



June 8, 2019 Race 4 – Cat Harbor Layover Sailing Instructions

1 RULES

- 1.1 This Series will be governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
1.2 Before the first warning, all entries shall pass the stern of the Race Committee (R/C) boat and check in. No radio check-in allowed, except for entries travelling from out of the area.

2 SCHEDULE, CLASSES AND CLASS FLAGS

- 2.1 Class assignments, flags and the order of starts were posted for race 1 and will remain in effect for this race (see NOR Instruction 2.4).
2.2 **The scheduled time for the first Warning Signal is 1055**, with multiple sounds made 1 minute before (see NOR Instruction 6.3).

3 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to Competitors will be posted by 0900 race day, on the Notice Board inside the DRYC clubhouse and on the DRYC website (DRYC.org).

4 COURSE AND MARKS

- 4.1 From the starting line:

Berger Series PHRF and ORCA Divisions

Leave the El Segundo bell buoy (2ES) to port. Leave the West End of Catalina Island to port. Continue to Instruction 6.1 (course length 36.5 nm).

4.3

Stein Series Cruising Division

Leave the El Segundo bell buoy (2ES) to port. Continue to Instruction 7.1.(course length 29.2 nm).

5 THE START

- 5.1 The starting area will be in the vicinity of MDR H Mark (see MDR Course Chart 17).
5.2 The Starting line will be between an orange inflatable mark and an orange flag on the R/C boat.

6 THE FINISH-BERGER DIVISION

6.1

Berger Series PHRF and ORCA Divisions

The finishing line will be between the Coast Guard buoy and an Orange flag on the RC boat. (see Finishing Line Attachment). All entries shall hail the R/C on VHF 68 just before entering Cat Harbor. Boats finishing after 1930 shall illuminate their sail number.

- 6.2 The RC intends to be on station until 2030. If the RC is not on station, record your own finish time (GPS) when your bow crosses an imaginary line between the Coast Guard buoy and Pin Rock (see SI Instruction 7.2).

7 THE FINISH-STEIN DIVISION

7.1 Stein Series Cruising Division

The finishing line, will be between the Catalina "West End" light and the bow of your boat (see Finishing Line Attachment). EACH BOAT MUST FINISH WITHIN 1/2 nm OF THE WEST END OF CATALINA ISLAND and shall take a "Screen shot" of their GPS when finishing, showing their Lat and Long. When the light bears 90° from your bow, each boat shall record their finish time (GPS) and any boats ahead of and directly behind you (see SI Instruction 7.2).

7.2 **All entries shall** record their finish time (GPS) and the sail numbers of any boats ahead of and directly behind (use attached Appendix A). This must be submitted at the DRYC front desk no later than 1200 June 10, 2019. Any penalty for failure to submit, shall be at the discretion of the R/C.

7.3 Any boat not finishing by 2230 (Time Limit) will be scored DNF (this changes RRS 35).

7.4 **All retirements must be reported as soon as possible**, but no later than 30 minutes after retirement, to the finish PRO or the yacht club office (see instruction 12).

8 HANDICAP RATINGS / SCORING

8.1 For PHRF and Cruising Divisions, PHRF of So. California (PHRF) Area B RLC ratings will apply. Out of area production boats may have Area B RLC adjustments applied, at the discretion of the R/C.

8.2 For ORCA entries Time Correction Factors (TCF) will apply.

8.3 A boat that DNS, DNF, RET or DSQ shall be scored the number of finishers plus 1. An entry that DNC will score the numbers of individual race entries plus 2. This changes RRS A4 and A9.

9 PROTESTS

9.1 Boats shall notify the R/C of their intention to protest within one hour of finishing, either in person at the DRYC Cat Harbor Facility or by contacting the finish PRO (see instruction 12).

9.2 Protests (forms available at the DRYC front desk) shall be filed at the DRYC front desk no later than 1200 June 10th, 2019 (Protest Time Limit). Hearings will be scheduled for a later date.

10 RADIO COMMUNICATION

The R/C will attempt to monitor and announce starting information and recalls on VHF 68.

11 TROPHIES

Individual race, series and perpetual trophies will be awarded at a trophy presentation on Saturday June 29th, 2019. Please RSVP with the DRYC office, by Monday June 24th and join us for the party.

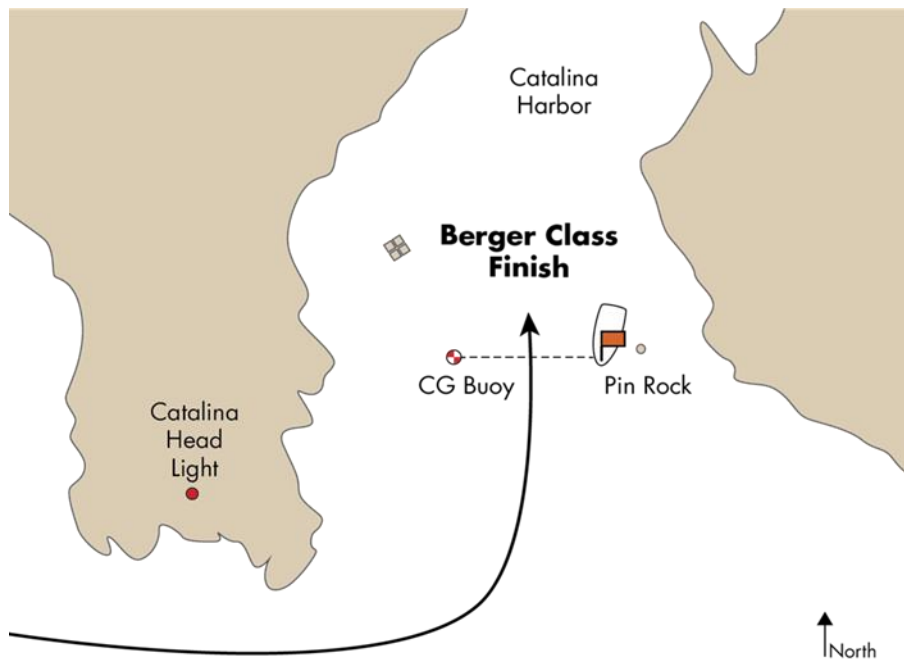

William Berger Finishing Line



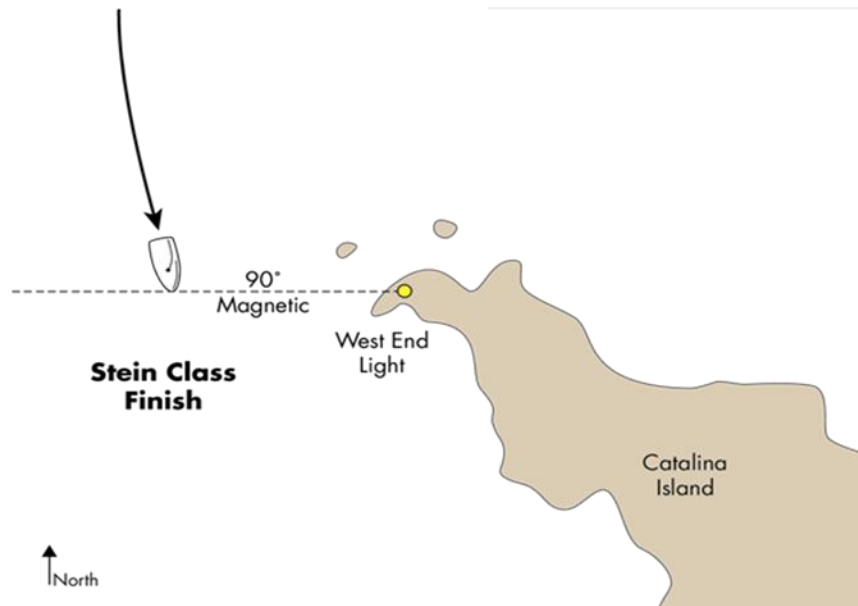
