Rules. Competitors shall use only one hull, sail, batten set, mast, boom, centerboard and rudder.
- 6.2. Sail numbers must have the full 5 or 6 digits applied in accordance with Class Rules, and sails must have the builder button.
- 6.3. Competitors are encouraged to have a hand-held VHF radio capable of transmitting and receiving on Channel 69. Such radios are "Safety Equipment" within the meaning of ILCA Rule 25.

#### 7. Sailing Instructions

Supplementary sailing instructions will be available at registration, and online after March 7 at the regatta website.

#### 8. Venue

The racing area will be in the Atlantic Ocean south of the Lake Worth inlet or inside the Lake Worth lagoon depending on conditions. All efforts will be made to hold races in the ocean.

#### 9. The Courses

Courses will be as illustrated in the Supplementary sailing instructions.

#### 10. Scoring

- 10.1. A minimum of one race is required to be completed to constitute a regatta for that class.
- when fewer than 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When 6 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 10.3. The NA Masters handicap system will be used to score the overall series. For each race: Apprentices add 3 points Masters add 2 points Grand Masters add 1 point Great Grand Masters and Legends add 0.

# 11. <u>Prizes</u>

Prizes will be awarded to the top finishers in each division, overall winner, and top female. The number of prizes for each division will be based on number of entries and will be at the discretion of the organizing authority.

# 12. Disclaimer of Liability

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
