

Race 1 - Malibu and Return January 4, 2020 Sailing Instructions

1 RULES

- **1.1** This race will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- **1.2** USSA Prescriptions RRS 63.2 to 63.4 will not apply.
- **1.3** RRS 82 will not apply.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to Competitors will be posted on the Notice Board inside the DRYC clubhouse and at DRYC.org. Any amendments to these sailing instructions will be posted by 0930 race day.

3 SCHEDULE, CLASSES AND CLASS FLAGS

- **3.1** Class flags and the order of starts will be posted on the DRYC Notice Board and at DRYC.org. by 1800 the day before the race.
- **3.2** There will be a mandatory Cruising Division meeting/check in at 0900 race day in the DRYC bar.
- **3.3** All PHRF Division entries shall check in by 1145. **Only out of the area boats** may check in via VHF channel 68. The check in boat will be anchored inside the Marina del Rey detached breakwater.
- **3.4** The scheduled time of the first warning signal is 1155, with multiple sounds made just before.

4 COURSES AND MARKS

4.1 From the starting line sail the course signaled by the RC (code flag A or B):

Course A (22.4nm) - Round the "CG" buoy at approx. 34° 02.087' N 118° 40.222' W, leaving it to port. The buoy is a white ball with a blue stripe and "CG" in black font. Proceed to **SI 4.2. Course B** (13nm) - Round the inflatable mark at approx. 34° 01.800' N 118° 33.804' W, leaving it to port. Proceed to **SI 4.2.** (Course A and Course B are each .2nm shorter for PHRF AA)

4.2 All classes except AA, round the inflatable mark, at approx. 33° 57.352' N 118° 27.582' W leaving it to port (see Attachment A). The RC will attempt to light this mark. As you approach it, hail the RC on VHF channel 68 and announce your sail number. All classes proceed to SI 6.1.

5 THE START

- 5.1 The starting area will be in the vicinity of MDR H Mark (see MDR Course Chart 17).
- 5.2 The starting line will be between an orange inflatable mark and an orange flag on the R/C boat.

6 THE FINISH

- 6.1 There will be 2 finishing lines, one for PHRF AA and one for all other classes (see Attachment A).
- 6.2 All boats shall submit a completed Finish/Retirement Form (Attachment B). Except for out of the area boats, the form shall be submitted to the DRYC front desk as soon as possible, but no later than 1200 the day after the race. Out of the area boats may submit to racers@dryc.org.
- **6.3** Boats finishing after 1630 shall illuminate their sail number. The RC intends to be on station until 2000. If the RC boat is not on station, record your finish time (GPS) when the green light on the detached breakwater bears 200°m from your bow.
- 6.4 Boats not finishing by 2230 (Time Limit) will be scored DNF (this changes RRS 35, 63.1 and A5).

7 HANDICAP RATINGS/SCORING

- **7.1** PHRF of So. California Area B RLC ratings will apply. Standard production boats from outside of Area B may have Area B ratings applied.
- **7.2** A boat that came to the starting area but DNS, DNF, RET or was DSQ shall be scored points for the finishing place one more than the number of boats that came to the starting area. A boat that did not come to the starting area shall be scored points for the finishing place two more than the number of boats that came to the starting area (this changes RRS A9).

8 PROTESTS

- **8.1** Boats shall notify the RC of their intention to protest within one hour of finishing, either by filing at DRYC's front desk or via the Event Chairman's phone number (see **SI 12**).
- **8.2** Protests (forms available at the DRYC front desk) shall be filed at the DRYC front desk no later than 1200 the day after the race (Protest Time Limit). Hearings will be scheduled for a later date.

9 RADIO COMMUNICATION

The RC may announce starting information on VHF channel 68 (RRS 62.1 will not apply).

10 PRIZES

There will be a trophy presentation, hors d'oeuvres and a no-host bar at DRYC after the race.

11 DISCLAIMER

Competitors participate in these races entirely at their own risk (see RRS 4). By participating in these races, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers (organizing authority, host yacht club, race committee, protest committee, sponsors and any others acting in any official capacity for these races) from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event, to the fullest extent permitted by law.



6 THE FINISH

- **6.1a** The finishing line for all classes except for PHRF AA will be between an orange flag on the RC boat and the green light on the south end of MDR detached breakwater.
- **6.1b** The finishing line for PHRF AA ONLY will be a 200 foot extension of a line from an orange flag on the RC boat passing through the inflatable mark. Leave the mark to port. As you approach the finishing line, hail the RC on VHF channel 68 and announce your sail number.
