## On the Water

## Life Threatening Injury or Emergency:

- 1. Survey environment—stabilize injury or move to safety if necessary.
- 2. Contact the SF Emergency Dispatch (415-553-8090) or 911.
- 3. Contact the Race Committee (VHF Channel 78) to inform them of your status and any assistance you require.

All boats on the race course are requested to maintain a working VHF radio tuned to VHF channel 78 and/or 16 at all times. Any boat may be called upon to assist in an emergency situation as directed by the Race Committee.

- Provide the nature of emergency and gender/age of person involved.
- Advise them of your boat name, sail number and position on the course.
- SFFD requests that, if possible, make your boat distinctive to responders by either lowering sails, hoisting a colored flag, "black dot" distress flag, etc. and indicate this easily spotted condition to the dispatcher.

Rendezvous point for contact with medical assistance will be dictated by the emergency dispatcher.

Rendezvous point on shore will usually be the guest dock on the north side of Pier 40.
