SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

With Amendment #1

1 RULES

- 1.1 This regatta shall be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing and J/105 Fleet 1 Class Rules.
- 1.2 All competitors shall wear a PFD while on the water, other than brief periods while adding or removing clothing, or below deck. The “Y” flag will not be flown. This changes RRS 40 and the preamble to part 4.

2 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the SBYC website and the Regatta Network website. Notices shall be posted no later than 1800 on the Friday evening before racing. If notices have been posted, the committee boat shall fly flag “L” in the racing area.
- 2.2 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted on the club website and the official notice board before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.
- 2.3 No signals shall be made from ashore.
- 2.4 Competitors should monitor VHF 78 for the on the water communications with the Race Committee
- 2.5 The Race Committee may announce the start, course selection and the sail number of boats that are OCS or have violated RRS 30. The failure of the Race Committee to hail a boat, the order of the hails, or the boat’s inability to hear the hail shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 41 and 62.1.
- 2.6 Competitors retiring from a race before finishing shall notify the Race Committee as soon as reasonably possible after retiring.

3 SCHEDULE and CLASS FLAG

- 3.1 Friday, June 21:
 - 1600 – 1800 Weigh-InsSaturday, June 22:
 - 0830 – 0930 Weigh-Ins
 - 1130 First warning signal
 - The Warning Signal for subsequent races shall be made as soon as practicableSunday, June 23:
 - 0830 – 0930 Weigh-Ins
 - 1130 First warning signal
 - The Warning Signal for subsequent races shall be made as soon as practicable
 - Awards at South Beach Yacht Club
- 3.2 Class Flag will be a Red flag displaying a white “J” logo
- 3.3 Four races are scheduled for Saturday, Four races for Sunday.

4 VENUE

The intended racing area will be the South Bay waters of San Francisco Bay. The committee boat may move based on conditions. If so, the race committee shall hail the fleet on VHF channel 78 and display the "L" flag.

5 COURSES

- 5.1 Courses and mark descriptions will be defined on Attachment A – Description of Courses & Marks
- 5.2 No later than the warning signal, the race committee signal boat shall display:
 - A pennant designating the course
 - A flag representing the mark rounding direction. If a red flag is displayed, all marks, except for a gate, shall be rounded to port. If a green flag is displayed, all marks, except for a gate, shall be rounded to starboard.

6 MARKS

- 6.1 The marks are described on Attachment A – Description of Courses & Marks.
- 6.2 Mark 2 will be a gate. If the gate is not in place, the remaining mark shall be rounded to port.

7 THE START

The starting line will be between the staff displaying an orange flag on the signal boat and the course side of an orange inflatable mark designating the port end.

8 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move the existing mark. New marks shall not be laid.

9 THE FINISH

The finish line will be between the staff or halyard displaying a blue flag on the signal boat at the starboard end and the course side an orange ball or small orange tetrahedron at the port end.

10 TIME LIMIT

For all races the time limit shall be 15 minutes after the first boat in the class finishes that race. Boats finishing after the time limit shall be scored DNF. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.

11 PROTESTS

- 11.1 Protests shall be in writing; forms will be available at the club and must be delivered to the protest table by 1900 the day of the incident. Alternatively, protests may be sent electronically using standard protest forms and emailed to: rearcommodore@southbeachyachtclub.org. Electronic submissions must be time stamped no later than 1900 the day of the incident.
- 11.2 The list of protests will be posted on the official notice board within 15 minutes of the end of protest time. This posting constitutes the notification required in RRS 61.1(b) and 63.2
- 11.3 Protests will be heard at 1900 the first Thursday following the race at SBYC.

12 SCORING

A minimum of one race shall be completed to constitute a series. All races count. No race shall be discarded. This changes RRS Appendix A2.

DISPLAYED BY
NUMERICAL PENNANTS

Course 1
S - 1 - F
(Both red #1 & green #1 must be rounded)

Course 2
S - 1 - 2 - 1 - F
(Both red #1 & green #1 must be rounded)

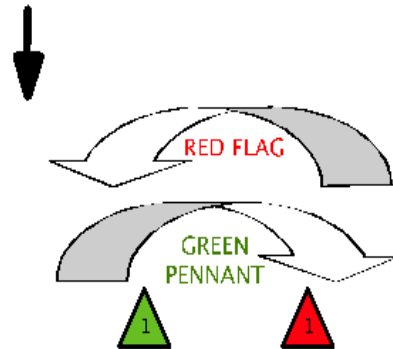
RED FLAG - ALL MARKS SHALL BE TAKEN TO PORT, EXCEPT MARK 2 (GATE).

GREEN PENNANT - ALL MARKS SHALL BE TAKEN TO STARBOARD, EXCEPT MARK 2 (GATE).

FOR MARK 2 (GATE), BOATS SHALL PASS BETWEEN THE GATE MARKS FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE LAST MARK, THEN MAY ROUND IN EITHER DIRECTION.

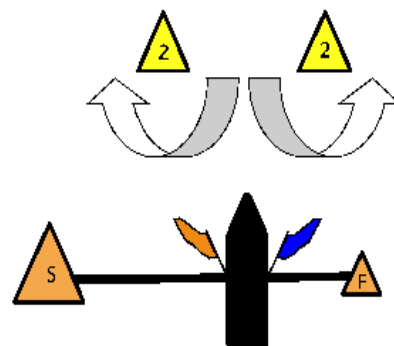
IN THE EVENT A GATE MARK IS MISSING, THE REMAINING GATE MARK SHALL BE TAKEN TO PORT REGARDLESS OF FLAG COLOR FLOWN.

DESCRIPTION OF MARKS:

- S Orange Conical Mark
- 1 Red & Green Conical Marks (marks will be spaced to compensate for current)
- 2 Yellow Conical Mark(s)
- F Orange tetrahedron
