## **NOTICE OF RACE**

The Organizing Authority for the 2019 Cal 20 Class Championship  
King Harbor Yacht Club 280 Yacht Club Way Redondo Beach, CA USA.

### **1. RULES**

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the Cal 20 Association Constitution and Rules of Conduct dated January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019, ([cal20.org](http://cal20.org))
- 1.2 The following prescriptions of US Sailing will apply: Appendix V, Alternative Penalties.
- 1.3 US Sailing Prescriptions to RRS 63.2 and 63.4 are deleted.

### **2 ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY**

- 2.1 All entries must include Valid measurement certificate, proof of insurance with minimum \$300,000 liability coverage and proof of ownership, (DMV Registration or Insurance paperwork)
- 2.2 Bronze Division skippers need not be members of the Class Association or meet ownership requirements.
- 2.3 Masters skippers shall have reached their 60<sup>th</sup> birthday before the Regatta.
- 2.4 Registered skippers must helm ALL races in the Regatta.
- 2.5 Bronze fleet boats need not be measured, but must meet Cal 20 Class Association By-Laws
- 2.6 Skippers may choose to enter the Gold, Silver, or Bronze division.

### 3 FEES

3.1 Entry fees are as follows:

	Early Entry July 29 <sup>th</sup>	Standard Entry
<b>Championship / Consolation Division</b>	\$150	\$175
<b>Bronze Division</b>	\$90	\$115

3.2 Eligible boats may enter online using Regatta Network

3.3 All entries must be received by 1000 Friday, August 9<sup>th</sup>.

3.4 AN ENTRY IS NOT COMPLETE until all fees and required documents have been received.

3.5 Any entries received before the Early Entry deadline (July 29<sup>th</sup>) but without fees will be charged the Standard Entry fee.

3.6 The Class Championship entry fee includes all racing and two tickets for the Saturday dinner, beer on the dock after racing Fri, Sat, Sun.

3.7 Additional dinners may be ordered separately.

The RC may conduct more or less races on any day in order to complete the schedule in the event of adverse weather conditions or other unforeseen circumstances.

## **5 MEASUREMENT**

- 5.1 No measurement will be performed at the Regatta, except to resolve a protest.
- 5.2 All boats must have a valid measurement certificate and submit a copy of the certificate at registration or check in.
- 5.3 All sails must have a valid measurement stamp. Bronze fleet competitors are exempt from this requirement.

## **6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

- 6.1 Sailing instructions will be available at check in and on Cal20.org

## **7 VENUE**

- 7.1 The Class Championship will be sailed in the waters off King Harbor, Redondo Beach CA.
- 7.2 The races will be windward / leeward courses with leeward gates.
- 7.3 There will be an offset mark at the weather mark.

## **8 SCORING**

- 8.1 Seven (7) races are scheduled for the Gold / Silver Series, of which three (3) must be completed to constitute a series.
- 8.2 Five (5) races are scheduled for the Bronze Series, of which one (1) must be completed to constitute a series.
- 8.3 The low point scoring system, appendix A of RRS will apply. In each series, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. This changes RRS A2.1
- 8.4 Masters skippers will be scored against each other. Gold Division skippers will be scored ahead of Silver Division skippers.

## **9 RADIO COMMUNICATION**

- 9.1 The Race Committee will make use of VHF radios to keep sailors informed of Start Times, On Course Side (OCS), Postponements and other information regarding the racing. Failure by the RC to communicate on VHF, the content or order of communications by the RC or failure by a boat to hear the communication shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1 (a).

## **10 COACH/SUPPORT/SPECTATOR BOATS**

- 10.1 Coach/support/spectator boats are allowed for this Regatta.
- 10.2 All coach/support/spectator boats must register with the Race Committee, be equipped with or supply their own VHF radios, be prepared to monitor a designated VHF channel if requested to do so by the Race Committee and be prepared to render assistance to any boat in need and perform any other function requested of them by the Race Committee.
- 10.3 Full rules regarding coach/support/spectator boats will be in the Sailing Instructions.

## **11 TROPHIES**

- 11.1 Trophies will be awarded to the top five (5) finishers in the Gold Championship Series, the top two (2) finishers in the Silver Consolation Series, and the top three (2) finishers in the Bronze Series.
- 11.2 The following perpetual trophies will be presented:
  - a) Winner of the Gold Championship Series (Cal-20 Class Championship Perpetual Trophy)
  - b) Winner of the Masters Series (L.N. Slater Trophy)
  - c) Winner of the Silver Consolation Series (Gary O. Thompson Trophy)
  - d) Second place in the Gold Championship Series (Neil Baker Memorial Trophy)
  - e) Leader after the first day of the Gold Championship Series (Bud Gardiner Trophy)
  - f) Highest-placing woman skipper in the Championship Series (Nick Condos Trophy)
  - g) Best boat and trailer (Bravura Trophy)
  - h) Ugliest boat ("The Hank")

## **12 PARKING AND STORAGE**

- 12.1 Due to space limitations, vehicle parking on KHYC grounds is restricted. Access will be provided to the Boat Owners Parking Lot at KHYC. Parking passes will be available at registration.
- 12.2 The Regatta fee includes in-the-water storage for visiting competing boats from the day prior to the event through the final day of the event.
- 12.3 Visiting competing boats may request extended storage IN ADVANCE by contacting the KHYC office.
- 12.4 Any boat or trailer found on KHYC property without prior written authorization from KHYC is subject to impound and associated fees.

### **13 BERTHING AND HAUL OUT RESTRICTIONS**

- 13.1 Unless withdrawing from the Regatta, a boat may not be hauled out after she begins racing on or after Friday, except with permission, specified in writing, by the Regatta Chair. Permission may be granted after hauling.
- 13.2 Gold and Silver Division boats shall be moored at KHYC after the end of racing Friday and Saturday. Bronze Division Boats shall be moored at KHYC after racing Saturday.
- 13.3 Hull cleaning will be available Saturday and Sunday morning.

### **14 HOSPITALITY**

- 14.1 The hospitality of KHYC is extended to all participants. The Club Bar will be open after racing.
- 14.2 There will be a no-host Burger Bash on Friday night. Tickets are \$10 each for the Burger Bash.
- 14.3 On Saturday night, KHYC will host the Regatta dinner. Two dinner tickets are included with each entry. Additional dinner tickets are available for \$20 each. **PLEASE MAKE RESERVATIONS WITH THE KHYC OFFICE.**
- 14.4 The Yacht Club Galley is open Saturday and Sunday for breakfast.
