SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

To be sailed SUNDAY 25 AUGUST 2019

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing, 2017-2020 US SAILING PRESCRIPTIONS, and WORLD SAILING Offshore Special Regulations (OSR) 2017-2020 except as altered by these Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2. All skippers are reminded to review RRS 4: Decision to Race and the Rules of Part 2: When Boats Meet.
- 1.3. US SAILING Prescription to the RRS Appendix V Rule V2 is modified to read: "After a race, a boat that may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 or rule 31 in an incident while racing may take a Post-Race Penalty for that incident. A boat takes the penalty by delivering a written notice to the race committee that identifies the race number and when and where the incident occurred. The penalty shall be a 20% Scoring Penalty, calculated as stated in rule 44.3(c) if taken before the protest time limit expires. Otherwise a 30% Scoring Penalty shall apply, calculated as stated in rule 44.3(c). However, rules 44.1(a) and (b) apply, and the penalty shall not be taken after a protest hearing involving the incident has begun.
- 1.4. Appendix T will apply.
- 1.5. Appendix T1.b is modified to read: "A Post-Race Penalty is a 20% Scoring Penalty calculated as stated in rule 44.3(c) if taken before the protest time limit expires. Otherwise, a Post-Race Penalty is a 30% Scoring Penalty calculated as stated in rule 44.3(c). However, rule 44.1(a) applies."
- 1.6. Rule 52 (Manual Power) is suspended for double or single-handed entries in the ORC Club Spinnaker Class when clear of the start / finish areas in both races. This changes Rule 52.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1. Notices to competitors will be e-mailed to all competitors e-mail address as entered at registration on RegattaNetwork.
- 2.2. Notices to competitors will be announced at the official regatta party Saturday 24 August located at Captain Ken's Port 'O Call, Freeport TX.

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1. Any written change to the sailing instructions will be announced at the official regatta party Saturday 24 August located at Captain Ken's Port 'O Call, Freeport TX.
- 3.2. Verbal changes may be made on the water and shall be communicated to each boat by VHF before her warning signal.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1. Signals made ashore will be displayed from a staff secured to the front of the Freeport Municipal Marina office in Freeport TX
- 4.2. When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in the race signal AP.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.1. No warning signal before 8:00 a.m. The starting sequence will be as described in section 6 below.

5.2. Each class will sail a single race

6. CLASS FLAGS and STARTING SEQUENCE

6.1. FIRST START PHRF NON-SPINNAKER: Brown
6.2. SECOND START ORC CLUB SPINNAKER: Blue
6.3. THIRD START TOMA Multihull Green
6.4. FOURTH START B&B CLASS: Grey

7. RACING AREA

7.1. Addendum A shows the location of the racing areas.

8. THE COURSES

8.1. The diagrams in the Course Option Illustrations show the courses, including the order in which marks are to be passed. All marks are to be left to port.

ADDENDUM A

8.2. HYC BIMINI'S N' BARBECUE'S (B&B) CLASS

8.2.1. The course will be 42.1 NM between the Freeport jetties starting area, the Galveston 5A Marker (Mark "F"), and the Bolivar Roads Marker 11 (Mark "G").

8.3. PHRF NON-SPINNAKER, ORC CLUB SPINNAKER, AND TOMA MULTIHULL CLASSES

8.3.1. For these classes there are three course options. These options are numbered 1-3 and will be signaled by a numeric flag no later than the warning signal for the class.

9. MARKS

- 9.1. The starting pin will be a floating tetrahedron.
- 9.2. The finish pin will be mark G (GA 11) described below.

10. THE START

- 10.1. PHRF, ORC Club and TOMA Multihull races will be started per RRS Rule 26.
- 10.2. For ORC boats, the ORC Triple Number scoring option selected to describe the sailing conditions will be announced by the Race Committee via VHF (before the warning signal for that race) to each individual boat.
- 10.3. All B&B Class Club Handicap racers are invited to start at a time of their choosing while their class flag is up. This class flag will be lowered 30 minutes after the time it was raised.
- 10.4. The starting line will be between a staff flying an orange flag on the signal boat and the course side of the starting pin.
- 10.5. Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races.
- 10.6. A boat starting <u>later than 5 minutes</u> after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes rule A4.
- 10.7. Official time is GPS time

11. THE FINISH

- 11.1. The finish line will be between an orange banner on the official signal vehicle on the beach (approximate bearing = 215°) and the course side of the finish pin.
- 11.2. Please attempt to hail the race committee via VHF to alert them to your presence at the mark.
- 11.3. If the race committee is absent when a boat finishes, she should report her finishing time, and her position in relation to the rest of the fleet (as best as she can determine), to the race committee at the first reasonable opportunity.

12. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 12.1. US SAILING Prescription to the RRS Appendix V Rules V1 and V2 will apply.
- 12.2. US SAILING Prescription to the RRS Appendix V Rule V2 is modified to read: "After a race, a boat that may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 or rule 31 in an incident while racing may take a Post-Race Penalty for that incident. A boat takes the penalty by delivering a written notice to the race committee that identifies the race number and when and where the incident occurred. The penalty shall be a 20% Scoring Penalty, calculated as stated in rule 44.3(c) if taken before the protest time limit expires. Otherwise a 30% Scoring Penalty shall apply, calculated as stated in rule 44.3(c). However, rules 44.1(a) and (b) apply, and the penalty shall not be taken after a protest hearing involving the incident has begun.

13. TIME LIMITS

- 13.1. The race shall end at 2400 hours CDT, Sunday 25 August, or when the last yacht finishes, whichever is earlier.
- 13.2. Yachts which have not finished at the expiration of the time limit will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes rules 35, A4 and A5.

14. PROTESTS

- 14.1. Protest forms are found in Addendum C to these Sailing Instructions. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered to the HYC Office within the appropriate time limit.
- 14.2. Competitors intending to file a protest must notify the race committee (by VHF or 832.428.0785) at the first reasonable opportunity.
- 14.3. For each class, the protest deadline is 10 am, Monday 26 August.
- 14.4. Should a competitor be unable to reach the HYC office before the protest deadline expires, a photograph of the front and back of the signed protest form will be accepted by the protest committee via e-mail. This email must be time-stamped before the time limit expires. If it is time stamped after the time limit has expired the protest will be found invalid. The signed original of the protest form must be turned in to the protest committee before any hearing can take place.
- 14.5. All notices will be emails.
- 14.6. Notices will be sent no later than 30 minutes after the deadline to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.
- 14.7. Hearings will be held in the place and time as announced by the protest committee.
- 14.8. Notices of protests by the race committee or protest committee will be sent to inform boats under rule

61.1(b).

- 14.8.1. Appendix T will apply.
- 14.8.2. Appendix T1.b is modified to read: "A Post-Race Penalty is a 20% Scoring Penalty calculated as stated in rule 44.3(c) if taken before the protest time limit expires. Otherwise, a Post-Race Penalty is a 30% Scoring Penalty calculated as stated in rule 44.3(c). However, rule 44.1(a) applies."

15. SCORING

15.1. The Low-Point Scoring system, Appendix A, shall apply.

16. SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 16.1. Prior to the first warning signal, each yacht shall check-in with the Race Committee. The procedure shall be to sail within line of sight of the Race Committee, hail on channel 68 and repeat your sail number, yacht name, and the number of crew on board until acknowledged by the R/C.
- 16.1.1. Skippers are encouraged to e-mail or text the team roster to the race committee in advance.
- 16.2. Any yacht that starts, and then retires or withdraws before finishing the race shall notify the Race Committee on VHF channel 68, cell phone (832.428.0785) or if that is not possible the Houston Yacht Club office (phone number 281.471.1255). Please do this...

17. COMMUNICATIONS

- 17.1. The official communications channel is VHF channel 68.
- 17.2. The Race Committee will also be available by telephone at 832.428.0785 (PRO) or 281.910.0942 (Chief Judge).
- 17.3. Email communications:

- 17.4. While offshore, all yachts are encouraged to monitor channel 16 and to communicate potential hazards to other racers.
- 17.5. All yachts should also monitor VHF Channel 13 when in the vicinity of the Houston Ship Channel for commercial traffic concerns.

18. PRIZES

- 18.1. The Carroll Blanchard perpetual trophy will be awarded to the boat finishing first in the Spinnaker Class.
- 18.2. Trophies will be awarded based on final registration volumes.
- 18.3. Registrations received after the trophy order has been placed shall be awarded IOU's in place of the actual trophy.
- 18.4. The race committee shall deliver owed trophies at a mutually agreeable time and place at a later date.
- 18.5. Prizes will be awarded at the HYC Turkey Day awards presentation. The Carroll Blanchard Cup for "The Freeport Race" (PHRF or ORC spinnaker) will be awarded at this time. The S Rhoads Fisher Trophy may be awarded at this time.

19. INSURANCE

19.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$300,000 per incident or the equivalent.

20. USE OF ENGINES

- 20.1. Engines may be used in an emergency. After the emergency is resolved, competitors are to return to the closest point possible at which the engine was engaged and continue the race.
- 20.2. Engines may be used to charge batteries
- 20.3. Use of engines is prohibited except as permitted in sections 20.1 and 20.2 above.

21. PROHIBITED EQUIPMENT

21.1. Use of a self-steering system is prohibited except as stated in section 1.5 above.


22. HANDICAPS


- 22.1. All PHRF Non-Spinnaker class yachts must be handicapped by PHRF Galveston Bay for 2019.
- 22.2. All ORC Club Spinnaker class yachts must have a current 2019 ORC certificate.
- 22.3. All TOMA Multihull Spinnaker class yachts must be handicapped by the Texas Offshore Multihull Association.
- 22.4. All HYC Club Handicap (B&B) yachts shall be rated by the Race Committee.
