RULES

1

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in Racing Rules of Sailing.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to boats of the Albacore, A-Class catamaran, Flying Scot, Chesapeake 20, Jet 14, and Laser (full and radial will be scored together unless fleet size permits) classes.
- 2.2 Any class with 3 or more boats may be given a start at the discretion of the Race Committee and PRO

3 ENTRY

3.1 Regular online registration ends at midnight on Thursday, May 30 on the Regatta's Regatta Network site.

4 FEES

4.1 Required fees are as follows:

Single Handed boats	\$30
Double Handed boats	\$40
non-US Sailing member additional fee	\$5
Late (on-site) registration add	\$10

Cancellation prior to the close of onsite registration will be refunded, minus a 10% fee.

The Race Committee (RC) will announce the order of starts for the first race at the competitors' meeting.

8.2 Sunday

1030 First warning signal

No races will start after this time

Awards will follow racing.

8.3 Number of Races:

There is no limit to the number of races. The committee will attempt to maximize racing for the conditions available.

9 PRIZES

- For each class, prizes will be given to the first-place finisher in classes with three or fewer entries, the first two finishers in classes with six or fewer entries, and the first three finishers in classes with seven or more entries. Prizes for the A-Cat class will be awarded for Foiling and Classic boats as separate classes.
- 9.2 The Dave Irey Memorial perpetual trophy will be awarded to first place finisher in the class with the largest number of registered competitors.

10 COURSES

10.1 Courses will be set around racing marks as declared in the Sailing Instructions.

11 MEASUREMENTS

11.1 Each boat must satisfy the requirements of its class rules.

12 PENALTY SYSTEM

For the Multihull classes RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn penalty.
