- 1. **Rules:** The Regatta will be governed by the Rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
 - 1.1. **RRS 29.2** <u>General Recall</u> is modified to allow the race committee to use any amount of time it wishes after the lowering of the general recall flag before resuming racing operations.
- 2. Eligibility: The regatta is open to any Flying Scot. Skippers must be current members of the FSSA.
- 3. **Registration:** Skippers can register online through Regatta Network (<u>www.regattanetwork.com</u>). Sailing Instructions will be available on Regatta Network, on the ECSC web site and at the registration table.
- 4. **Measurement:** All boats may be checked for safety equipment as required by the FSSA rules.
- 5. **Fees:** Registration fee is \$80 and includes a complete meal package for skipper and one crew. Meal package includes Friday dinner; Saturday breakfast, lunch, dinner; Sunday breakfast, lunch.
- 6. Schedule: All times Eastern Daylight-Saving Time

- 8. **Venue:** Eagle Creek Sailing Club 8901 W. 46th Street, Indianapolis, IN. Boats will be stored on trailers at the ECSC grounds. Tent camping is available on the ECSC grounds. Hot showers and ice are available at the club.
- 9. **Courses:** Courses will be provided in the Sailing Instructions.
- 10. **Scoring:** 5 races are scheduled. If conditions are favorable, more than 5 races may be run at the discretion of the PRO. 1 race will constitute a regatta. No races will be excluded from a boat's series score. This changes RRS A2.
- 11. Awards:
 - 11.1. Trophies will be awarded to the top 3 finishing boats for the regatta.
 - 11.2. The Midwest District Champion Trophy will be presented to the top finisher in the Midwest District.
